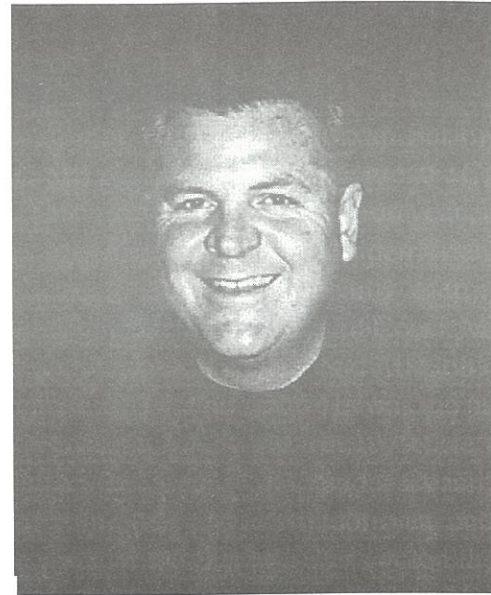

INTRODUCTION OF HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

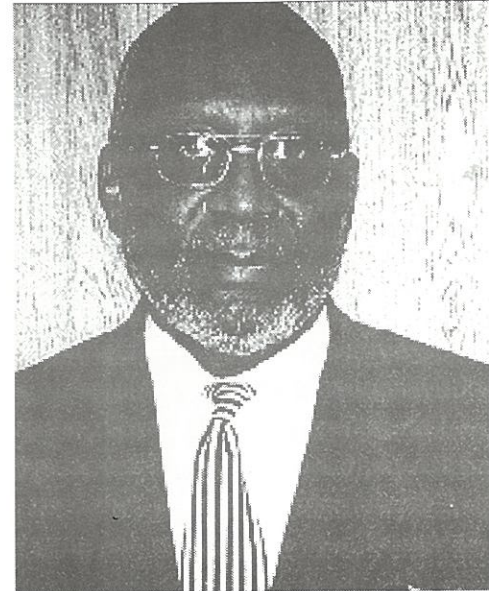
Bryan Barlow - Class of 1980

Bryan Barlow was a three-sport standout for Taft High School. He led the greater Cincinnati area in touchdown passes and in yards passing his senior year as quarterback. He was named First Team GMC and All Golden Triangle and was voted the Most Valuable Player for the Tiger team. During his senior year in basketball, under fellow Hall of Famer and Coach Marv McCollum, Barlow was named First Team in the GMC and All Golden Triangle. He also was named to First Team All District. He was the point guard for the Tigers' only outright GMC championship in 1979. He was the starting catcher all three years for the baseball team under Coach Joe Urso. He was named Second Team GMC his sophomore year and First Team GMC in both his junior and senior years. Barlow was voted the Most Valuable Player in Baseball his senior year. While attending Harding Junior High School, he was coached by Larry Wood for three years in baseball and two years in basketball. He graduated from Miami University where he earned three letters in baseball. Barlow lives in Coppell, Texas, with his wife and three children.



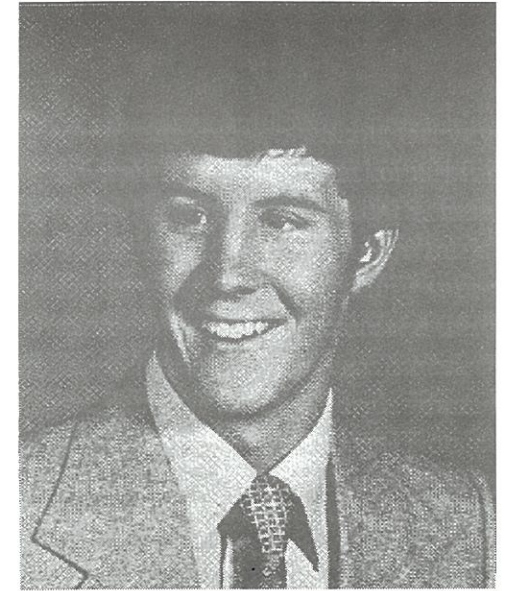
Tony Blaine - Class of 1958

Tony Blaine graduated from Hamilton High School in 1958 after playing three years of basketball and track. The Big Blue won the Greater Ohio League (GOL) track championship under fellow Hall of Famer and Coach Marv McCollum. As co-captain of the Big Blue basketball team, Blaine was named Second Team All State his senior year and played against the Kentucky All Stars. Under fellow Hall of Famer and Coach Warren Scholler, Blaine led the Big Blue with 22 points against the victorious Middletown Middies, led by Jerry Lucas. Blaine attended Central State University where he continued his basketball prowess. He was named All League all four years and was co-captain for three years. He graduated from Central State in 1962. Blaine is the executive director of the Butler Metropolitan Housing Authority and has three children.



Dr. Scott Grevey - Class of 1978

Scott Grevey was one of the outstanding Grevey brothers who played basketball for the Hamilton City School District. During his senior year in 1978, he was named All State in basketball and holds the number 4 spot in Taft's top all-time scorers with 950 points. He was the GMC's leading scorer with a 25 point per game average his senior year. He received the Most Efficient Award from fellow Hall of Famer and Coach McCollum. He continued playing basketball at the University of Pittsburgh where his teams participated in the NCAA tournament twice and the NIT once. In 1982, Grevey received the Presidential Award for Academic and Athletic Achievement. In 1986, he received his Medical Degree from the Medical College of Ohio in Toledo. He performed his residency in dermatology at Wright State University. Grevey has been a practicing dermatologist in the Hamilton area since 1994. He and his wife have three daughters and Grevey is now coaching his daughter's basketball team.



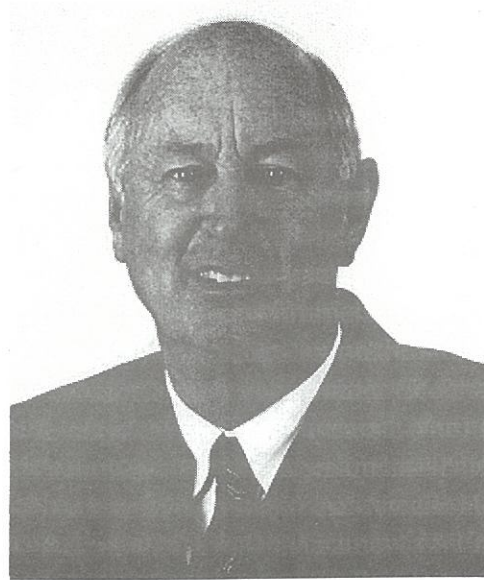
Barb Hurley - Class of 1982

Barb Hurley graduated from Hamilton High School in 1982 after playing soccer and basketball for three years and track for one year. During her sophomore year, Hurley was named MVP and was the leading scorer in soccer. She was named First Team All-State and again the leading scorer during her junior year. As captain during her senior year, she was named first team All GMC and Best Offensive Player. She started all 68 varsity basketball games during her three years at Big Blue. Hurley was named GMC honorable mention and was the leading free throw shooter her sophomore year. During her junior year, she was named Second Team All GMC and Golden Triangle, Best Defensive Player and was the assist leader under fellow Hall of Famer and Coach Pat Sword. She was named special mention in District 15 as the Big Blue team was the GMC champions. As a senior, Hurley was named MVP, First Team GMC, First Team District 15, First Team Golden Triangle. As the leading scorer and free throw shooter for the GMC champions of Hamilton High, she was also named to the District 15 All Star team. Hurley graduated sixth in her class of 750 at Hamilton High and graduated magna cum laude from the Bowling Green State University in 1986. She lives in Cincinnati.



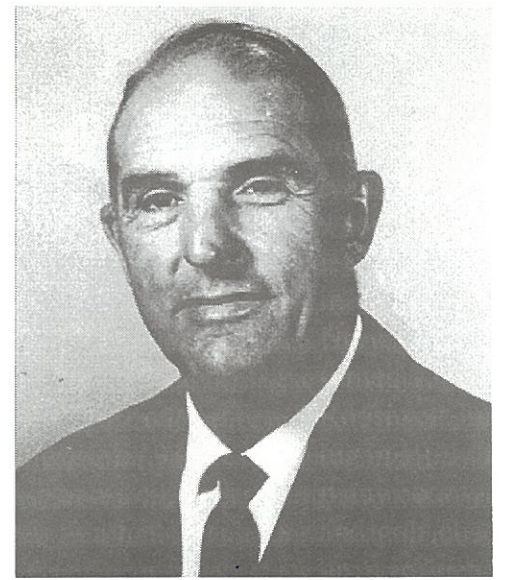
Mike Marks - Class of 1962

While a student at Taft High School, Mike Marks was a member of the golf team for three years and the varsity basketball team for two years. He was a member of the Tigers' 1962 state championship team coached by fellow Hall of Famer Marv McCollum. Marks was a valuable reserve during the regular season, but stepped into the starting lineup at tournament time. He was a key player in the tournament as the unbeaten Tigers won the state title. He played basketball at Centre College for four years under Coach Lew Phillips where he was named All Conference for three years. Marks was a member in the Kentucky-Indiana All Star college team his senior year. He was a candidate for the 1966 Small College All-American. He was a participant in the first NCAA "Small College" tournament in 1964. Marks was inducted into the Centre College Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996. He is a banker in Nicholasville, Kentucky, where he resides with his wife and three children.



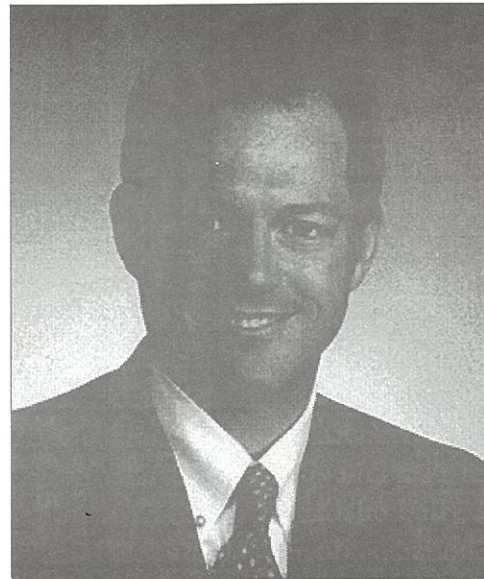
Winston Metcalfe - Class of 1925 and Coach

Winston Metcalfe excelled in four sports - football, basketball, baseball and track while at Hamilton High School. He was a member of the 1923 undefeated football team. He received a Gold Medal in the 1924 Southwest District OHSA relays, participating in the 120 yard high hurdles. He attended Wilmington College where he continued his athletic career in all sports. He received his Masters Degree in Education at Miami University. He first taught and coached in Holland, Ohio and then returned to Hamilton in 1930 to teach math and coach for 41 years at Roosevelt Junior High School, Hamilton High and Hamilton Taft, retiring in 1971. He organized junior high football teams and was a timer for many county basketball teams. He served as an assistant football coach and golf coach at Hamilton High and Hamilton Taft. Metcalfe was a great influence on his players and was considered a true teacher coach. He coached several golf teams that reached the state tournament in Columbus. An outstanding golfer himself, he boasted his best golf score - 63 - at age 62. He became an "Age Shooter" at age 68 when he shot the same score at Potters Golf course in 1974. Winston Metcalfe died in 1983.



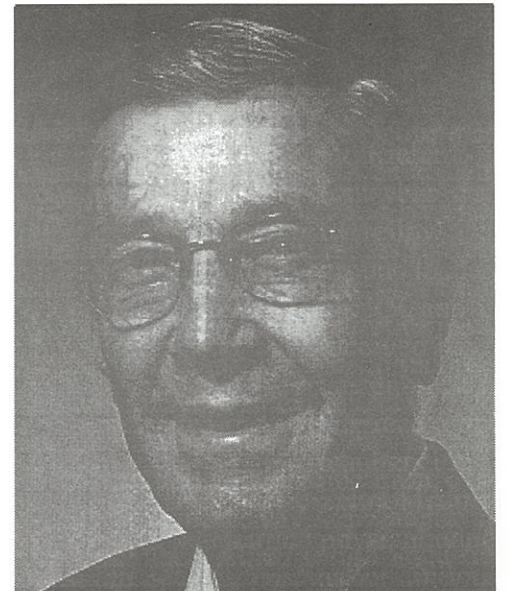
Mark Martin - Class of 1983

Mark Martin was a member of Hamilton High School's Big Blue baseball team for three years and was the catcher on Dan Bowling's first state championship team in 1983. He was named First Team GMC with a .390 batting average. He graduated from the University of Cincinnati where he was the starting catcher for four years. He was the captain of the UC baseball team in his senior year. He led the team in RBI's in 1985, establishing a single season record at UC. He finished his career at UC as the All Time career leader in RBI's. Martin was named the All Metro Conference catcher in 1987. After graduating from UC, he signed with the Atlanta Braves organization, playing in the Pioneer League in Idaho Falls, Idaho, in 1987. He later played in the New York Yankees organization, playing the Florida State League and the New York-Penn League in 1988. He then graduated from the University of Toledo Law School and the following year he received his Masters Degree in Tax Law from Washington University in St. Louis. He was appointed to the very prestigious position as a law clerk in the US Federal Tax Court in Washington, DC. He is co-author of nine papers published on US Tax Literature. He lives in Houston, Texas, with his wife and is a partner in one of the largest law firms in Texas.



Dr. Richard Nelson - Class of 1946

Dr. Richard Nelson graduated from Hamilton High School in 1946 after four years as a member of the nationally known Flip Twisters, directed by fellow Hall of Famer Jim Grimm. He was a Hamilton City playground leader from 1945-1949 and the supervisor of summer playgrounds in 1950 and 1953-1956. He served in the US Army from 1950-1952. He received his Bachelors Degree from The Ohio State University in 1950 and his Masters in 1955. In 1961, he received a Doctor of Education Degree from the University of Cincinnati. He was a physical education teacher, intramural director and gymnastics coach at Hamilton High School from 1953-1956. In 1956, Nelson was appointed an instructor in physical education and recreation at Miami University. He also served as intramural director and gymnastics coach at Miami. He was professor of Health Education, Anatomy and Kinesiology from 1961 until his retirement in 1991, although he continues to teach Anatomy classes. He was chairman of the Health and Physical Education Department at Miami from 1972 until 1981. He co-directed the Ohio State Department of Education project in drug education and drug prevention. He also co-directed the Cleveland Metropolitan Corporation dental health project for Southwestern Ohio and has published an instructional book on soccer. He has also published numerous articles in health and physical education journals. Nelson resides in Oxford with his wife and has one daughter.



Cash Powell, Jr. - Class of 1948

Cash Powell ran track and cross country while at Hamilton High School. He held the record for the one mile run in 1947 and 1948 and was the Southwestern Ohio District Champion. He was also the champion of the Miami University Invitational Meet in 1947 and was named First Team Ohio Cross Country. He continued on to Miami University and won nine championships in track and cross country, including five MAC championships. He set 15 varsity records - 10 in cross country and five in track. He set the all time Miami record in the mile run, along with the MAC record mile run and the Miami Field record mile run. He finished in first place 38 times - 15 in cross country and 23 in track. He placed second 6 times in cross country and 11 times in track. He finished in the Top Ten at the NCAA cross country championships and was a silver medalist, Second Team. He was a member of both Miami's track team and cross country team which won three MAC championships. He earned six varsity letters and two freshman numerals while at Miami. He won the Ohio College Champion one mile run in 1951 and 1952 and won the Ohio College Champion two mile run in 1952. He was inducted in to the Butler County Sports Hall of Fame in 1998 and the Miami University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000. He is the associate director of the Center for Competitive Change in the School of Engineering at the University of Dayton. Powell resides in Springboro, OH with his wife and has two children.



Ron Sutton - Class of 1966

Ron Sutton was a three year letterman in both football and basketball while at Garfield High School. He was the football captain his senior year and was named First Team GOL and First Team Southwest Ohio District defensive end. He was also honorable mention All Ohio. In basketball, he was a member of fellow Hall of Famer Jack Young's team. Sutton started every game all three years as the Griffins won 55 and lost 13 with three GOL championships or ties. They also won two sectional titles. Sutton played in only one losing game on the Garfield floor, an 83-82 loss to Dayton Roosevelt, in his junior year. That same year he was named First Team GOL. He was captain his senior year and again was named First Team GOL and First Team All Southwest Ohio and honorable mention All Ohio. At the end of his Garfield career, he was the all time leading scorer with 969 points, all time leading rebounder with 832 boards, and the highest single season average of 18.7 points per game. Sutton went on to Tennessee Tech University where he graduated with a Bachelors Degree in Health and Physical Education in 1970. He played three years of basketball under Coach Connie Inman and was named All Conference in 1969. He has been a high school teacher and head basketball coach in Charleston, SC for over 20 years where he resides with his wife and two children.



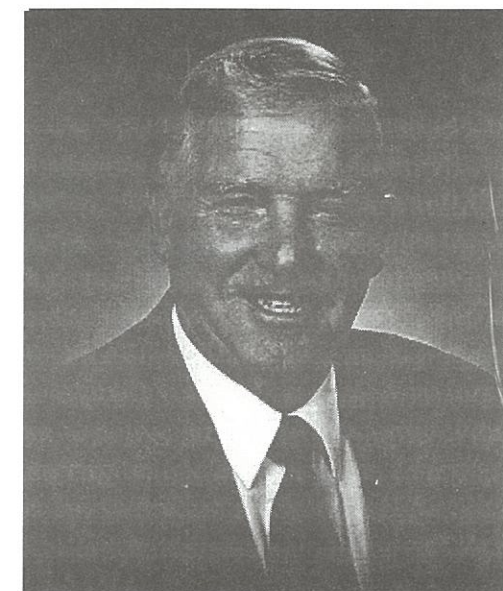
Harold "Buster" Treinen - Class of 1946

Harold "Buster" Treinen played basketball and baseball for three years and football for one year at Hamilton High School. He was the leading scorer in football in 1945 and was named Third Team All State and a member of the All GOL team. He also was the leading scorer in basketball in 1946 and was honorable mention All State. He led his baseball team in hitting in 1945. He was in the Cincinnati Reds Minor league baseball system for nine years, playing in its All Star game in 1949 in Muncie, Indiana. He was the leading hitter of the league. He set a record for starting double plays for a third baseman in the III League in Burlington, Iowa, in 1953. He was named to the All Star team and the league's leading defensive third baseman in 1954 in Colonial Heights, Virginia. In the 1951 national semi-pro tournament in Wichita, Kansas, Treinen received trophies for his .571 batting average and outstanding fielding. He was also chosen on the All American Team. He played for the Lafayette, IN, team which finished in third place. In 1956, he played with Ft. Wayne as they won the national championship, while the next year, they were runners-up. In the 1956 world semi-pro tournament, he represented the United States against other participating countries such as Japan, Canada, Mexico, Columbia, South America and The Netherlands. He was also a member of Weiland's Cafe fast pitch softball team which won the southwestern Ohio regional championship and participated in the national tournament in Cleveland in 1945. He also won the state baseball championship in Indiana in 1956 and 1957. Treinen retired from General Motors and resides in New Smyrna Beach, FL.



Jack Young - Class of 1948 and Coach

Jack graduated from Hamilton High School after playing junior high basketball for three years under fellow Hall of Famer and Coach Bill Sharp at Roosevelt. He received his Bachelors Degree in Education from Miami University in 1952 and received his Masters Degree in School Administration from Xavier University in 1961. Young coached basketball at Garfield from 1959 - 1966 and at Taft from 1970- 1972. As head coach at Garfield, his teams won three GOL championships and he was named the GOL Coach of the Year two times. He was also named AA Southwest Ohio Coach of the Year for the 1963-64 season. His Griffins won two sectional AA championships in 1964 and 1966. In 1977-78, he was named Class A Southwest Ohio Coach of the Year while coaching at New Miami and winning the sectional Class A championship. He was also named the Butler County Coach of the Year. Young has also coached cross country, track, baseball, and girls volleyball. He was the head basketball and baseball coach at Belmont University in Nashville, TN and has been instrumental in recruiting over 90 Hamilton City School District students to Belmont since 1966, with a total of 150 students from Butler County. He has been basketball coach for a total of 32 years, both at the high school and college level. He is a member of the Ohio High School Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame and the Belmont University Athletic Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the Butler County Sports Hall of Fame in 1995. Young currently works at Clark's Sporting Goods and resides in Seven Mile with his wife. He has five children.



Dot Smiley Zaragoza- Class of 1981

Dot Smiley Zaragoza graduated in the first year of the newly recombined Hamilton High School in 1981. She was a member of fellow Hall of Famer and Coach Pat Sword's 17-5 basketball team which were co-champions in the GMC in 1981. Smiley is a member of Hamilton High Girls 350 Varsity Point Club as she scored 388 points her senior year. She was named First Team All GMC and District 15, being named Player of the Year for District 15. She also received Second Team All State honors. Zaragoza received a basketball scholarship to St. Mary's of the Plains College in Dodge City, Kansas. She played for four years and graduated in 1985 with a Bachelor Degree in Business. Zaragoza resides in Denver, CO, with her husband and three children.
