Nova Williams and several members of the Literacy Adoption Committee presented *Benchmark Advance Reading* for consideration as core instructional material for literacy in reading and phonics in all K-5 schools. *Benchmark Advance Reading* is a comprehensive literacy program that contains both reading and phonics, as well as writing, although the district will not adopt the writing part as we already have a functional writing tool. *Benchmark Advance Reading* is intended to partially replace the current curriculum, *Mondo Bookshop Common Core* which is going out of print. However small group text and the phonics materials from Mondo will remain in use, as well as supplementals such as *Heggerty Phonemeic Awareness*. The entire K-5 teaching staff provided input for this decision. There was consensus that *Benchmark Advance Reading* provided a broader spectrum to the current curriculum including more options for struggling students.

Fred noted that the typical shelf life of a curriculum program is about ten years, give or take. Curriculum evolves as the world changes.

**Vote:** Kati McConn motioned to approve *Benchmark Advance Reading* as core instructional material for the the 2022-23 school year. Kimberly Griggs seconded the motion. There were no abstentions. The motion passed.

Julie Newcomer and several members of the Elementary Math Adoption Committee presented i-*Ready Classroom Mathematics* for consideration as core instructional material for math in all K-5 schools. Julie expressed appreciation for the amazing team of educational personnel who participated in the process, citing a common love of math and the goal of centering students. *i-Ready* is a data-driven, differentiated curriculum to support the diversity of learners at MISD. This mathematics curriculum combines research-based and proven resources to yield measurable gains in student learning. As they use *i-Ready*, teachers will determine if any supplemental materials are needed. The district will implement the curriculum as part of a two-year rollout:

- 2022-23: 3rd-5th Grade
- 2023-24: Kindergarten-2nd Grade

**Vote:** Joseph Gushanas motioned to approve *i-Ready Classroom Mathematics (K-5)* as core instructional material for all K-5 MISD elementary schools for the 2022-23 school year and beyond. Erica Ottesen seconded the motion. No abstentions. The motion passed.

#### Committee business and possible June meeting

Fred announced that Vanessa would email members to find out who wants to remain on the committee next year. He also asked for a show of hands to determine if members want to continue meeting via Zoom. This revealed a unanimous preference for Zoom. Several people suggested the possibility of meeting in person one time per year, over Zoom the rest.
