Beloved Alumnus Robbie Schuller '78 is Honored — Schuller Circle Dedication

On September 18, 2021 the Schuller family and a group of alumni gathered on campus to celebrate the legacy of Robbie Schuller '78 and to unveil *Schuller Circle*, a brick and granite fire pit surrounded by a circle of seats in The Sunken Garden.

Robbie came to Hyde School in the summer of 1973 and began a lifelong connection with the school and his classmates. Along with his many professional accomplishments, he worked at the Hyde Bath and Hyde Woodstock campuses. **Robbie had a gift for connecting people** through humor and believing in the best of people. As his classmate, Thomas Baez '78, said during his remarks, "Robbie and I came from different backgrounds and looked different, yet, through the Hyde experience, we became brothers. His heartbeat was my heartbeat."

During the dedication, alums and family members spoke about Robbie's legacy. His daughters, Blake and Olivia, lit the flame of the fire pit, and alumni and student singers sang songs from Robbie's time at Hyde. It was a powerful reminder that in life **we forge bonds when we set high expectations** and go after our best with others by our side. A few days later, the Class of 2022 lit the fire and shared their goals—a new group of students setting a vision and creating bonds that will become lifelong. Engraved on the plaque are these words:

Robert (Robbie) Eliot Schuller '78 embodied the true core of Hyde character, compassion, and laughter. He was our friend and had a special gift for connecting people and building community. This circle honors that spirit in him and in all of us.

The School is eternally grateful to the *Rob Schuller Memorial Fund Committee*: Thomas Baez, Scott Bertschy, Jeff Black, Stuart Jones, and to all of you who had a part in honoring Robbie's legacy through your generosity. Para Cyclist Clara Brown of Maine A Profile in Courage

Our Women in Leadership class had the pleasure of welcoming Team USA Para Cyclist Clara Brown to speak to the whole community in a school meeting. Native Mainer, Clara competed in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics and is a gold medal World Champion, won in 2022. The students were immediately enthralled with her story, which embodies humility, perseverance, and the perfect example of taking your job seriously, not yourself! Brown was an avid athlete as a competitive gymnast, runner, and skier until she sustained an incomplete spinal cord injury at the age of 12.

After years of rehabilitation and some setbacks, she rejoined the world of competition as a coxswain for Falmouth High School's rowing team. Clara suffers from partial paralysis and weakness on the right side of her body and in her first year of college purchased her first modified road bike, and the rest is championship history.

Through a powerful presentation of her film, *Ability*, Clara shared her struggles and how **she overcame obstacles larger than most can imagine**, as well as her down to earth and silly side. Led by a student panel, the community asked questions, soaked up her answers, and was forced to recognize that we all can do hard things, it just takes effort. In Clara's case, with sweet rewards as basic as gummy bears for a good work out, to dominating world championships in her sport.

We were *all* inspired by Clara's journey. Watching the faces in the room and listening to the hushed silence it was clear that each person took a piece of her story to heart as we look at our own strengths, challenges, and vision for the future.

After being told she would never walk again, Clara set out on a path to push herself and opened up herself to a new path to reach her unique potential.

After three years of developing the program, the *Hyde Institute* is excited to report that the *Discovery Process* will officially launch at the beginning of the 2022-23 school year.


The inaugural cohort of a dozen schools is spread across six states and include a mix of public and private schools in rural, suburban, and urban settings. At the click of a button, participating teachers will have access to over ten hours of on-line training and 134 lessons organized in 25 modules. This learning content includes all of **Hyde's Five Words and Principles** along with such familiar concepts as The Action-Reflection Cycle, Rigor-Synergy-Conscience, and The Biggest Job. Alums will be interested to know that the lesson titles will sound familiar: "Leave It Better Than You Found It", Introductions", "The Lighthouse Story" and "The 7-11 Dilemma."

Malcolm Gauld '72, Executive Director of the Hyde Institute, has completed a book on the program titled *Culture by Design - The Discovery Process as a New Way for Schools*.






Starting with Patrick ('03), Mary's enthusiasm for, and dedication to the Hyde process grew exponentially, and I think she knew then that her destiny was to someday work at the school.

Mary's journey of helping other families started, however, long before she and her family moved to Maine. In 2009 she started a group called Mothers of Youth; then she founded Building Strong Catholic Families. This effort took many months of connecting with the Archdiocese of Virginia but finally Mary convinced them that Hyde's parenting workshops would even help Catholic families! She received training and then trained others to help her present The Biggest Job workshop and small group seminars for several years in Catholic schools in her area.

As head of Family Education at Hyde, Mary affected and influenced hundreds of families with stories from her own challenges as a mother, and words of encouragement and comfort.

Of all the words used to describe Mary, attitude is the one that stands out: attitude – in a good way. Mary never stood back waiting to be asked; she always said, "how can I help?," whether it was collating papers before a family weekend, or standing in front of the community telling her story, or housing HAPA parents in Harpswell, she wanted to be involved; she was all in.



Mary was a maternal sage to students who always offered guidance and warmth.

But the attitude she brought to performing arts is the one that will always stand out for me: bold, audacious, undaunted and daring are words I would choose to describe Mary in front of a crowd at parents'weekend. She modeled the courage she so wanted for the parents she taught.

Mary's spirit is now a part of the magic in the walls at Hyde; and her grandchildren will undoubtedly be infused with that spirit as well.
