A+ FAQ's

When do my tutoring/mentoring hours need to be completed?

Students need to have all tutoring/mentoring hours turned in by May 1 of their graduation year. If you are a senior and still need to complete tutoring hours, you can reach out to your local grade school to volunteer at their aftercare program, become a peer tutor at St. Dominic, or reach out to an organization similar to Boys and Girls club.

Is there a GPA requirement for the A+ program?

Yes! The requirement is based on your unweighted GPA. At the time of graduation, you must have a minimum of 2.5 gpa if you earned a 17 or higher on the Math section of the ACT, 2.8 if you earned a 16 or higher and 3.0 if you earned a 15. This number will not be rounded.

I know my attendance percentage needs to be at 95%. What should I do if I am under that percentage? If you know your attendance percentage is under 95%, you should look at the appeals process! Parents/guardians or students may file an attendance appeal if a student's attendance record is tied to a MAJOR illness, injury, or personal catastrophe. Appeals for an illness or injury require a doctor's note for each incident of illness or injury. (Vacations taken during the school year, as well as on-going routine doctor, dentist, and orthodontist appointments are NOT appealable since they do not fall under the category of major illness, injury or catastrophe.)

Are there any other requirements I need to make sure I meet?

Yes! There is a Math requirement- Students who have earned a 17 or higher on the Math section of the ACT have met this requirement. If a student earned a 16, they must also have a 2.8 gpa. If they have earned a 15, they must have a 3.0 gpa. Anything below a 15 they have not met the requirement.

Students also must maintain a record of good citizenship to qualify for post-secondary financial assistance.

Michael Laugeman is a 2017 graduate of St. Dominic High School who participated in Cross Country, Baseball, Football, Peer Ministry and Viri Dei. As a student at St. Dominic, Michael made an effort to fully engage in the religious and spiritual resources that St. Dominic had to offer. He sought advice and brought my questions about the faith to his teachers and into our Chapel, where he was able to peacefully

sit and be with Jesus."It was during my time at St. Dominic, that I received Jesus' invitation to follow him more closely. He asked me to set aside the self-centered, mediocre way of living being offered by the world and to live according to the Gospel. After experiencing this conversion, I saw clearly the peace and joy I received from living in a faithful relationship with Jesus and His Church. As a result, I then felt Him invite me to give my life to Him, as a priest, in order to spend my life helping others grow in their relationship with Jesus."

Michael is currently in his sixth year of priestly formation at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary, now in his second year of theological studies with hopes of being ordained a transitional deacon in 2025 and ordained a priest in 2026. BESt Healthcare Institute: is a collaboration between Barnes-Jewish Hospital, Express Scripts, Inc. and University of Health Sciences and Pharmacy in St. Louis (formerly St. Louis College of Pharmacy). The mission of the BESt Healthcare Institute is to expose and prepare local underrepresented minority students for a future career in healthcare. The mission is executed with a model that combines academics, exposure, and professional development. Academics focus on improving mathematics, science, professional development, and ACT/SAT skills during a four-week intensive summer program.

Program Highlights:

- 100% of BESt graduates attend 4-year universities, 87% choose a career in healthcare.
- Student stipends (earned based on merit, behavior, attitude, and adherence to program rules)
- Up to 4 weeks of exposure to college life and health care providers
- Program is free of charge

For the 2023 summer, we are looking forward to hosting the program in-person onsite on the campus of University of Health Sciences and Pharmacy in St. Louis (formerly known as St. Louis College of Pharmacy), unless circumstances with COVID-19 change. This year's program runs June 19 through

July 14, 2023 for all cohorts. Underrepresented freshman, sophomore, junior or senior students are eligible to participate who reside in the St. Louis region, St. Louis City/County St. Charles, County and Madison, St. Clair, IL counties. The BESt IV program is open to all rising college freshman, even those planning to attend colleges or universities outside of University of Health Sciences and Pharmacy in St. Louis.
