

Please join us for this event to learn more about colleges and what they have to offer.





Dear Parents & Guardians,

As in past years, I write with a special invitation for you to participate in a very important project here at Roman Catholic High School – our annual Continuous Improvement Survey. The data we gather from the survey helps us understand what we are doing well as a school and also what opportunities we have to make us even better.

Survey questions center on five key areas, Instructional Quality, Constituent Relations, Operational Excellence, Finance, and Overall Satisfaction. - For data accuracy, we ask each family to complete the survey once.

We will receive the survey results in April and will communicate them to you soon after. Know that all data gathered benefits us here at Roman Catholic High School. The survey results will provide us with needed data that helps us maintain a school culture focused on continuous improvement.
