Winter Park Elementary School will:

- Host an annual meeting to:

- Develop, share, and sign a School/Student/Parent Compact that outlines shared responsibilities for student achievement.
- Send take-home educational materials related to all curriculums being used at school, including Eureka, Reading & Writing Fundamentals, Foundations, and Studies Weekly.
- Provide meaningful two-way communication with families (examples: phone calls, conferences, Remind messages, ClassDojo, weekly principal updates, monthly family newsletters, classroom newsletters)
- Provide materials in language parents can understand, to the extent practicable.
- Survey families periodically to receive feedback regarding the development of family engagement activities and areas for improvement.
- Dedicate a minimum of 1% of Title 1 funds for family engagement activities.
- Partner with local businesses and organizations, including Winter Park Baptist Church, Wesley United Methodist Church, NourishNC, to create meaningful opportunities for our students.
- Parents must sign in at all school meetings and events. Sign-in sheets are recorded with dates and times, and kept on file for audits. Additionally, minutes are kept from all meetings.
