

# ART MONK

Art Monk is one of the most successful, and most honored, football players in the history of the National Football League.

Born and raised in White Plains, Mr. Monk was a 1976 graduate of White Plains High School. He excelled in track, winning the national interscholastic championship in the 330-yard intermediate hurdles, and on the gridiron. Mr. Monk went on to earn All-American honors at Syracuse University and a distinguished 15 year professional career.

As a wide receiver for the Washington Redskins, Mr. Monk set a variety of career records with more than 900 receptions for more than 13,000 yards and 70 touchdowns. He helped the Redskins win three Super Bowl titles.

Long a supporter of programs for youth, Mr. Monk gives generously of his time and talents. He is co-sponsor of a program called "I Have a Dream" which guarantees youngsters from Washington's Terrell Elementary School academic support and a college education. He has tutored at the Winston Educational Center and assisted the Black Student Scholarship Fund.

Because of his commitment to children he was honored in 1992 as one of the "Washingtonians of the Year." Mr. Monk frequently returns to White Plains to participate in school and youth programs.
