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Goal of Plan

Overview of Plan

The Continuity of Education Plan outlines the expectations and practices necessary to maintain fidelity with the mission and vision of the Upper Adams School District by providing necessary supports and innovative strategies to meet the individual needs all learners so they can maintain their trajectory to be college and career ready upon conclusion of their academic career at the Upper Adams School District.

Expectations for Teaching and Learning		
Feedback	 Provide timely feedback, as it is essential to student learning; this is especially so in online learning environments Provide clear communication regarding where/how students should ask questions and seek clarification Actively monitor your email for questions and communications from students/families 	
Offline Work	 Avoid requiring printing. All tasks must be completed on a device or uploaded as a picture Consider including offline activities in your lessons such as reading, engaging in discussions with a family member or friend remotely, writing in a journal, taking pictures and/or making a video 	

Instruction	 Strictly follow the guidelines for time and schedule provided by the district based on your grade level and subject area Consider how to use gradual release of responsibility to enhance learning for students Collaborate with your colleagues as appropriate
Deadlines	 Provide students ample time to complete assignments - more time than you would usually provide in class may be necessary for students Make sure that all directions for tasks are clear and detailed
Online Learning Environment	 Use district supported platforms such as Google Classroom, Zoom, online textbooks, Google Drive, etc. Provide both synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities as detailed by the district based on your grade level and subject area
Synchronous Learning	 Students have the opportunity to interact with one another and the teacher Could take place via Zoom, Google Meet or online written interactions such as Questions in Google Classroom All video synchronous learning opportunities should be recorded and posted for students who are unable to make the live session
Video Conferencing Guidelines	 Students should be seated at a table when possible Maintain class etiquette
Student Check- In & Assessment	 Assessments as necessary to ensure students have the appropriate number of learning experiences Use tools such as Google Forms, online textbook assessments, Google Classroom Tools etc.
Work Hours	All staff will be available to their students and parents via identified communication tools and digital platforms from 8:00-11:00 AM and 1:003:00 PM every day (5 hours). Additional time (2.5 hours) will be utilized by staff for planning, needed breaks, and other activities for continuity of education

Communication Tools and Strategies

The Upper Adams School District has identified the following communication tools & strategies for the Intermediate & Secondary levels (Grades 4–12):

- Students will have both online and off-line learning activities.
- The primary tools for communication between teachers and families will be Zoom, Google Classroom, ClassDoJo, student email addresses, and parent provided email addresses.

- The Upper Adams School District will be a consistent communication tool for teacher websites, District announcements, and general communication and expectations for all stakeholders.
- Teachers will provide synchronous learning that will be recorded and made available to students to watch at any time. The synchronous learning sessions will be at a regularly scheduled school time.

The Upper Adams School District has identified the following communication tools & strategies for the Primary Level (Grades K-3):

- Students may have both online and off-line learning activities.
- The primary tools for communication between teachers and families will be phone calls, email, Zoom, SeeSaw, Remind, ClassDojo, ClassTag, Google Classroom, or another form of communication.
- The Upper Adams School District will be a consistent communication tool for teacher websites, District announcements, and general communication and expectations for all stakeholders.
- Teachers may provide synchronous learning that can be recorded and made available to students to watch at any time. The synchronous learning sessions can be at a regularly scheduled time determined by the teacher.

Access (Devices, Platforms, Handouts)

The Upper Adams School District is a 1:1 school district at the Intermediate & Secondary Levels (Grades 4–12). Every student will be provided with a laptop and a charger.

The Upper Adams School District's Elementary Level (K–3) will be providing tablets and a charger to each student to assist with internet connectivity and provide accessibility to online content provided by teachers as needed.

The Upper Adams School District will provide hotspots for families with no connectivity for no charge. Additionally, connectivity will be available around the outside of the secondary campus for students/parents to drive up and connect from inside their vehicles.

For families with no ability to connect to the Internet, hard copies of content materials will be provided to the students. Options for parents to receive and return these materials include U. S. Mail, parent pick—up, distribution with student meals, and/or personal delivery/pick—up.

Staff General Expectations

The Upper Adams School District has identified the following staff expectations:

- Collaborate with other members of your department to design distance learning experiences for your students
- Use district curriculum and resources (ex. Google Classroom, Zoom, online textbooks, Newsela) to communicate and deliver content

- Make sure parents are aware which online resources your students will access. Include information on how to access the resources.
- Communicate with and provide timely feedback -Daily if possible
- Communicate with parents and students, as necessary
- Teacher availability will be from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Student Expectations

The Upper Adams School District has identified the following student expectations:

- Establish daily routines for engaging in the learning experiences
- Identify a space in your home where you can work effectively and successfully
- Identify a space in your home where you can participate in live online learning. Sit at a table with a wall behind you, if possible.
- Regularly monitor online platforms
- Engage in all learning with academic honesty
- Communicate proactively with your teachers if you cannot meet deadlines or require additional support
- Comply with School Internet Safety policies including expectations for online etiquette

The Upper Adams School District has identified the following time ranges for daily attendance at the Intermediate School Level (Grades 4-6):

English Language Arts: 25–30 Minutes

Mathematics: 25–30 Minutes Science: 25–30 Minutes

• Social Studies: 25–30 Minutes

Art/Music/Physical Education/Library: 25–30 Minutes

The Upper Adams School District has identified the following time ranges for daily attendance at the Elementary School Level (Grades K-3):

• English Language Arts: 40–45 Minutes

Mathematics: 20–25 Minutes
Science: 10–20 Minutes
Social Studies: 10–20 Minutes

• Art/Music/Physical Education/Library: 10–20 Minutes

Attendance can be accounted for both in synchronous and asynchronous student participation. Meaningful learning is assessed through the student completion and submission of assigned tasks/projects/written and/or online assignments, participation in online discussion boards/forums guided by the teacher, and collaborative assignments completed by a designated student groups as identified by the teacher.

Assessment will be determined in a tiered evaluation of Outstanding/Satisfactory/ Unsatisfactory for each student with input from their participation in assigned tasks/activities, daily engagement of content, and quality of feedback to the teacher.

Good Faith Efforts for Access and Equity for All Students

All of Upper Adams School District's teachers, including regular education, special education teachers and related service providers, have been developing activities and resources to share with students on a daily basis. These activities and resources, while not mandatory, have been developed with the intent of re-establishing connections and extending the learning that has occurred throughout this school year.
