Hello Medford!

Spring is on the horizon but we still have some winter weather to deal with. February was a busy month with lots of events, projects and news happening in the City.

We've been celebrating Black History Month with several events throughout the City for everyone. We've also selected an architect for the new Fire Headquarters, launched a Job Readiness Program, and released our Comprehensive Plan!

As you can see from the items below, we've been working on a lot and have a ton in the pipeline for the spring. Here are a few highlights:

- The Galante Architecture Studio, Inc. has been selected to envision the new Medford Fire Headquarters. This project has been in the works for a while, so we're excited to finally see it realized.
- The City has adopted the final version of the Comprehensive Plan, which is intended to guide the long-range vision of Medford for the next 30 years and details a 10-year action plan in seven key development areas.
- Medford is also awarding ARPA funding to nonprofits that serve our community in the areas of food insecurity, housing, and social services areas informed by our ARPA survey from the fall. Applications open March 9, with an information session on March 8.

Medford Selects Architecture Firm to Design Fire Station Headquarters Medford to Award ARPA Funding to Nonprofits Aiding in Pandemic Recovery



The City has selected the architectural design firm The Galante Architecture Studio, Inc. (TGAS) to design and envision the potential new Medford Fire Department Headquarters, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The selection of an architect comes as multiple other improvement projects for Medford's fire stations are funded, finished and/or in progress, including the hiring of an Operations Project Manager (OPM) who assisted in the hiring process.

"Our fire department was not being well served with many of its current facilities including an antiquated and inefficient headquarters," said Mayor Lungo-Koehn. "For the past three years, I've been working with my team, led by the City's Chief of Staff Nina Nazarian, to bring our fire stations up to current standards and develop a plan to create a state-of-theart headquarters that meets our public safety and emergency response needs."

#### Medford Offering Discounted Rain Barrels for 2023 Season



The City of Medford is again offering residents access to discounted rain barrels through vendor partner, The Great American Rain Barrel (TGARB) for The City of Medford is launching its ARPA subrecipient grant award program for eligible nonprofits that serve the Medford community, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. By utilizing a portion of its remaining federal funds, the City will award one-time grants to nonprofits that were affected by the pandemic as well as servicing people and opportunities in recovering from COVID-19 related hardships.

"We're investing a percentage of our ARPA funding to assist area nonprofits as they navigate programming and recovery operations from the pandemic," Mayor Lungo-Koehn said. "This funding opportunity will make a direct impact on the lives of our most vulnerable community members and work toward addressing the needs identified in our community survey."

# Medford Releases Final Version of Comprehensive Plan



The City of Medford has released and adopted <u>the final version</u> of the Comprehensive Plan, a document that will guide Medford and help create a long-range vision for development and policy over the course of a decade, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

For roughly the past 18 months, City staff and external stakeholders worked collaboratively to form the foundation of the document with the input and guidance of community members. The plan engages seven core areas of development for Medford over the next 30 years, and includes a 10-year action plan.

#### Medford Launches Job

2023, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The barrels are being offered at \$84 for unpainted and \$89 for painted/colors. Orders must be submitted by April 30th at midnight and picked up at the distribution event on May 10th from 5pm-7pm at Medford High School.

"It's no secret that our weather patterns are changing, and the spring and summer months are getting increasingly hotter and drier leading to water scarcity in many parts of the state," Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn said. "With this rain barrel program, our community can conserve water usage, mitigate flooding events and help protect our waterways from pollution. I'm thrilled we're able to provide this cost-saving program again this year."

# Readiness Program for People in Recovery

The City of Medford is launching its first Job Readiness Program (JRP) for job seekers in the early stages of substance use recovery, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The program is run by the City Health Department's Office of Prevention and Outreach, in collaboration with the Bridge Recovery Center and Mass Hire.

The program is a two-day training, taking place on March 31st at the Bridge Recovery Center and April 7 at the Mass Hire Metro North Career Center. The program begins at 9am on both days, with transportation and lunch provided for attendees.

#### Medford Residents Have Recycled 730 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in January



Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 730 pounds of unwanted clothing in January.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

#### How will the areas for the cleanup be chosen?


