

WILLIAM WOLFRAM

William Wolfram, Class of 1973, is a world-renowned concert pianist who has won prestigious international competitions, as well as the acclaim of audiences and critics, for his versatility and virtuosity as a concert soloist, a chamber musician and recitalist.

Noted piano authority Joseph Horowitz devotes a full chapter in his book, *The Ivory Trade*, to Mr. Wolfram, writing that he is worthy of comparison to the young Van Cliburn and Vladimir Horowitz.

While attending White Plains schools, Mr. Wolfram studied at the Westchester Conservatory of Music and graduated from Juilliard School in New York. He went on to win the Silver Medal in both the William Kapell and the Naumberg International Piano Competitions. He was also a Bronze Medalist at the prestigious Tchaikovsky Piano Competition in Moscow.

Mr. Wolfram's concerto debut with the Pittsburgh Symphony, under the direction of Leonard Slatkin, was the first in a long succession of appearances with prestigious American orchestras, including the symphony orchestras of San Francisco, Indianapolis, North Carolina, New Jersey, Florida, Dallas, Milwaukee and Minnesota and the National Symphony of Washington, D.C.

Overseas, Mr. Wolfram has appeared with the Royal Scottish National Orchestra, the Warsaw, Moscow and Budapest Philharmonics, the National Symphony of Peru and the Bangkok Philharmonic of Thailand. He has played at festivals and recitals throughout France, Spain, Holland, the Philippines, Canada, Italy and Switzerland. He has also performed a benefit recital for the White Plains Public Schools.

Mr. Wolfram lives in New York City with his wife and two daughters.
