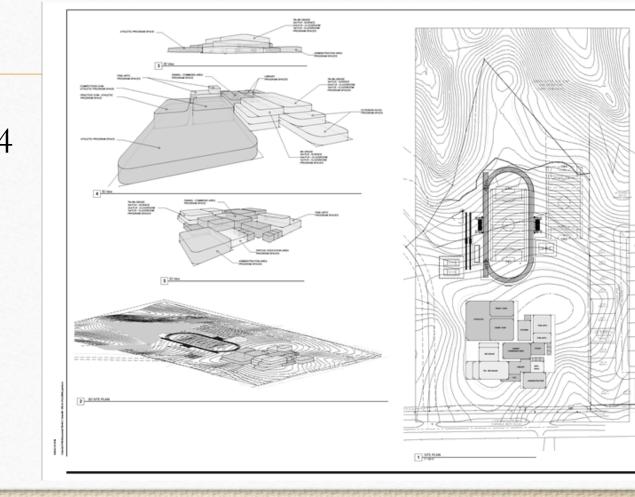

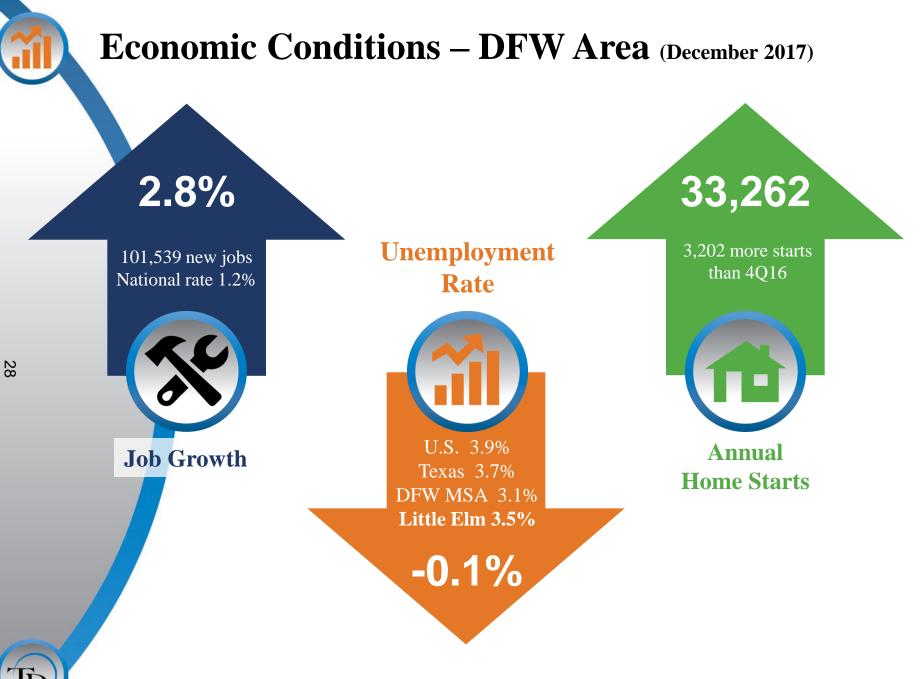

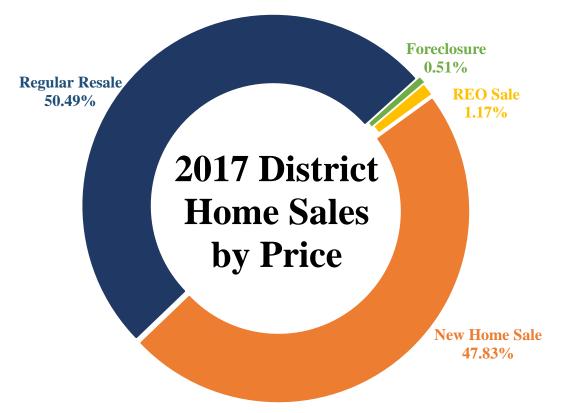

- New home inventory declined in the 4th quarter due to the surge in closings, but still remains healthy at 6.8 months of supply



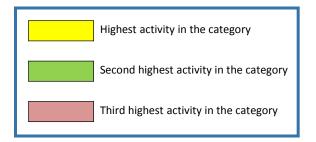




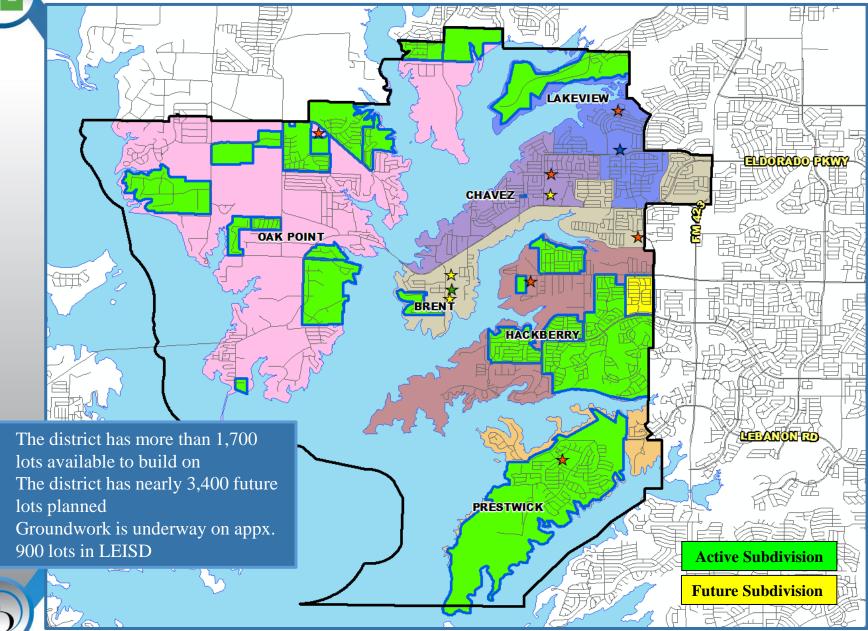

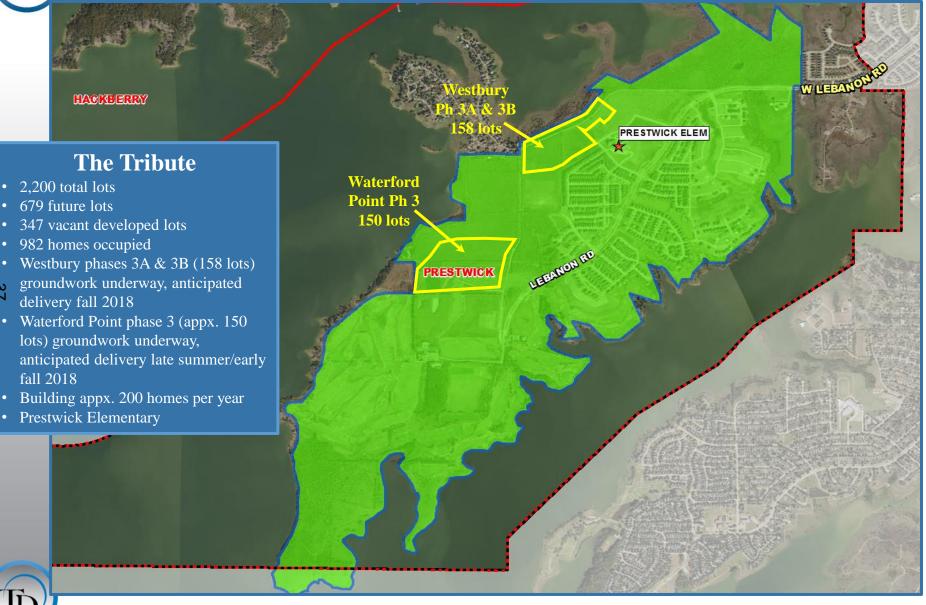

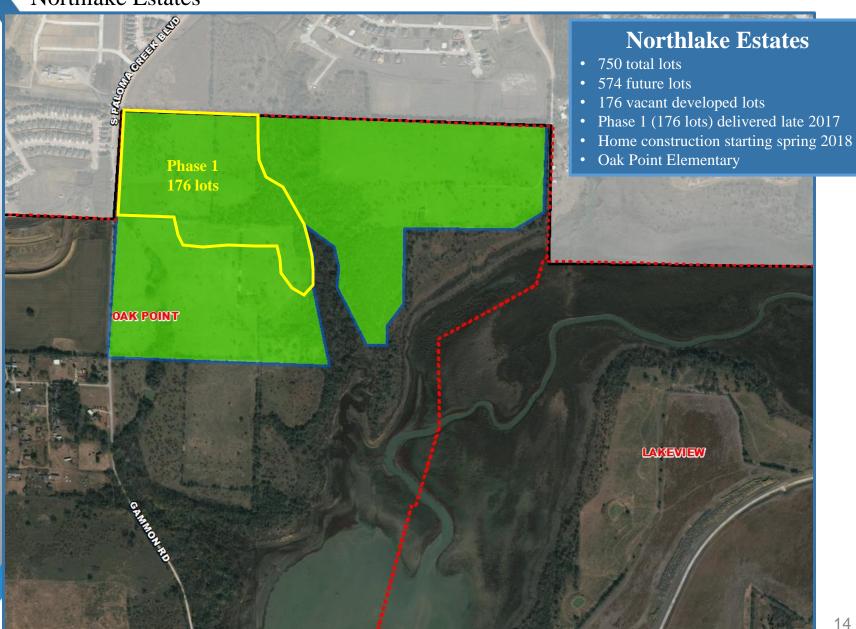
