Snow Days

Just a note about the weather-we have used the days we had built into the calendar as snow days. As I write this, if we have another one we plan to adjust our minutes within the school

day to make up the time. It will not affect the start and end time of the day, but a few minutes of recess and/or the lunch period.

School Days

There is no doubt that attendance in school has a direct effect on student learning and that routine and habits are important for all of us. We love to spend our days helping your children learn and grow. Please know that we feel it is most important for them to be in school if at all possible. It is also important that your children be in their seats ready to go by the 7:55 bell each day. Sometimes they may be in the school or even in the classroom, but if they are not settled in their seats at the time of that bell they will be marked tardy.

Vision and Hearing

Vision and hearing screenings will be held here on March 8 & 9. If you do not want your child to be screened by the Marathon County Special Education Screening Coordinator please send a note declining this opportunity. They will follow up with you if need be. Please make sure your student has their glasses in school, especially on the screening days. Thank you.

Pick up and Drop Off Procedure

When our students come to school in the morning, they are to be dropped off and proceed to the playground area. They will then line up with their classmates and enter the building just after the bell at 7:45. We have noticed that there are many cars coming into the Circle Drive at 7:50 or so. Vehicles are getting backed up on both Bridge Street and in the Circle Drive and students don't have enough time to get in place and lined up. You may want to check out the west side drop off area that doesn't seem to be as busy and perhaps arriving five minutes earlier would be helpful for your family. And always remember to pull all the way up into the drop off area at the beginning of the day as well as at pick up time. On the west side after school too; please pull up and keep the line moving. Traffic is backed up onto Bridge Street after school. If your student takes a while to come out, don't feel like you have to be there right at 2:45. We are there for fifteen minutes with them so you can take your time. Thank you.

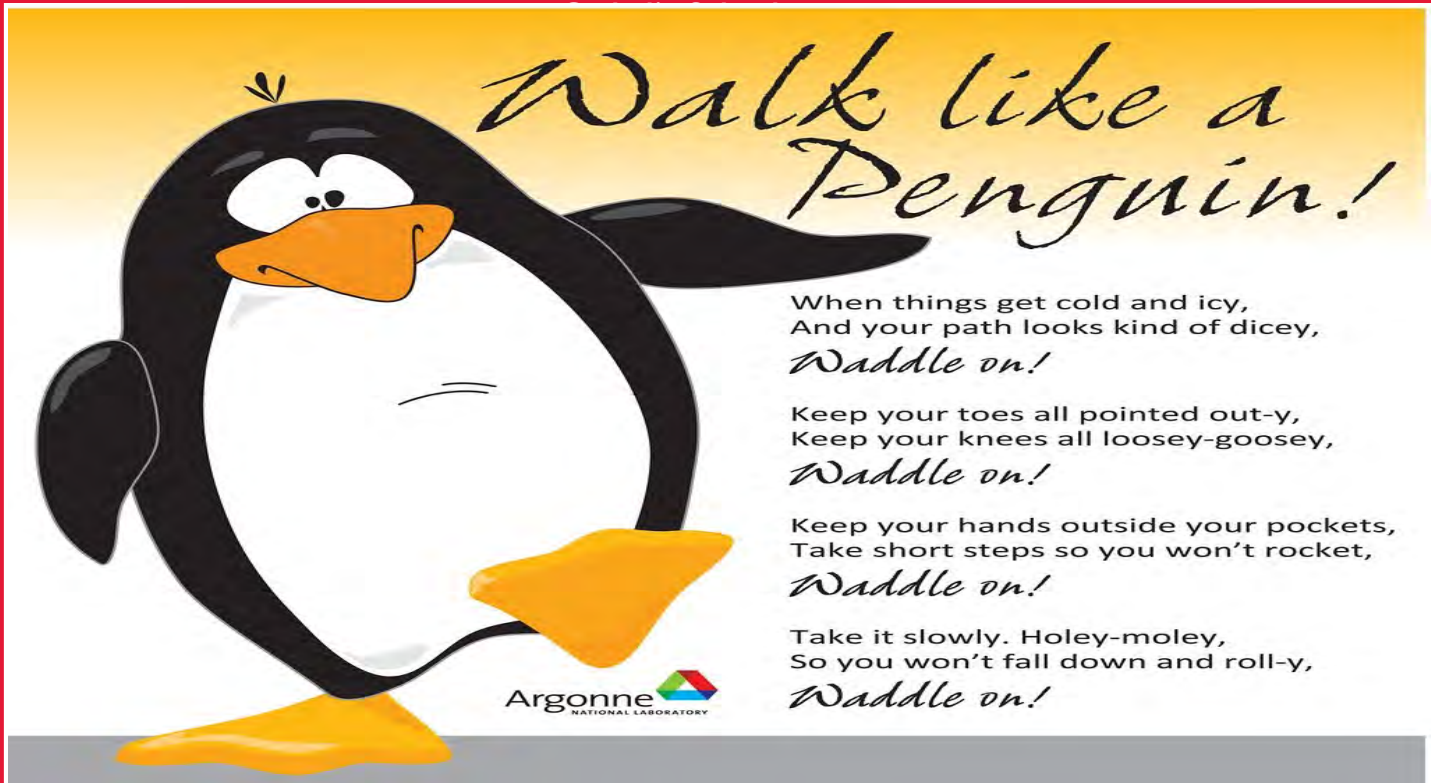
Career Awareness Starts in Kindergarten

There is often a misconception that college and career readiness is something that should happen at the secondary level. But like any area of development, social emotional or career, it is sequential and builds over time. We don't expect students to arrive at high school and take algebra without prior math courses. Similarly, we can't expect student's to choose a career path without prior exposure and skill development. To properly prepare, students need access to quality elementary career and social emotional curriculum consistently delivered through a comprehensive school counseling program. A program that teaches social emotional development, exposes students to careers and links them to skills and academics courses, practices and models self-regulation, and hones the communication skills needed to become productive citizens. A well balanced program also supports families and students by guiding them through transitions, providing tips and assistance for academic success, and meeting their physical needs to remove barriers standing in the way of graduation.

Students in elementary school love career exploration. Their natural curiosity, imagination and sense of adventure work hand in hand with investigating the world of work, allowing elementary school counselors the ability to make career and college exploration, along with social emotional learning, fun and exciting.

Walking to and from the school during the winter requires special attention to avoid slipping and falling. Music News

It's March! The Kindergarteners continue to learn about keeping the steady beat and also learn about melody. We'll experiment with the sounds of our voices too, and find out that they can produce different tone colors by way of some fun songs!

The First and Second graders are learning all about melody. They use the Orff instruments to accompany themselves while they sing. They play simple ostinato patterns and scales. We practice recognition of quarter notes, quarter rests, and eighth notes, and beat out the patterns on drums!

The Third Graders take a look at time signatures this month. We learn two catchy Irish songs, each with a different signature, to show the students $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ meters.

The Fourth and Fifth Graders continue to learn to play the recorders in the month of March. Currently, we're working on our fifth song, and have learned to play four different notes. Practicing every day for a short amount of time is the best way to ensure success!

Phy Ed

We are so lucky to be at NCES – St. Anne School and don't need a leprechaun or four leaf clover to know it! March happenings in the gym include a nets up/volleyball unit, jump ropes, fitness stations, and fitness testing for grades 4 and 5. We utilize the Fitness gram program and will be able to compare our Fall scores to our Spring scores to see how we have progressed and improved. It is a great goal-setting tool as well. Spring Break means spring is right around the corner – yahoo it's hard to believe we are in the 3rd quarter of the school year already.

Hello families! This month in art we are starting to create spring time art. Kindergarten will be working on caterpillar flower gardens as we continue to practice drawing and cutting basic shapes, as well as the use and cleanup of painting tools. 1st grade is creating Rainbow Umbrella pictures. This will help us remember our ROYGBIV order of colors, as well as proportion as we draw scene. 2nd grade will be creating porcupine and blossom scenes. These adorable prickly creatures and the blooms around them in the forest will be presented with a variety of art mediums. 3rd grade will be practicing their stitching and painting on burlap, as we create our own vegetable gardens and depict the above ground and below ground growth of these beautiful veggies. 4th grade is creating a tulip garden using multiple media. This will be presented in a pop-art style, inspired by the artist Romero Britto. 5th Grade will be painting a whimsical spring flower field landscape. We will be using tints and shades to create vibrant colors in our landscapes. Pictures of spring flowers will be our inspiration. I can't wait to see our artist's creations!

Computer Lab News

It is amazing to see how the Kindergarten students have grown in their computer skills from the beginning of the school year. Whether keyboarding or navigating the KidPix software, they know exactly what to do! We are now using this knowledge to create fun little projects!

Our first graders are making great progress on their Animal riddle books and have been very creative with their ideas! They have shown tremendous growth in their KidPix and Microsoft Word skills throughout the creation of this project! Students in second and third grade are working on their KidPix slideshows and will then share their creations with their classmates. They will then begin working on projects using the Kidspiration software.

The fourth graders are doing a fantastic job with their "All About Me" PowerPoints and are looking forward to presenting their projects to the class! It has been so much fun learning about their interests and experiences.

Our fifth graders are working hard to complete their candy PowerPoints. They have been extremely creative with this project and will soon share them with their classmates!



Spanish News

¡Hola! ¡Es primavera! It's Spring! We are in full learning mode in our Spanish classes. Students in Kindergarten continue to work on animals and action verbs. They are preparing to read the story La Gallinita Roja (The Little Red Hen.) First grade is finishing up La Oruga Muy Hambrienta (The Very Hungry Caterpillar). Ask them, ¿Qué comes? (What do you eat?). Second graders are finishing up Froggy Se Viste (Froggy Gets Dressed). Ask them ¿Qué tiempo hace? (What's the weather like), and ¿Qué llevas? (What do you wear?) Third graders are finishing up the story Huevos Verdes con Jamón (Green Eggs and Ham.) Next we will work on telling time. Fourth graders are working on physical descriptions and combining these new words with the family vocabulary we already learned! They will be able to tell you, "Hay cinco personas en mi familia," (There are five people in my family); we will be able to add, "Mi mamá es rubia" (My mom is blonde.). Finally, fifth graders are focusing on a Panamanian folktale: Conejito (Little Bunny), about a bunny who outsmarts a number of forest animals who want to eat him. Language learning tip of the month: Use context clues! We use these in reading class to help us understand. They help to make your second language more clear too!

Weather Related School Closing Procedures

When considering schedule changes due to inclement weather, Newman Catholic Schools (NCS) continues to take its lead from the Wausau School District (WSD) and D.C. Everest School District (DCE). Each district varies in its standards and definitions of closure. These differences can cause confusion as NCS crosses both districts. To assist in alleviating this potential confusion, a school-by-school breakdown of procedures is laid out below. Any changes to these procedures will be communicated through Constant Contact, school newsletters, etc. Be sure to read **ALL** announcements and updates to avoid missing information.

The following tools will be the standard of communication used to announce schedule changes due to inclement weather:

- **Constant Contact:** Will be sent to the parents directly affected by the schedule changes.
- **Facebook:** Visit the Newman Catholic Schools page.
- **NCS Website:** A pop-up notification will appear upon entering www.newmancatholicschools.com.
- **TV Stations:** Channel 9 (www.waow.com) and Channel 7 (www.wsaw.com)
- **Midwest Communications Radio:** 95.5 WIFC, 101.9 WDEZ, Rock 94.7, 550AM WSAU, 1390AM Fox Sports
- **Skylert Messaging:** Digital messaging sent via email, phone, and text. You can manage your Skylert Messaging through your Skyward Family Access account. **Skylert may not be the fastest method for last minute changes. Please refer to the other communication tools first.*

Delays: The definition of delay varies by district.

- **Wausau School District–Bus Delays** – This only affects students who are picked up by First Student. Students bused by First Student will be picked up based on the delayed time. Classes at NCES: St. Anne and Newman Catholic Middle/High School will continue to run on their normal schedule. Students that are dropped off, walk, or ride the city bus are expected to be at school at the regularly scheduled time. Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes at NCECC: St. Michael will be cancelled when busing is delayed. Unless specified differently, child care programs at NCES: St. Anne and NCECC: St. Michael will run as regularly scheduled.
- **D.C. Everest School District–School Delays** – This affects all students at NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese. Classes at NCES: St. Mark will be delayed by two hours, following DCE. Three-year-old Preschool will be cancelled at NCES: St. Mark, and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at both NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese. Unless specified differently, child care programs at NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese will run as regularly scheduled.

This also affects NCMS/HS students who reside in DCE and are picked up by Lamers. Busing will be delayed by two hours. Classes at NCMS/HS will continue to run on their normal schedule. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.

School-by-School Procedures:

Newman Catholic Middle and High School (NCMS/HS)

- **Delayed Starts** – Delays only affect students riding a yellow school bus. Classes will continue to run on the normal schedule for all other students. Delayed busing is considered an excused absence. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCMS/HS follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to the WSD early release schedule included in this document. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays. At times, the two public school districts do not align in their decisions to close early or at the same time; for example:
 - DCE closes early but WSD does not; this will affect DCE bused students only. In this case, parents of DCE bused students will be contacted letting them know when busses will arrive for pick-up. If parents wish for students to remain the entire day, they must arrange for transportation at the end of the day and notify the school.
 - WSD closes early but DCE does not; all students must be picked up by the stated release time. If a student who is bused from DCE does not have alternative transportation other than the bus home, parents should contact the office to discuss arrangements.
- **Closing** – NCMS/HS follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.

NCES: St. Anne

- **Delayed Starts** – Delays only affect students riding a yellow school bus. Classes will continue to run on the normal schedule for all other students. Delayed busing is considered an excused absence. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCES: St. Anne follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to the WSD early release schedule included in this document. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCES: St. Anne follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Before and After Care** – In the event that there is a delayed start, before care will still be available. In the event that there is an early release, after care will not be available. Additionally, if there is a closing, before and after care will not be available. At times, when inclement weather is anticipated in the evening, after school activities are canceled, and we ask that you please pick up your child from after care as soon as possible, prior to the 5:30pm closing time.

- **Delayed Starts** – Classes at NCES: St. Mark will be delayed by two hours, following DCE. Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCES: St. Mark.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCES: St. Mark follows DCE. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to DCE's announcement, which will be determined on the day of the early release. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCES: St. Mark follows the DCE "Public and Private" closing announcements. In the event that the WSD closes and DCE does not close, NCES: St. Mark's Three-year-old Preschool and Kindergarten-5th grade classes will be canceled for the day.
- **Wrap-Around and Before & After Care** – In the event that there is a delayed start, before care will still be available. In the event that there is an early release, after care will not be available. Additionally, if there is a closing, wrap-around and before & after care will not be available. At times, when inclement weather is anticipated in the evening, after school activities are canceled, and we ask that you please pick up your child from after care as soon as possible, prior to the 5:30pm closing time.

NCECC: St. Michael

- **Delayed Starts** – Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCECC: St. Michael.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCECC: St. Michael follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCECC: St. Michael follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Licensed Child Care** – Delayed starts, early releases or closures may occur to ensure the safety of students, families and employees. In these rare instances, site directors will make the best decision for the safety of all, and families will be notified directly or using the standard of communication tools.

NCECC: St. Therese

- **Delayed Starts** – 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCECC: St. Therese.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCECC: St. Therese's 4K AM/PM classes follows DCE. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to DCE's announcement, which will be determined on the day of the early release. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCECC: St. Therese's 4K AM/PM classes follows the DCE "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Licensed Child Care** – Delayed starts, early releases or closures may occur to ensure the safety of students, families and employees. In these rare instances, site directors will make the best decision for the safety of all, and families will be notified directly or using the standard of communication tools.
