

Superintendent's Message

Happy 2023 Fairless Community!

We are in the home stretch of finishing the construction of the NEW Fairless High School for a May 2023 completion date. As this issue of *Focus on Fairless* is being prepared for publication, the auditorium entrance is the last area to be enclosed, and the entire building will then be sealed up. The boilers have been operating and providing heat into most areas of the building, allowing the contractors to install casework and cabinetry in classrooms and offices and floor tile in restrooms and classrooms. The ceiling grid is up in many areas, allowing installation of light fixtures, heating vents, speakers, sprinklers heads and tile. Bathroom fixtures have also been delivered and are being installed. Flooring materials are arriving soon for the main gymnasium, and the elevator installation will begin the week of January 30.

We are in the process of planning the details of moving teacher materials into their classrooms, dedication ceremony and building tours. This information will be communicated when we have firm dates and times. I hope you enjoy the pictures of the building showing the ongoing progress.

At the November 15, 2022 meeting of the Fairless Local Board of Education, Dr. Jody Seward was presented with the Ohio School Boards Association's Veteran Board Member Award by Reno Contipelli, Northeast Regional Manager of the Ohio School Board Association.

The Veteran Board Member Award is given to school board members in recognition of 25 years of service. Of the more than 3,500 board members in Ohio, only 28 received the honor in 2022.

Dr. Seward has selflessly served as a board member since 1997. Some attributes that Dr. Seward possesses as a board member are; conviction that public education is important, the ability to make decisions, having respect for district employees, devotion of time and energy to serve, a broad focus on student concerns, and focusing on student achievement.





Chris Belloni Wall of Excellence Coming to FHS

The Fairless Alumni Association and the Belloni Family have partnered to create the Chris Belloni Wall of Excellence which will be donated to the school district and placed in the new Fairless High School. The Wall of Excellence will be a 65-inch interactive digital kiosk, which will represent several of Chris' passions - technology, service to others, history, and community. The kiosk was made possible through the generosity of over 100 donors who raised over \$22,000 for the project.

This kiosk will display historical and current pictures, text and video information of Hall of Honor members, yearbooks, athletic awards and academic honors. The kiosk has the ability to be expanded for additional areas of recognition. The kiosk will be located inside the main entrance of the school, and will be accessible to everyone that visits. Additionally, features will allow global searches of people and events through the internet.

Our Playhouse cast and crew had a phenomenal fall musical performance, and this spring will be presenting *Midsummer Night's Dream* March 3 & 4.






Homecoming 2023
