Allegorical Sense of Scripture

A n allegory is a thing or event that points to another, so how do we use allegories to understand the Bible?

Throughout what we now call the "Old Testament," God was reminding His people of the promise He made in Genesis 3:15 to send a savior who would heal the rift between God and us that was created by the Fall.

Sometimes that comparison between people in the Old and New Testaments is called "prefiguring" or "typology." The readings in the Mass are arranged so that the reading from the Old Testament is paired with the Gospel reading, and shows something that is prophesied, and then where it's fulfilled in the Gospel reading.

It's not necessarily a strictly one-to-one meaning; there can be multiple ways that a person or event from the Old Testament is fulfilled, like this example used in the Catechism:

The allegorical sense. We can acquire a more profound understanding of events by recognizing their significance in Christ; thus the crossing of the Red Sea is a sign or type of Christ's victory and also of Christian Baptism. (CCC 117)

It's easier to understand the reference to crossing the Red Sea and Baptism if we think about a Baptism by full immersion, where the person's entire body is under water and then rises out of the water as a new creation in Christ. When the children of Israel left Egypt, they walked through the Red Sea on dry land. The Egyptians who pursued them died when the waters of the sea began to flow again. The

reason they were chasing after the Hebrews is because the Pharaoh commanded them to kill the Hebrews—which is a sin. So the Israelites came out of the waters as a new creation, because their nation was God gathering His people together. They were God's Chosen People because by their actions, they were supposed to show the world who the true God is.



In both the Crossing of the Red Sea and the Flood, the people who came out of the water into a new life were a kind of "new creation" because they had been cleansed of their sin.

Both events also act an allegory for Baptism, because Baptism forgives any actual sins as well as removing the stain of Original Sin. Water has to be used in a baptism because water is associated with cleaning and removing dirt. When the person is baptized, the "dirt" from sin is removed from their soul just as dirt is removed from the body by being washed with water. The soul of the newly Baptized person now bears the mark of God, which can never be removed.

NORMAS PARA EL AYUNO Y LA ABSTINENCIA

El miércoles de ceniza, 22 de febrero, y el viernes santo, 7 de abril, son días de abstinencia y de avuno. Asimismo, los viernes durante la Cuaresma son días de abstinencia, los viernes durante la Cuaresma todas las personas a partir de los 18 años y los que no hayan cumplido los 59 años, deben ayunar. Se permite comer una vez durante el día de ayuno, aunque también pueden comer dos veces para mantener la energía, según la necesidad de cada individuo. Sin embargo, estas dos comidas no deben igualar a la cantidad de una comida completa. No se puede comer entre comidas, pero está permitido tomar líquido. incluyendo leche y jugos. La abstinencia se debe cumplir desde los 14 años en adelante. En los días de abstinencia, no se debe comer carne, aunque si la salud o la habilidad para cumplir su trabajo se ve seriamente afectado, la ley no lo obliga. Si tiene alguna duda sobre la práctica del ayuno o de la abstinencia, consulte al Sacerdote

de su parroquia. El ayuno, la limosna y la oración, son las tres disciplinas tradicionales durante la Cuaresma. Los feligreses y los catecúmenos deben realizar estas prácticas con seriedad en espíritu de penitencia y en preparación para la Iniciación a la Iglesia o para la renovación de las promesas Bautismales durante la Semana Santa.

number of older adults (and their health care providers) are aware of the risk of falls, yet far too many are still injured from falls each year. In 2018, one in four adults 65 years and older fell, and one in ten experienced a fall with significant injury. That resulted in 950,000 hospitalizations and 32,000 deaths in that year alone! Here at my retirement community, great emphasis is put on safety and mitigating the risk of falls. One resident broke a bone in her back when she fell while playing pickle ball. Another suffered the same injury when she fell in her stateroom while on a cruise during a severe storm. Both were in a brace for six months. Another tripped on the sidewalk, fell and struck his head, suffering a concussion, multiple bruises and a broken nose. Because only older adults live in retirement communities, falls are not uncommon.

There are a number of risk factors for falling, but the good news is that many of them are modifiable. These include vision problems, difficulty walking, muscle weakness, pain, poorly fitting footwear, vitamin D deficiency, and home hazards. It'd be a smart thing to discuss these issues with your medical provider and explore opportunities to reduce these risks through exercise, fitness and balance classes, physical therapy and a few home modifications. Some of the simplest interventions can make a big difference. An important aspect of speaking with your doctor is a careful review of your medications. Many drugs increase the risk of falls, including drugs affecting your central nervous system. Medications for the heart and to treat blood pressure can be associated with falls along with non-prescription medications such as allergy pills or sleep aids, including alcohol.

Your health care provider can help you carefully weigh the pros and cons of each of your medicines. You can do your part by telling them about all of the side effects, including over-the-counter drugs, even if you use them only occasionally. Such a discussion can help you determine if your medications are risky and whether it's time to consider safer alternatives.

Bear in mind that adjusting your medications is just one part of a comprehensive fall prevention plan in addition to the steps mentioned earlier. The best approach will include an exercise program, which may simply begin with physical therapy if you're frail, use an assistive device, or have difficulties getting out of a chair. A great resource for exercise is the National Institute of Aging exercise site, nia.nih.gov/health/exercise-physical-activity.

Please take action if you have fallen recently or had a near miss. You can reduce your risk of falling and feel better and stronger in the process. Next week you'll read about what you can do if you've lost your physical confidence after a fall.
