



PIE MEMO (Partners in Education)

This year, the month of March finds us half way through the first week of the Christian season of Lent. As in various religions, the Christian tradition sets aside time to re-focus or reclaim one's commitment to God and one's journey in faith. Each year, I find it important to have a simple daily practice or daily reflection that fosters my ability to re-center ever more deeply in God and deepen my commitment to God's Word. This year, I find myself spending a little time with the mystics through a book entitled What the Mystics Know by Richard Rohr. Although the book itself is not the main content of my prayer and reflection, the seven essential "pathways" found in it are overall themes that are found in the writings of the mystics (of many religious traditions) and will be the foundation for my daily reflection. This week's "pathway" is God is found in imperfection. As I ponder this statement, I cannot help but reflect on two Ash Wednesday experiences. The first was a long time ago when I was in Tijuana, Mexico volunteering at a house for migrants and the line to receive ashes went outside of the church and down the road at least 1/8 of a mile. The second was just this past Ash Wednesday at a parish church and the church was fuller than I had seen it since before Covid. I ponder why it is that so many believers resonate with Ash Wednesday. Is it because we identify with a need for God and being closer to God? Is it because we recognize at very deep part of our being that God meets us in our imperfection? For me, I know both to be true. It seems to me that Jesus and the Gospel also challenge me to meet God in the imperfections in all I encounter. Now I ponder, how can I help our students find God in imperfection, their own and that of those around them?

May the month of March and this holy season find each one of us being met by and meeting God in imperfection.
