



All Students Graduate from High School

Goal: 2021-2022

 FPS will increase four year graduation rate from 76.4% to 80% with no individual racial/ethnic group below 70% by 2022.

Achievement and Integration Goals

#1: Faribault Public Schools, four-year graduation rate, for Black students, will increase from 42.9% in 2019 to 48% by 2023.

2020 = 59.1%

2021 = 61%

#2: The number of FPS Black, secondary students participating in leadership opportunities, will increase from 11% in 2019 to 30% by 2023. 2020-21 = 14.23%

2021-22 = 33.2%

(FMS = 37%, FHS = 29%)

#3: By 2023, increase the number of FPS teachers of color from 1.47% in 2019 to 3% by 2023.

2020-21 = 2.2%

2021-22 = 3.2%
