






EARLY COLLEGE ACADEMY PARTNERSHIP

In addition to the robust College Credit Plus (CCP)
Programming available at Hamilton High School, 50
juniors from Hamilton High School and Middletown High
School will participate in Miami University's Early College
Academy this fall. This innovative partnership allows
students to attend classes at Miami University's Regional
Campuses and receive dual credit for both high school
and college, allowing participating students to graduate
with an Associate in Arts degree and their high school
diploma.



FINE ARTS

The Hamilton City School District prides itself on a long-standing tradition of rich and diverse Fine Arts offerings. The district's talented students continue to showcase their excellence in the vocal, instrumental, visual, and performing arts and are great ambassadors for the district.



Hamilton students bring their skills to life by decorating the hallways and windows of our secondary buildings with murals. These impressive pieces showcase our students' skill set and create a warm and relevant learning environment for all students.





The district's Show Choir ensembles compete locally and nationally and are often ranked amongst the best programs in the area. Cocurricular groups include Prestige (formerly Rapsody in Blue), an advanced mixed choir, Vocal Elegance, an advanced women's choir, and CrescenDudes, the men's show choir.



Hamilton High School's Marching Band reigned supreme at this year's nationals bringing home a Superior Rating, and regularly travels, including a highlighted performance at Busch Gardens-Virginia.

ATHLETICS

Hamilton City Schools bleeds BLUE when it comes to athletics. Offering over 30 Division I High School Sports teams, "THE BIG BLUE" competes in the well-respected Greater Miami Conference (GMC), and our athletes boast an impressive record in and out of the classroom.

Each year, graduating seniors and juniors are invited to participate in one of two Job Fairs designed to connect them with post-graduation career opportunities and summer or part-time employment. From 1:1 computers for all students in PK-12 classrooms to the latest advances to help educators extend learning, Hamilton City Schools is committed to ensuring technology supports education and develops students to be competent and competitive in the 21st century.
