### 3.0 Elective credits

#### FHSP with Endorsement-26 credits

A student may earn an endorsement by successfully completing the foundation plan plus:

- Curriculum requirements for the endorsement
- An additional advanced math credit

#### Distinguished Level of Achievement-

A student may earn a distinguished level of achievement by successfully completing:

- A total of four credits in mathematics, which must include Algebra II
- A total of four credits in science
- The remaining curriculum requirements
- The curriculum requirements for at least one endorsement

A student must earn distinguished level of achievement to be eligible for top 10% automatic admission
