Northern Highlands will continue to evaluate ways to enhance student wellness and its wellness program and promote programs that focus on wellness, climate and culture. We shall expand programs and opportunities provided by the district for students, faculty and staff, as well as families to support and foster wellness.

## Goal #3 Outcome

- 1- Summer Academy and Wrap Around Services (Tuesday -Thursday from 10am to 8pm during summer academy)
- 2- Summer Bridge Services (workshops on topics such as mindfulness & gratitude, recognizing strengths and positive self talk)
- 3- Counselor introductions and tours to incoming 9th graders in August
- 4- Summer Counseling Appointments available in August (approximately 25 sessions were held)
- 5- Expand Signs of Suicide Prevention Program (SOS for High School Students)
- 6- 2 parent programs on 4/21 and 5/5 (Kara Kushnir)

## Goal #3 Outcome

- 7- Social emotional learning (SEL) as evidenced in observations, post conferences and unit plans
- 8- Dating Violence Assembly- linked to 11th grade HPE curriculum
- 9- Vaping Presentation in December for all 9th graders
- 10- Therapists from NJHW presented to students on healthy coping skills and when to seek help from an adult
- 11- Therapy Dogs during final exams
- 12- Sandy Hook Promise- Educated 9th and 10th graders during NJSLA on the importance of help-seeking and how to talk to a friend who is struggling with mental health
- 13- Welcome Back wellness for staff created for 9/1 and 9/2
- 14- Drug and Alcohol Survey provided to students in October 2021
- 15- Mental Health Screening for Athletes
- 16- Increased Orientation to Sophomores due to COVID in-person loss from previous year
