

# **DR. ANTHONY MARANO**

Dr. Anthony Marano, Class of 1952, has been a community and civic leader in White Plains for nearly 50 year.

Dr. Marano earned his nickname, "Champ", while a noted athlete, scholar and leader at White Plains High School. He was President of the sophomore and junior classes and the G.O. and received the Con Ed Sports Award for football. Years later he was named the Scholar Athlete of the 1950s by the Con Ed Athlete of the Week Program

At Williams College Dr. Marano played varsity Football, was a Tyng Foundation Scholar and elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He graduated from Cornell Medical School in 1960 and continued his studies as an intern at Bellevue Hospital, a resident at St. Lukes and a research associate in his specialty, cardiology, at Mt. Sinai Hospital.

His many professional achievements included Chief of Cardiology and President of the Medical Staff at White Plains Hospital Center, Medical Director and founder of Advanced Life Support System in White Plains and President of the Westchester/Putnam Chapter of the American Heart Association. He is currently Team Doctor for White Plains High School sports teams.

Dr. Marano has been an active leader in a wide range of community organizations -- President of the University Club of White Plains, Trustee of Pace University, Board member of the White Plains YMCA, medical chairman of the United Way and Cancer Crusade and member of the Tiger Fans Committee. In 1996 he was Chairperson of the White Plains High School Centennial Reunion Committee which coordinated activities marking the High School's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.
