Dear DCS Parents, Staff, and Students,

We went to school 5 days in a row last week and are planning to finish this week strong!!!

DCS values our role as a community school district and works to partner with our parents on behalf of our students. Over the past couple of weeks, we've hosted incoming kindergarten information sessions, a science of reading community session, and the second community conversation session about the "What is school for?" where we are discussing the landscape of schools and what we need to provide for our Dexter students.

Host Families Needed for 2023-2024 Every year, DHS and the Dexter community hosts students from around the world to learn alongside our students and form lifelong friendships. My own family hosted an international student several years ago and it was a tremendous experience. As part of the DHS international program, we work with various exchange support services to facilitate the exchange while supporting students and families. One of the organizations we've worked with for many years is Educatius. Educatius is seeking local families to serve as host families for international students who will be studying at Dexter High School for the 2023-24 school year. Educatius currently has 8 students at DHS this year. Educatius provides host families a monthly stipend to offset the cost of hosting along with local and national support. They also offer a financial bonus if you refer a family who ends up hosting.
