- Travel insurance for school-sponsored trips
- Weekly linen service for bed linen and towels and access to laundry facilities with free washing machines and tumble dryers
- Access to the on-campus Health Center with nurses available/on-call 24/7 and weekly visits from a doctor

For Grades 9–13, the Fall Travel Week is mandatory and is included in the boarding fees.

For Grade 8, the Start-of-School bonding trip is mandatory and costs are included in the boarding fees. School-sponsored February break travel is optional and a travel credit (non-transferrable) will be available for eighth grade boarders who enrolled at the start of the academic year.

Other travel opportunities will be subject to an additional charge.

Boarding Fees do not include:

- Private medical insurance
- Uniforms
- Varsity sports travel and equipment
- Costs of external exams such as the SAT, AP, or IB exams
- Charges related to vaccinations
- Child Student or Student Visa expenses

PAYMENT SCHEDULE AND FURTHER INFORMATION

APPLICATION FEE

The non-refundable application fee as shown in the Schedule of Fees must accompany each application form. We are unable to issue an invoice for the application fee, but a receipt will be issued upon request.

ENROLLMENT DEPOSIT

A non-refundable enrollment deposit as shown in the Schedule of Fees is payable on enrollment and/or re-enrollment.

For day and boarding students, the deposit will be held in credit by the School, rolled over for subsequent years, or refunded at the end of the final year, less any additional expenses accrued by the student.

If a student fails to start or is withdrawn from school, the deposit will be retained by the School.

DEVELOPMENT FUND

All new students pay a one-time-only Development Fund fee of £750 towards the School's ongoing building and maintenance program.

PAYMENT OF FEES

For day students: The first tuition fee installment (60% of the full year fee) plus the one-time-only Development Fund fee for new students (£750) are due on June 1, or 14 days from the date of invoice if issued after June 1. The remaining fees, less the enrollment deposit, are payable by November 15.

For boarding students who do not require a Child Student Visa or Student Visa: The first tuition fee installment (70% of the full year fee) plus the one-time-only Development Fund fee for new students (£750) are due by June 1, or 14 days from the date of invoice if issued after June 1. The remaining fees are payable by November 15.

Fees for students joining TASIS for the First or Second Semester only are payable in full at enrollment.

MID-YEAR STARTERS

Tuition fees are charged on a pro-rata basis from the student's expected start date, and are payable 14 days from the date of invoice. Supplementary fees will be payable in the event of a student beginning school prior to the expected start date.

CHILD STUDENT VISA OR STUDENT VISA

Should your child require a Child Student Visa or a Student Visa, the School must receive the full tuition amount prior to starting the visa process. The tuition fee is to be received by June 1, or 14 days from the date of invoice if issued after June 1.

FEE PAYMENT METHODS

Fee payment via bank transfer is encouraged (details below). Payment is also accepted by cash, check, debit cards, and Visa, Mastercard, or American Express credit cards. Payment can also be made via our Secure Payment Portal and the details are sent out at the time of invoicing.

Please note that any bank charges incurred by payment of school fees will be debited to the student account, and further payment will be required to clear this account.

There is no reduction or refund for absence, withdrawal, or dismissal, except in accordance with our Cancellation Rules and/or the withdrawal conditions found in our Admissions Policy (section 9.4), as set out below.

LATE PAYMENT FEES

Fee payments not received by the due date might be subject to a late payment fee of £100 plus a charge of £50 per month or part thereof while fees remain unpaid. Families are encouraged to speak to the TASIS England Business Office to discuss any potential late payments to arrange for an adjusted payment plan. Students will not be allowed to attend school until a payment plan has been approved or late fees have been paid.

FEE REVIEWS

Tuition fees are reviewed each year by the TASIS England Board of Directors and generally announced no later than mid-to-late February.

CANCELLATION RULES

Enrollment may be cancelled prior to the start of school with no further contractual obligation to one another beyond the following:

1. If the contract is cancelled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form prior to June 1, the non-refundable deposit will be retained by TASIS Eng;and but all additional tuition fees and payments will be refunded.
2. If the contract is cancelled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form on or after June 1, but before August 1, the non-refundable deposit will be retained by TASIS England and the family will be obligated for 10 percent of the tuition set out in the tuition fee schedule.

3. If the contract is cancelled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form on or after August 1, all payments and deposits made to the School will be retained by TESIS England. In addition, the family shall be obligated for the full amount of tuition referenced in the tuition fee schedule and any other fees or expenses that may be due and owing at the time of cancellation, subject to the withdrawal conditions found in our Admissions Policy, as set out below.
4. If a student's initial enrollment happens during the academic year (e.g., starting later in the semester or for a January start), or the enrollment process is completed during the summer (after June 1 and prior to the start of school):
 - a. If the contract is cancelled by completing the Admissions Withdrawal Form 60 days prior to the start date, the non-refundable deposit will be retained by TESIS England but all additional tuition fees and payments will be refunded.
 - b. If the contract is cancelled less than 60 days from the start date, all payments and deposits made to the School will be retained by TESIS England. In addition, the family shall be obligated for the full amount of tuition set out in the tuition fee schedule and any other fees or expenses that may be due and owing at the time of cancellation, subject to the withdrawal conditions found in our Admissions Policy, as set out below.

ADMISSIONS POLICY – WITHDRAWAL CONDITIONS:

Once enrollment or re-enrollment has been confirmed, no refund or reimbursement of fees is payable in the event of subsequent withdrawal. However, a refund of a student's second semester fees will be available (other than for students who have been suspended or permanently excluded) if:

- A completed Withdrawal Form is received by the TESIS England Admissions Office no less than 60 days prior to the end of the first semester; and
- TESIS England has accepted a replacement student to take the place of the withdrawing student in the same grade and program, and that the replacement student begins classes at the start of the second semester.

No reduction of fees will be granted in respect of a student's absence from school. No records, recommendations, or reports will be released until all financial obligations have been met.

PRIVATE MEDICAL INSURANCE

Private medical insurance is mandatory for boarding students and is available through the School. Upon receipt of a completed medical insurance online application form, TESIS will issue an invoice for the insurance cover. If a boarding student is covered by a personal medical insurance policy, we require a copy of the policy for the School's records.

FORCE MAJEURE

The School reserves the right at its sole discretion to suspend the obligations in the contract for the period of time that a condition of Force Majeure exists. "Force Majeure" means an act of God, strike, lock-out, act of public enemy, war, blockade, pandemic, civil disturbance, or other causes beyond the reasonable control of the School such as to make in-person and Remote Learning impossible or impracticable, as determined solely by the School. The School shall immediately notify parents/guardians of any suspension due to a Force Majeure event. The School and parents/guardians agree to use their best efforts to eliminate the effects of the Force Majeure event and to resume performance of the contract as soon as possible after the Force Majeure event ceases. The School is not liable for any costs incurred by parents/guardians due to delays or non-performance of obligations as a result of the Force Majeure event.

CONSUMER RIGHTS

The School will exercise reasonable care and skill in providing educational services for the student but cannot guarantee that s/he will achieve his/her desired examination results or that results will be sufficient to gain entry to other educational establishments.

We provide parents of prospective students with information about the School and the educational services we provide in good faith. This information may be contained in the promotional literature or in statements made by staff or students during a visit or an open day.

TESIS England's policies are available in full on our website. If parents wish to take account of the information provided to them when deciding whether to enter into a contract with the School, they should seek specific confirmation from the School that the information is accurate beforehand.

THIRD PARTY RIGHTS

Only the School and the parents are parties to the contract. Neither the student nor any third party is a party to this contract and shall not have any rights to enforce any term of it.

VARIATIONS

These terms and conditions and the schedule of fees are subject to change from time to time to reflect changes in the law or in custom and practice at the School.

JURISDICTION

Contracts of enrollment are made at the School and they, together with each matter relating to the provision of educational services by the School, are governed exclusively by the law of England and Wales and the parties submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of England and Wales.
