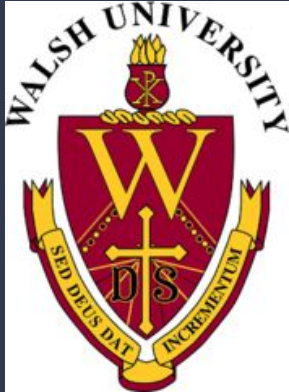
Courses through Walsh University:

- CCP Calculus I
- CCP Elementary Functions I and II

Courses through Kent State University:

- CCP International Politics (option through International Politics II)

CCP at Hoban



Courses through Mount Union:

- CCP American Government
- CCP Environmental Science
- CCP French III and IV
- CCP Italian III and IV
- CCP Latin III and IV
- CCP Spanish III and IV
- CCP US History
- CCP Psychology (Mount Union professor)

Courses through Stark State:

- Principles of HVAC I and II

CCP Courses Off-Site

- Students can elect to take courses directly through any Ohio college or University.
 - On the campus
 - Online
- Students can take any course they qualify with through the university.
- Hoban typically encourages a course that could replace something in the Hoban schedule.
- Families are responsible for transportation.

CCP Qualifications

For the 2023-24 School Year, students can be eligible to participate in one of two ways:

1. A student has a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
2. A student earns a remediation free test score on standardized tests (ACT, Accuplacer or SAT)
 - ACT English 18
 - ACT Math 22
 - ACT Reading 22

CCP Qualifications

- While students may qualify for admission into a college's CCP program, some courses may have specific requirements above the state's guidelines
 - For example: English or Math classes
 - Hoban's CCP Math courses partnered with Walsh University have specific requirements

CCP Qualifications

- To take CCP Elementary Functions I and II:
 - ACT Math 23+ OR
 - Qualifying score on Walsh's Math Placement Test
 - This year for rising juniors, Walsh is administering the placement test in lieu of the Residual ACT
- To take CCP Calculus:
 - ACT Math 27+ OR
 - C- or higher in Elementary Functions I and II through Walsh OR
 - Qualifying score on Walsh's Math Placement Test

Step 1

CCP Steps

Step 2

- Fill out a CCP Transcript Release Form:

Step 3

- Create an OH|ID Account (ohid.ohio.gov)
 - If you have an existing account, you can use this (ex: educator, EdChoice or JPS Scholarships)

CCP Steps

Step 4

- Create and Submit a Funding Application through OH|ID Account **by April 1 at 5:00pm**
 - If you do not submit the application, you will be responsible for the cost of the CCP courses if you wish your student to take them
 - **You will need the College Acceptance Letter(s) before submitting**

Who Submits a Funding Application?

- **ALL** students participating in CCP courses
 - Students who took CCP in 2022-2023 **must** submit a new application
 - An application must be submitted for **each** student in a family
 - Do not need separate OH|ID accounts for each student's application

OH|ID Account & Funding Application

Funding Manual (with step-by-step instructions) will be emailed this week.

- Returning Students/Families or Parents with Existing OH|ID Accounts
 - Access OH|ID Account from previous year & update the application
- New Families
 - Create the Account in Parent's name NOT student's name
 - Need Parent's Driver License ID Number
 - Need Parent and Student SSN
 - Do not wait until April 1 to create the account as there can be delays
 - Once account is created, use the OH|ID account to create and submit an application

Funding Application

- Funding IS NOT need based
- Funding is for the ENTIRE 2023-2024 Academic Year (Summer 23, Fall 23, Spring 24)
- Funding CAN be used at multiple colleges
 - Must have an Acceptance Letter for EACH college
- Families can self-pay for additional credits beyond the amount awarded
 - Walsh- approximately \$166 per credit
 - Mount Union- approximately \$43 per credit hour
 - KSU-approximately \$263 per credit

Funding Application: Credit Hours

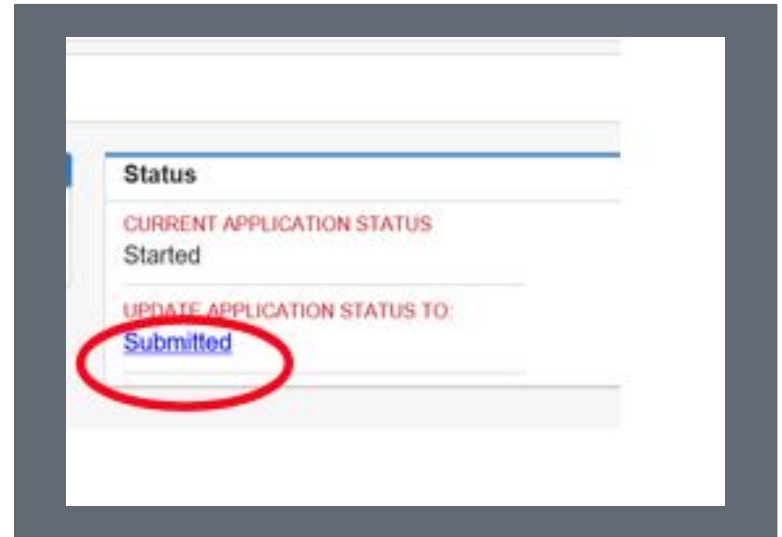
- In past years, the state DOES NOT award the full amount requested. We recommend requesting the full amount of **30 hours**.
- On-Site Courses:
 - Calculus I (5 credits)
 - Elementary Functions I & II (6 credits)
 - Environmental Science (4 credits)
 - International Politics (3 credits)
 - Principles of HVAC I and II (3 credits each)
 - US History (6 credits- can take on semester or both)
 - Each foreign language course is **4** credit hours
- Funding CANNOT be transferred between students

Acceptance Letter

- An Acceptance Letter from **EACH** college needs to be uploaded
- **Walsh** emails to Hoban
- **Kent State** uploads it into the student's application portal
- **Mount Union** emails to Hoban
- **Stark State** TBD
- DO NOT SUBMIT the Funding Application before adding the Acceptance Letter!

Steps Recap

1. Apply to college(s)
2. Complete the Transcript Release Form
3. Create/Access an OH|ID Account
4. Within the OH|ID Account, create a Funding Application in student name
5. Submit the Application by **April 1, 2023 at 5pm**
6. Access Funding Award Letter
 - Mrs. Doenges will follow up at this time with process
