- Math (3rd-8th grade) - Thursday, April 20th & Friday, April 21st

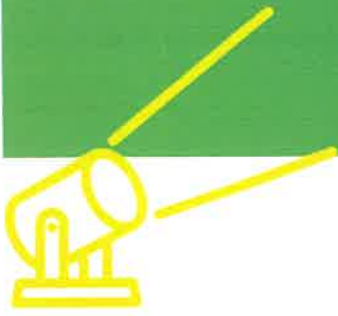

Ms. Mendoza - 7th Gr. Science

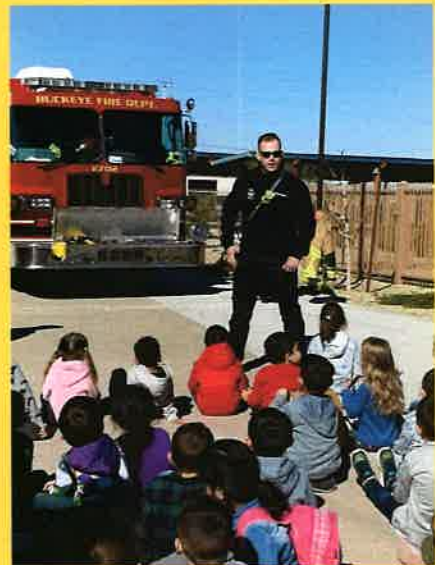

This lesson is part of the brand new OpenSciEd curriculum recently adopted by the governing board. In this lesson students learn that materials can pass through the cell membrane by investigating the structures of the cell when they are exposed to plain water versus saltwater.
