Superintendent's Message

Dear Community,

I want to extend "Happy New Year" greetings to everyone as we begin a new decade. This academic year is moving along nicely, and very quickly, as we are in our second semester. I hope you enjoy reading about the many exciting events and successes in this edition of Focus on Fairless. I would like to share some things that are happening in the district.

We are implementing a new visitor check-in system in all Fairless school buildings. The system is called School Safe ID, it will be easy to use and will enhance the safety of our students, faculty and staff. School Safe ID will require **all visitors** to present a valid state-issued ID. The system will compare the visitor's name and date of birth to the national database of registered sex offenders. School Safe ID will be managed through a kiosk in the front entrance of each building. Visitors must scan their valid state-issued ID, and once approved, the visitor will be issued a badge that identifies his or her name, and purpose for visiting the school. The system will only record the visitor's name and date of birth. No additional data from the license will be entered into the system. If a visitor isn't able to present a valid state-issued ID, he or she will not be permitted to enter the school without an escort.

Recently, Fairless collaborated with several other Stark County districts, and received grant dollars to purchase new school buses. The grant dollars will cover 50% of the cost for us to purchase two buses, a 72 passenger and 64 passenger handicap. This will save the district \$90,000. The district has been able to purchase 15 new buses since 2015 with grant dollars, covering over half of this cost. Our bus fleet is now up-to-date and reliable.

We are excited to share the decision to construct a new high school. We are partnering with Ohio Facility Construction Commission (OFCC) on this project. Our master plan for a new high school was approved in August 2019 by the OFCC and locked in the local/state funding percentages. The State of Ohio will provide 71% of the funding, and the district will provide the remaining 29%. In order to receive the state funding, we need to follow a design manual in the planning process. The district's portion to construct the new high school will be funded by the new revenue from the Rover Pipeline. **No additional levy or taxes will be needed to construct the new high school.** A "visioning" session was held in December with staff, parents, and students, to discuss needs, priorities and future trends in learning, that will be incorporated in the planning and designing of the new high school. The planning and designing will continue over the next several months with the hope to break ground sometime in 2021.

High School News

Associate of Arts Degree



The Fairless Local School district has partnered with Stark State College and Kent State University at Stark to offer an Associate of Arts degree at Fairless High School. The degree will expand the College Credit Plus offerings on-campus at the high school, to over 75 credit hours for students to choose from, through a blend of face-to-face courses taught by credentialed Fairless faculty and Kent State University adjunct professors, with online courses taught by Stark State adjunct professors.

This associate's degree is the culmination of years of collaboration between Fairless, Stark State College, and Kent State University going back to 2008 when Fairless was a strong early adopter of the Dual Enrollment Program. At that point twenty-seven credit hours were offered at the high school - substantially opening the door of academic opportunity for Fairless students.

College Credit Plus, historically known as Post-Secondary Enrollment and Dual Enrollment, has posed significant challenges for schools, such as controlling college tuition and textbook costs, maintaining credentialed faculty to teach college courses, and competing with the universities to keep students on campus at the high school. At its peak, Fairless Local was spending in excess of \$135,000 annually in tuition and textbooks for College Credit Plus students. By collaborating with the colleges to create agreements for lower tuition and controlling how long textbooks remain in use, Fairless has been able to substantially lower costs while expanding opportunities for the students. For Fairless, these agreements have saved the district over \$80,000 annually in costs, even with more students earning college credit, and doubling the amount of courses offered.

By offering an Associate of Arts degree at Fairless High School, students will have the opportunity to pursue an excellent foundation for degrees in

communication, education, business, social and behavioral sciences, and the arts. Most students will use the associate degree path to continue their studies in a bachelor degree program. Stark State College has developed over thirty transfer partnerships with other colleges and universities, such as Kent State University, The University of Akron, and The Ohio State University which allows students to move smoothly and affordably from the associate

degree to a baccalaureate program. Studies show that community college students, who transfer to selective four-year schools, are the most likely to graduate. Fairless District officials hope the addition of the Associate of Arts degree will afford more students graduating with college, skilled trade, and/or life experiences, and be more prepared to be productive, responsible adults ready to compete in a global and technological rich society.

Who Is Eligible?

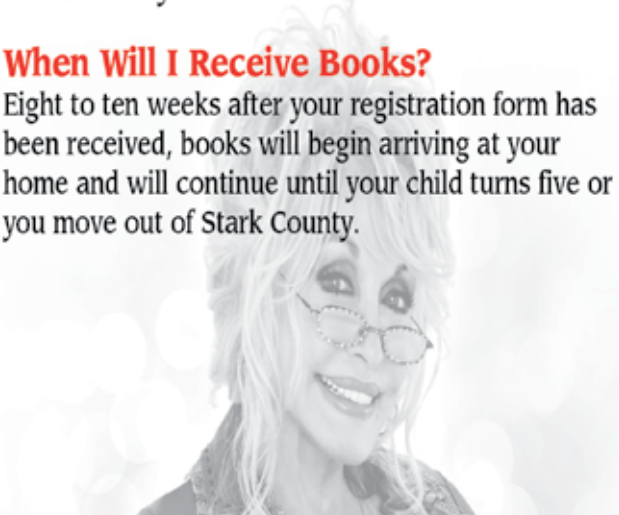
Preschool children ages birth to five who are residents of Stark County.
