

Rev^d Madam Cobbe Hill 27th Oct. 1823

I Received your last by the hand of Mr John
 H. Lancaster and I have no doubt that from my long
 silence that you may think that I have neglected your
 my case for not writing you before was on account
 of an expected letter from Miss Watterley, I sent the
 letter by my Mr John Brooke that you wrote me, to her
 it being all the documents that you had put in my
 hands, concerning her case, she requested Mr Brooke to
 inform me that she would write to me on the
 subject and in case she did not write I might deter-
 mine that she would not pay your Bond, and that
 I might proceed as I might think proper, the time
 is now past and if you intend to force payment you
 must send the Bond to me by the first safe person as,
 % Mr Black's Business I can do nothing without the
 necessary papers, As to the case of Mr Stonestreet debt due
 Miss Dent I obtained Judgment last summer and he has
 removed it to the Court of Appeals and in course the
 Judgment must be confirmed there before the

money can be got at - As to ^{the} case of Mr. Ford Judgment
was Obtained in August last in St. Marys County Court but
I expect he will appeal to a higher Court in order to postpone
payment as Howstreet has done, but you may be assured
that I will not Indulge them no longer than the laws
of the land will permit, for I am as anxious to make
my Collections as you are to receive - I have called on
Mr. Diggs and Mr. Edden for their Balance but no money
could they pay I have given them until Christmas next
to pay the money and if they do not I shall sue them
by March Court, Perry tells me he has no money but
will pay me the first money that comes to hand
I have offered your land for sale and I have made it
known to all my Acquaintances, and I have never
had an offer as yet - I have Informed Mr. Meade
that you wish him to forward his rent - ^{negro} The girl
Harriet Belonging to Elizabeth Lancaster is not as yet sold
they sell so low with us now that I fear you would not wish
to sell her at the prices now going - and for me to
tell you when I can send you any money its out of the
question for it appears to me that but few will pay
your house money unless forced - My Family is all well
except myself you will accept of compliments and best
wishes I believe by your prayers so I remain your
