

Help from Home

If your child is not on track, remember math can be taught in everyday things you do at home. Have them help measure your favorite baking recipe, compare lengths of everyday items around the house, look for shapes in objects in the living room, and make up word problems about your family dinner. Your child will be on track in no time when you can find and practice math problems in your day to day routines. Beginning to teach students how to tell time is difficult. Make sure you have an analog clock in a common area and refer to it often to read the time together. We don't use these clocks as often as we have in the past, so extra exposure will help. When you talk about time at home try to use phrases like half-past, or a quarter after.

Second Grade News

Academics:

We will be learning about oi, oy syllable types, oa, oe, ow, suffixes, and ow, ou for spelling patterns. Second grade is working on alphabetical order with two letters, possessive pronouns, contractions, pronounverb agreement, and consonant+le syllables in language arts. . We are finishing up informative writing and moving on to research. We are learning counting to 1,000, place value to 1,000, place value with money, sequence and patterns, fractions, base-ten numbers, and time in our Bridges Math Curriculum.
