

Timeless Gift In Honor of A Beloved HAPA

Bruce Cunningham (Brian '06 Woodstock) is described as a man with a larger than life spirit and the true embodiment of what it means to be a Hyde School parent – he was a loving father; he was committed to finding the best in himself and others; and he was a mentor to students and parents.

After passing away suddenly in 2005, the Hyde community sought ways to honor his legacy and commitment to our school. Eventually it was determined that a clock was the appropriate way to celebrate Bruce's life. Like Bruce, the clock would stand watch over the Woodstock campus. This gesture was the result of the generosity of the Class of 2005 senior parents.

Upon the consolidation of the Woodstock and Bath campuses in 2017, there was no doubt that the clock would make its way up to Bath. Since its arrival, we found a home for the clock in the Sunken Garden, the centerpiece of the Bath campus, where it continues to watch over our Hyde family.

As Brian Cunningham writes, "My family is so happy to hear the news about the clock. It means the world to us... In retrospect, I ended up at the Bath campus for a period of time and so has my father."

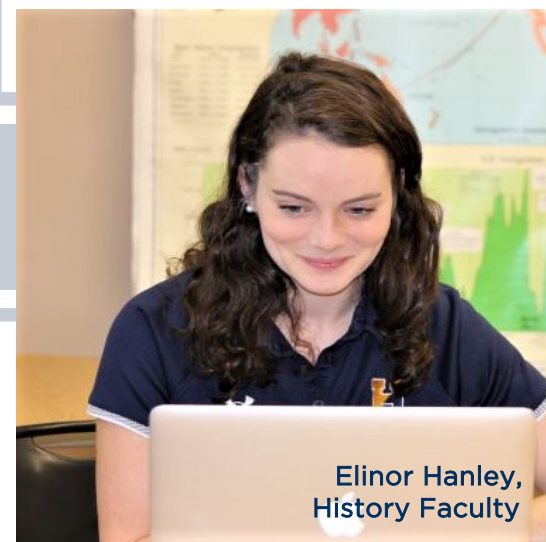

Ken '72 and Claire '75 Grant Legendary Veterans Retire

Speaking personally, I am still having a hard time wrapping my head around the fact that Claire and Ken Grant's combined 80-plus year tenure as Hyde teaching stalwarts has come to an end.

I first met Ken in Sandy See's English 9 class during our first day as Hyde students in 1968. (He likes to remind me that we actually met two years earlier on a Bath Little League field when his Knights of Columbus nine shelled my appropriately named cellar-dwelling Odd Fellows team.) This June, he and I will celebrate the 50th reunion of the great Class of 1972. In between, Ken served thousands of Hyde students and parents as a gold standard science teacher, outstanding coach of all things running, eye-opening wilderness educator in The Great Outdoors, an administrator with unparalleled organization skills, and a (founding) head of school.

Although Claire's Hyde resume might set a record for different positions held, she is especially remembered for her work with Hyde parents in the Family Learning Center where she personified Hyde's signature balancing act of challenge and support. She also carried an uncanny sense of the pulse of the student body, both individually and collectively. Testament to her profound impact on generations of Hyde students can be found in the heartfelt video created by a group of Hyde alums who organized themselves to express their appreciation to Claire "in person."



Although Claire and Ken met on the Bath campus in the late 70s, together they were the founding leadership duo of the Woodstock campus and also spent two years at our charter school in Washington DC. In the middle of all this, they also found time to raise three children -- Sarah, Jesse and Lauren -- Hyde graduates all. Not only is Hyde a far better place thanks to their efforts -- How's that for an understatement? -- the countless students, parents, and colleagues they have touched now carry their teachings forward for future generations of Hyde students.

Every time I see the signs for Carrabassett Valley, my heart immediately lands in Eustis and the Lennox Black Wilderness Preserve. I have been dozens of times in my tenure as a Hyde faculty member; trips filled with laughter, tears, sweat, and blood. It feels like a part of me lives there permanently.

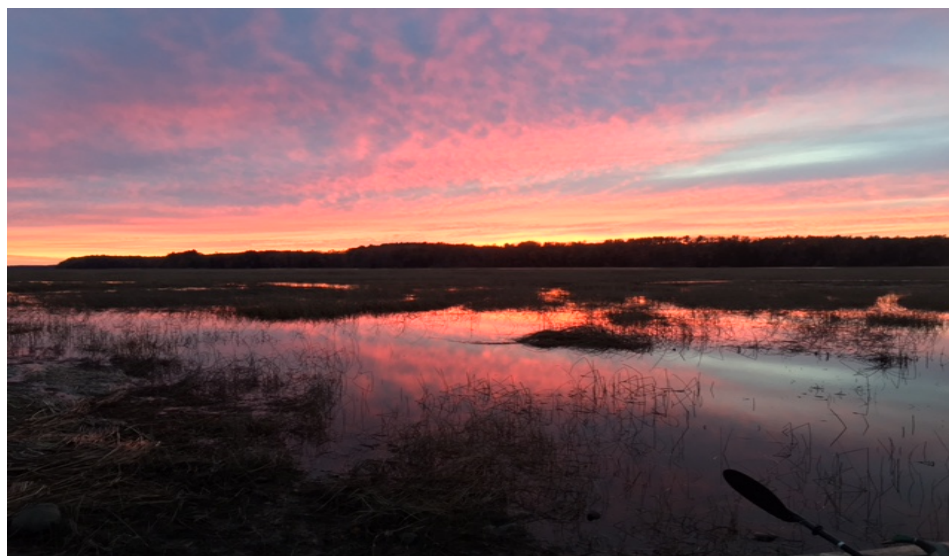
I am lucky to have grown up as an adult and as an educator in stride with my students as they surmount challenges in the stunning Maine wilderness. At times, the circumstances for being there can be fraught, but nonetheless, inevitable learning will occur. This is the type of learning that is only possible through experiencing rewards of overcoming adversity. In the words of Rene Daumal, “One climbs, one sees. One descends, one sees no longer, but one has seen... When one can no longer see, one can at least still know.”

In the fall, Associate Head Rich Truluck and I led a group of young men on an overnight canoe trip across Flagstaff Lake. The poor weather forecast was not going to slow us down, and despite decades of tripping experience, I had to overcome my negative attitudes surrounding this impending experience. We battled the weather and winds all day until finally making camp. The attitudes of the adults and students alike were flaring, however when we sat down, cold and drenched, to break bread over the fire, we all looked around and this shared experience was now seared into our memories.

Every outing to the Black Wilderness Preserve offers its own unique challenges. It is the pivotal moments and formative experiences that students bring south to Bath and they inevitably conduct themselves differently. For that, I remain eternally grateful for the privilege of bringing our students into the void of the northern Maine wilderness.

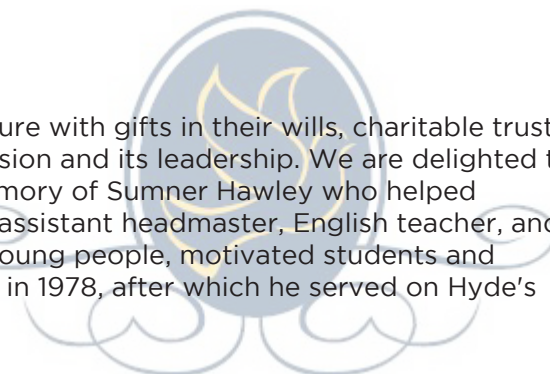

Donors are urged to contact the School ahead of the electronic transfer to assure proper application and recording of their gift. Securities transferred by other means, either through the mail or hand delivered, will be treated as transferred on the date the School takes possession of the securities.

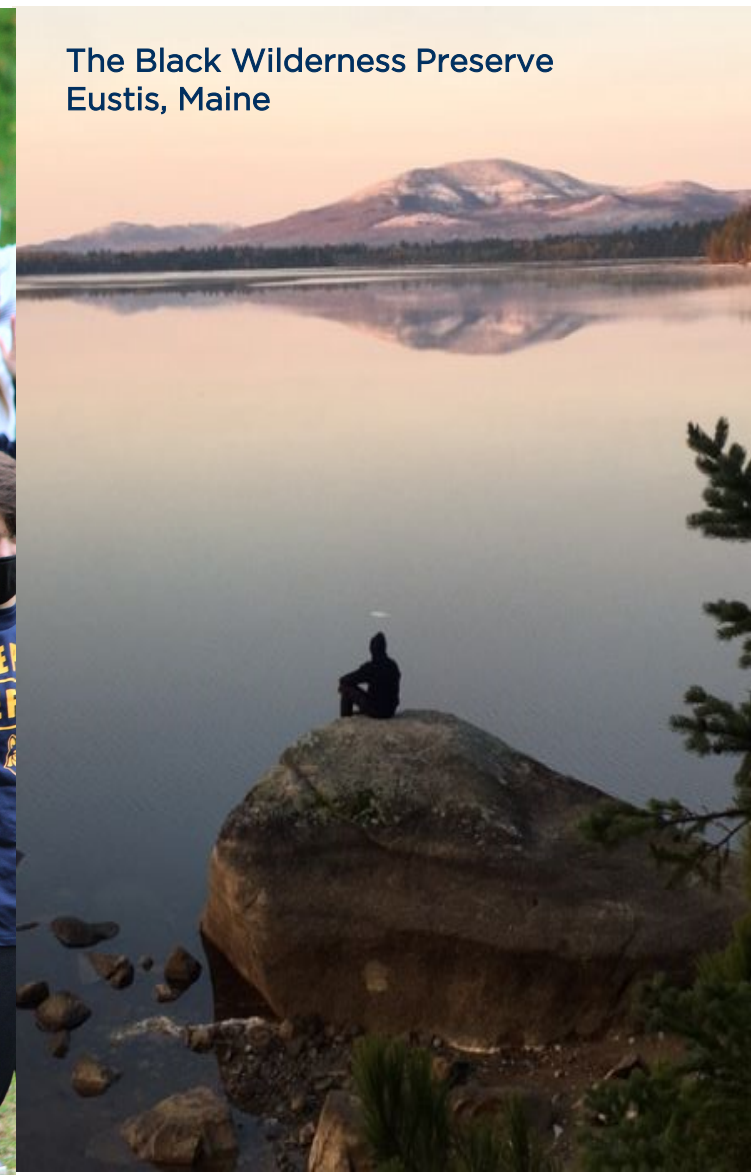
