TAC 89.1250 requires districts to offer 120 hours of summer school to current PK and kindergarten bilingual and English as a Second Language (ESL) students. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the District will be

utilizing the TEA developed Texas At Home summer learning program to provide this virtually. TEA provides the Texas At Home Learning in an online and print format. The District will ship Texas At Home Learning Packets to the homes of Bilingual and ESL PK and kindergarten students to ensure there is no inequity as a result of lack of technology or internet. Teachers will be hired to support students during the 120 hours with an approximate start date of June 15. Vice President Jason Olson made the first motion to approve as submitted.

Trustee Dan Blackwood seconded the motion. The motion passed (5-0).

B. Discuss and consider approval of Texas at Home Summer Learning Packets Dr. Cyndy A. Mika presented to the Board this item.
In order to mitigate the learning gaps that may have been caused by the COVID-19 school closure, the District is recommending the use of the Texas Education Agency's Texas At-Home Learning 2.0 which has been developed as a summer bridge. Texas At-Home Learning is available online as well as in packets that TEA will ship directly to student homes. The district will make available the online program to all students. The District is recommending the purchase of the Texas At-Home Learning packets to be shipped directly to the homes of all students coded "atrisk" in the PEIMS system.

Vice President Jason Olson made the first motion to approve as submitted. Trustee Dan Blackwood seconded the motion. The motion passed (5-0).

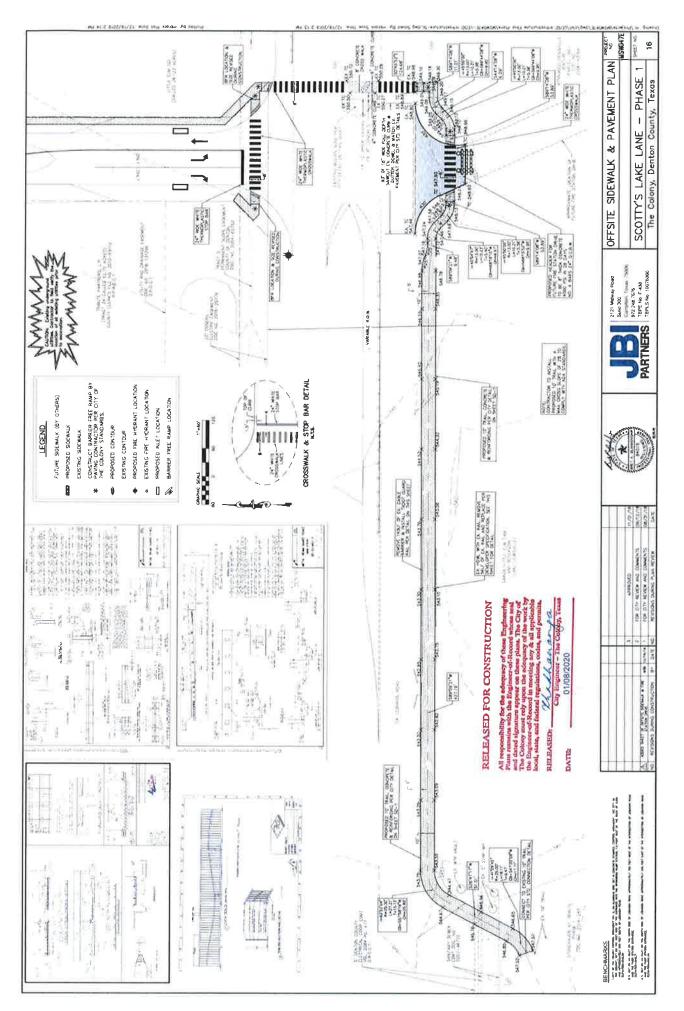
