The Scrutinies


Starting on the Third Sunday of Lent against temptation, and to give him we will celebrate the Scrutinies from the R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). There are three scrutinies celebrated: third, fourth and fifth weeks of Lent at the 10 am Mass.

The scrutinies, reinforced by an exorcism, are rites of self-searching and repentance and have, above all, a spiritual purpose. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the heart of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. Also to protect him strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life.

In order to let go of the past and move into the future, the three scrutinies provide a spiritual process to allow the elect to fully grasp (in order to become purified and enlightened) what it is God is doing in his life and what he is being called to do as a disciple.

These rites complete the conversion of the elect and deepen his resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out his decision to love God above all.

God of power, you sent your Son to be our Savior. Grant that this catechumen, who, like the woman of Samaria, thirst for living water, may turn to the Lord as he hears his word and acknowledge the sins and weaknesses that weigh him down. Protect him from vain reliance on self and defend him from the power of Satan. Free him from the spirit of deceit, so that, admitting the wrong he has done, he may attain purity of heart and advance on the way to salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



NORMAS PARA EL AYUNO Y LA ABSTINENCIA

El miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo, 7 de abril, son días de abstinencia y de ayuno. Asimismo, los viernes durante la Cuaresma son días de abstinencia. los viernes durante la Cuaresma todas las personas a partir de los 18 años y los que no hayan cumplido los 59 años, deben ayunar. Se permite comer una vez durante el día de ayuno, aunque también pueden comer dos veces para mantener la energía, según la necesidad de cada individuo. Sin embargo, estas dos comidas no deben igualar a la cantidad de una comida completa. No se puede comer entre comidas, pero está permitido tomar líquido, incluvendo leche v jugos. La abstinencia se debe cumplir desde los 14 años en adelante. En los días de abstinencia, no se debe comer carne, aunque si la salud o la habilidad para cumplir su trabajo se ve seriamente afectado, la ley no lo obliga. Si tiene alguna duda sobre la práctica del avuno o de la abstinencia, consulte al Sacerdote de su parroquia. El ayuno, la

limosna y la oración, son las tres disciplinas tradicionales durante la Cuaresma. Los feligreses y los catecúmenos deben realizar estas prácticas con seriedad en espíritu de penitencia y en preparación para la Iniciación a la Iglesia o para la renovación de las promesas Bautismales durante la Semana Santa.

Sunday, March 19, is the next event at the American Legion Hall, 330 Center St, N in Vienna. It's a wonderful buffet served from 8 am to noon, featuring your favorite dishes, along with a glass of the bubbly for adults who pay \$12, kids under 12 only \$5.

FALL PREVENTION (concluded) In general, there are four things you can do to prevent falls. The first is to begin a regular exercise program. Exercise is one of the most important ways to lower your chances of a tumble. It makes you stronger and helps you feel better. Exercises that improve balance and coordination (like Tai Chi) are the most helpful. Lack of exercise leads to weakness and increases your chances of falling. Ask your doctor about the best type of exercise program for you. There are many choices at the Vienna Community Center.

The second thing you can do is to have your health care provider **review your medicines**. Your doctor or pharmacist can survey all that you take, even over-the-counter medicines. As we get older, the way medications work in our bodies can change. Some medicines, or combinations of medicines, can make you sleepy or dizzy and can cause you to fall.

Thirdly, **have your vision checked**. Have your eyes examined by an ophthalmologist at least once a year. You may be wearing the wrong glasses or have a condition like glaucoma or cataracts that limits your vision. Poor vision can increase your chances of falling.

Lastly, **make your home safer**. About half of all falls happen there. To make your home safer, remove things you can trip over like papers, books, clothes, and shoes from stairs and places where you walk. Make a habit of putting such things in their proper place. Remove small throw rugs or use double-sided tape to keep the rugs from slipping. Keep items you use often in cabinets you can reach easily without having to use a step stool. Arrange to have grab bars put in next to your commode and in the tub or shower. Use non-slip mats in the bath tub and on shower floor. Often these have a grainy surface to avoid slipping, but it's not enough to prevent a nasty fall.

Improve the lighting in your home. As we age, we need brighter lights to see well. Hang light-weight curtains or shades. You'll be surprised what a difference that can make. If you have stairs in your home, be sure there are handrails (on both sides) and lighting put in on all staircases. And, wear shoes both inside and outside the house. I've noticed some of my friends take their shoes off when entering their apartments. Actually, it was a custom, when we lived in Japan, to remove our shoes whenever entering a home, whether it was ours or someone else's. We'd put on special slippers. Putting tradition aside, the best advice is to avoid going barefoot or wearing slippers

As you can see, there are many things you can do to protect yourself from falls, many of them a simple fix. The information I've provided in this series has come from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

SCAM ALERTS

Two popular scams to be aware of since tax season is upon us and with that refund comes home improvements.

IRS scams: The scammers are becoming more and more crafty. IRS impersonators have been around for a while, so they are switching up their game by contacting you about a tax rebate or refund payment plan. Here are a few things to remember:

- The IRS will not call, email or text to contact you first. They always start by sending a letter. Confirm by calling the IRS directly 800.829.1040
- Never click on links in unexpected texts or emails or use the phone number from a voice mail you receive (that goes for any scam). Do your own research on the correct contact information. In another browser, search the company's website to obtain the correct information.
- If you want to find the status of any pending refund, go to the IRS website.

Door to Door soliciting: Fairfax County requires a solicitors license for someone to solicit service at your door (there are very few exceptions). If someone comes to your door here are a few tips to remember and ask:

- They can only solicit between the hours of 9am to 8pm.
- If you have a "No peddler or Solicitor" sign posted, they may not solicit, even if they have a license.
- They must show the license upon request and leave the premise immediately if asked to leave. Do you know what a valid Fairfax County solicitor's license looks like? Visit <u>fairfaxcounty.gov/cableconsumer/csd/</u> <u>door-to-door-solicitors</u>
- Research the company, ensure they are licensed & bonded, and ask for referrals.
- Always get a detailed contract as to what exactly you want done and do not pay them all at once. Ideally, never pay in cash and always get a receipt for payment.
