School and Community

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Mission Statement

Mid-Pacific Institute - a preschool through high school college preparatory community founded on Christian values - nurtures and challenges students to develop intellectual, emotional, artistic, spiritual and physical strengths to become compassionate and responsible lifelong learners and global citizens.



Mid-Pacific Institute is an independent, co-educational, college preparatory school for Preschool, Kindergarten, and grades 1-12 with a total enrollment of 1401. There are 720 students in grades 9-12. The school's heritage dates back to the mission days of Hawai'i. In 1908, Kawaiaha`o Seminary and Mills School for Boys merged to create Mid-Pacific Institute. The school is directed by a Board of Trustees with an administrative team and teaching faculty of 113. The student-teacher ratio is 10-1, with an average class size of 17.

Mid-Pacific is located in urban Honolulu, on a 43 acre campus in beautiful Manoa. The diverse student body includes students from Hawai'i and the U.S. mainland as well as 70 international students from nine countries in Asia, Central America, Europe, and Oceania.

Mid-Pacific is one of Hawai'i's most dynamic and forward-thinking schools. The school is recognized for innovation, educational, technological, and artistic programs, including an English Language Development program for international students, and a cutting-edge Immersive Technology Program. Mid-Pacific offers 46 varsity teams in 21 different sports fielding over 100 teams. 70% of our students participate in at least one sport. Mid-Pacific participates in the Interscholastic League of Honolulu (ILH).

COVID-19 Update

Mid-Pacific moved to virtual learning in March 2020. The start of the 2020-2021 school year was on a synchronous, virtual schedule moving to a hybrid schedule in November for the remainder of the year. Mid-Pacific has offered in-person only learning since the 2021-2022 year. There has been no change in grading. Co-curricular activities and athletics were suspended or altered, depending on the activity, through May 2021.

International Baccalaureate Programme

Mid-Pacific offers over 32 courses following the framework of the IB curriculum as set by the International Baccalaureate Organization. As a two-year course of study, the IB Diploma allows students to explore subjects in-depth and inspires holistic and innovative work.

Mid-Pacific School of the Arts

The School of the Arts first welcomed students in 1991, fulfilling the school's long standing commitment to arts education. Mid-Pacific's pre-conservatory level programs offer intensive arts training in dance, hula, instrumental music, media, musical theatre, theatre, visual arts and voice. Students have the opportunity to immerse themselves in art - its technique, theory, history, and performance.

Mid-Pacific eXploratory Program (MPX)

The MPX Program is an innovative, interdisciplinary program for grades 9 and 10, featuring a project-based community-centered curriculum as the primary focus of student learning. This curriculum encourages learners to synthesize their knowledge of language arts, social studies, mathematics, science, technology and engineering through participation in a collaborative setting, addressing relevant changes.

International Baccalaureate/Advanced Placement Courses

There are currently 24 students in the Class of 2023 pursuing the Full IB Diploma. The Class of 2022 had a 79% pass rate with an IB Diploma average of 29.75. In 2022, 400 IB Examinations were written with 87% earning passing scores of 4, 5, 6, or 7. 168 AP Examinations were written. Advanced Placement will be discontinued in May 2023 and replaced with IB equivalents. Students have access to IB courses as juniors.
