Ferndale Area Proud!

Ferndale Area School District has a lot to be proud of in the area of student achievement. This year, the district received three very special awards! First, both buildings were again honored by the Pennsylvania Department of Education through the Keystone Achievement Award.

The Keystone Achievement Award is given to a public school that has achieved adequate yearly progress for two consecutive years. This year's award is for meeting AYP standards in the 2005-06 and 2006-07 school years. AYP is determined in part by a school's performance on the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment; the standardized test given annually to students in grades 3, 8 and 11.

This is the school's fourth Keystone Achievement Award. Education Secretary Gerald L. Zahorchak said the award is a testament to the tremendous efforts of the students, teachers, and staff at Ferndale Area School District. "We have set high academic expectations in Pennsylvania, and the students of Ferndale Area School District have responded in an impressive way," he said.

Each school that earns a Keystone Achievement Award receives a large, keystone-shaped placard that can be displayed at the school. "If there is one award that a school should proudly show off to visitors, it is the Keystone Achievement Award," Secretary Zahorchak said. "It is proof to all who



visit the school that they are at an institution that cares about ensuring that every child succeeds."

In the December 10, 2007 issue of US News and World Report the Ferndale Area Junior/Senior High School was recognized as one of "America's Best High Schools." More than 18,000 high schools in 40 states were analyzed by School Evaluation Services to determine how each school performed on state tests (2006 results), including how well the school's disadvantaged students did. The analysis also looked at each school's success in providing college-level coursework.

The 100 schools that did the best earned gold medals. 405 schools earned silver medals. Ferndale Area High School was one of 1,086 nationally that earned a BRONZE MEDAL!

Ferndale Area's third honor came in the May 9, 2008 edition of the Pittsburgh Business

Times' Guide to PA Schools. Using three years of PSSA test scores, the guide ranks every district in the state. One category of ranking is called the "Overachiever Rank." This category also takes into consideration the percentage of students who are considered to be economically disadvantaged based on those qualifying for free and reduced lunches. If a district ranked higher on the overall rank than should have been expected based on economics, they are reflected in this category. Of 498 districts reported, Ferndale Area School District ranked 3rd! Go Ferndale Area!

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

The Ferndale Area School District Board of Directors meets on the third Wednesday of each month in the Elementary School Board Room at 6:00 p.m. except for the months of May, June, November, and December. A meeting is not scheduled for the month of July.

District Adopts 2008-09 Budget

The Ferndale Area School Board adopted the 2008-09 fiscal year budget on June 11, 2008. Real estate millage was set at 59.5 mills, which was an increase of 3.75 mills. After review, the Pennsylvania Department of Education approved the tax rate. The increase was less than the 2008-09 index of 6.8% which was required by Act 1 participating districts.

It is the policy of the Ferndale Area School District that all buildings, property (including sidewalks and parking areas), outdoor fixed seating areas, vehicles owned or contracted and other designated areas of the Ferndale Area School District are designated to be tobacco free environments.

Federal and State Grant Programs

The Ferndale Area School District participates in several state and federally funded grant programs to enhance our educational programs.

Consistent with most other school entities in Pennsylvania, federal monies generally represent the smallest portion of revenue for the Ferndale Area School District. In order to be eligible for grant funds, the district must complete the various applications each year and adhere to numerous mandates imposed with the grants. Historically, the amount of revenue has fluctuated over the years. A review of our federal and state entitlement grant programs follows. The projected amounts for the 2008-09 school year are dependent upon passage of the governor's budget.

Title I monies in the amount of \$220,629, a decrease of \$3,743 for the 2008-09 project year, are used to improve the educational environment of the entire elementary school. The schoolwide Title I program uses the money to support the salaries and benefits of a Reading Specialist and a Federal Programs Coordinator. Title I funds are also used for instructional supplies, pupil personnel services, staff, and community support services.

Title IIA, also known as Improving Teacher Quality, is the classroom size reduction initiative. The projected grant amount of \$45,847 (increase of \$909) pays the salary and benefits of one teacher. It also funds professional development for district administrators, teachers and paraprofessionals.

Title V, Innovative Education, has been eliminated by the Pennsylvania Department of Education for the 2008-09 school year.

Project 720 time eligibility for the Ferndale Area School District has expired for the 2008-2009 school year.

The Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities grant is projected to decrease 15% to 20% from last year's allocation of \$4,510. This money is used primarily for the Student Assistance Program and education.

This is the fifth year of the Accountability Block Grant in the amount of \$144,499. The funds are used for salaries and benefits of two teachers and two paraprofessionals in the four-year-old kindergarten program. It also funds the after school tutoring program at the elementary school, as well as instructional supplies, staff support and community services.

Classrooms for the Future

Classrooms for the Future is about enabling teachers to use technology as an effective tool for educating students so they can become competitive workers in the global marketplace. CFF's goal is to create a learning environment that includes project-based learning, differentiated instruction, and hands-on technology that will not only engage students actively but also increase their understanding on a higher level than a traditional teaching style.

Technology integration into the curriculum is a priority. The challenge is to find ways to use technology by both the teachers and students without taking time away from the core subjects. Teachers who are unfamiliar with the technology must first find the time to learn to use the tools and terminology. They must be willing to allow students to develop and share their technology expertise with other students and themselves. This year, **Ferndale Area High School** received over **\$99,000** of equipment to be placed in the senior high English, math, science and social studies classrooms. This equipment includes four mobile carts with 25 student laptops in each cart, eight teacher laptops, eight Promethean white boards, seven projectors, a digital camera and a video camera.

The Classrooms for the Future grant brings technology to the forefront of the curriculum while maintaining core content and improving student and teacher skills in today's technology environment. The grant will help transform the way high school teachers teach and how students learn. Teachers will work on becoming facilitators and guides while students become collaborative learners.

Money was also provided to have a Classroom Coach help train teachers and school leaders on how to best use the new technology to increase student achievement and prepare them for college and the high-tech global market. The Classroom Coach is Mrs. Soohy.

The district has applied for the grant again next year and, if funded, more classroom equipment will be added to the Classrooms for the Future program at Ferndale Area.

The teachers included in the 2007-2008 grant are **Mr. Endler, Mr. Jones, Ms. Antal, Mr. Wilson, Ms. Williams, Ms. Shrift, Mr. Clawson, and Ms. Szymusiak**. Each teacher involved in the program is also required to take two courses over the next two years which include one on Century 21 Skills and one

about using technology within their subject area. The CFF teachers are learning how to use some specific technology each year within their courses. They collaborate with the coach on technology that is already in place and how more can be added to engage students even further in their content area. Web-based programs are also being introduced to certain classes to give students the opportunity to use new Web2.0 tools.

One teacher from the district was also selected to become a **Keystone Technology Integrator**. **Ms. Jessica Szymusiak** was chosen to represent Ferndale Area High School as that person for the upcoming year. She was required to send in a portfolio exhibiting some of her technology-based lessons, and she submitted an essay about her views on technology and its impact on her curriculum. Ms. Szymusiak will be asked to participate in workshops over the summer at Bucknell University and next year to model some of her ideas for other teachers in the program.

In conjunction with this grant, Mrs. Soohy "hired" four students to work with her as the Hive Tech Team. They have helped prepare handouts, compiled research, presented at In-Service, completed inventory, labeled equipment and learned new programs. These students were **Jamie Sipes, Samantha Way, Cody Naylor and Kaylee Tomak**. Their "pay" for this job was earning some community service hours for their senior project requirements.

David Warlick, an expert on 21st Century Learning, is quoted as saying, "We live in a brand new, and dynamically rich information environment, and if we are going to reach our students in a way that is relevant to their world and their future (and ours), then we must teach them from this new information environment" (www.landmark-project.com). Ferndale Area's participation in this grant will allow our teachers to become more technology literate and will give our students an advantage in future educational settings or in the global marketplace.
