

District Adopts 2009-2010 Budget

The Ferndale Area School Board adopted the 2009-2010 fiscal year budget on June 17, 2009. Real estate millage was set at 63 mills, which was an increase of 3.5 mills. After review, the Pennsylvania Department of Education approved the tax rate. The increase was less than the 2009-2010 index of 6.4% which was required by Act 1 participating districts.

New Medication Policy Changes for 2009-2010

The School Board approved changes to our medication policy at the June 17, 2009 Board Meeting to be in effect for the 2009-2010 school year. Research was done with school districts throughout the area. We were surprised to learn that most school districts in the area stopped giving over the counter medications to students several years ago.

Some changes to the new medication policy are there will no longer be over the counter medications available for students use during the school day. Parents can supply their child with the medication to be taken at school if absolutely necessary with their written consent and a physician order. A physician order is necessary because the school nurse works under a license by the state of Pennsylvania which requires her to have a physician order for any medication that she dispenses. Parents can also come into school and give their child over the counter medication if necessary.

A policy for medication administration while on field trips was also approved. If a student is to take medication during the field trip, there must be a licensed nurse on the field trip to administer the medication. The parent will have to provide the exact dose to be given in a properly labeled container. The parent will also have the option of going on the field trip to administer the medication to their child if they so choose. If the student has an inhaler, written consent will need to be provided by the prescribing physician and the parent, stating the competence of the student's ability for the self-administration of the inhaler.

Peer Tutoring

It's kids helping kids, and it works! Peer tutoring is an educational approach that joins students from grades K-5 with older students from Grade 6 at the elementary school. Peer tutoring is a leadership-training program while serving a dual role of academic support. Older students assume the role of tutor to develop academic skills and confidence in reading, math facts, spelling and study reviews in a fun manner. Peer tutors are assigned to the tutoring room or individual classroom. Peer tutor referrals are made by teachers, family support team or parent request. Peer tutors take on the role of helper as well as leader. Eileen Zankey, program coordinator, describes the program as a successful example of how teamwork and empathy are needed to make things happen. "Our elementary teachers that receive peer tutors go the extra mile to diligently provide the extra academic work peer tutors utilize to work with the younger students on a daily basis. The six grade teachers graciously share and support the flexibility of time needed for their sixth grade students to spend time with our younger students each morning before classes begin," reports Mrs. Zankey. After a leadership orientation conducted by Mrs. Zankey each fall, peer tutors are assigned to classrooms. The sixth grade tutors offer their special talents throughout the entire school year. Grade 2 teacher, Pat Balagusz, has utilized peer tutors since the program started five years ago. "The students loved having them each morning. They made the schoolwork fun. The tutors taught each student different strategies for the skills needed to complete the work assigned and made that student feel successful," says Miss Balagusz. A parent shared the positive story that while eating supper and talking about the Fernstock celebration and awards ceremony their young daughter gleamed, "I think I'd like to be a peer tutor someday!" Children modeling leadership with acts of kindness is a powerful life lesson for all.



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Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Program

This year the elementary school was awarded approximately \$34,000 to introduce a new program in 2009-2010. The Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Program is designed to provide all children at the elementary with a wide variety of fruits and vegetables throughout the school day. The program will give our students the opportunity to experience fruits and vegetables outside of their normal breakfast and lunch times. It is a creative and effective way to encourage healthy snack options. The goal of this program will be to:

- Expand the variety of fruits and vegetables children experience
- Increase children's fruit and vegetable consumption
- Make a difference in children's diets to impact their present and future health

Junior High

• The girls' junior high volleyball team completed an excellent season with a record of 13-4. They placed 2nd in the North Star Tournament. The girls were coached by Theresa Kessler and Christine Eash.

Varsity

- The girls' varsity volleyball team led by veteran coaches Kim Reighard and Kelli Mostoller completed a successful season with a record of 13 wins and 7 losses. They qualified for the District 6 playoffs for the 16th straight season. The girls advanced through round one defeating Purchase Line and lost a highly contested match to Bishop Guilfoyle in the second round of the District playoffs. The squad received the Officials' Sportsmanship Award for the fifth time in the last eight years.
- The girls' varsity basketball team finished a stellar season with a mark of 20 wins and 7 losses. During the regular season, they won the title game at the Ligonier tournament. They qualified for the District 6 tournament and finished 3rd advancing into the State playoffs. They beat highly regarded Mt. Alvernia and lost to Tussey Mountain in overtime in their second State playoff game. During the regular season, junior **Brittney Eisenhuth** surpassed the 1,000 point barrier. She was named to the Associated Press All-State Team after the playoffs. Seniors **April Eisenhuth** and **Jamie Rosequist** were selected to play in the AmeriServ All-Star Hoops game. Eugene Slebodnick and Lori Dodson coached the successful cagers.
- Baseball is a spring sport, and despite a soggy season weather-wise, this was a
 successful year for the varsity baseball team. Coaches Steve Clawson and Ron Wilson
 led the squad to a 10-8 record. The boys qualified for District playoffs. They lost to
 Homer Center in the semi-finals after defeating Northern Cambria in the previous
 game. The junior varsity team was coached by Adam Hale and James Rubal.
