
LT. GOVERNOR'S Computing Challenge

- "Snow Globe"


Staff not participating by homeroom were asked to vote on the door decorating.

Tips for Parents to help keep kids safe in a digital world.





- 1. Set clear rules and guidelines for device and internet usage.
- 2. Monitor their online activity and talk to them about responsible behavior.
- 3. Teach them about online privacy and the dangers of sharing personal information.
- 4. Encourage open communication about their online experiences.
- 5. Use parental control tools to restrict access to inappropriate content.
- 6. Stay informed about the latest technology and social media platforms.
- 7. Encourage a healthy balance between online and offline activities.
- 8. Use technology together and show interest in their digital interests and experiences.
- 9. Teach critical thinking and digital citizenship: Emphasize the importance of being responsible and respectful digital citizens, including being cautious about the information they share online and how they treat others online.
