Agenda Item Title: Consider Approval of 45 Day Budget Revision

Background:

The Bellevue Union School District's 2020/21 Budget for Adoption, approved by the Board of Trustees on June 30th, 2020, outlined substantial unknown programmatic and financial variables at the time of submission which hindered the District's ability to provide a clear and complete budget outlook at the time of submission. The Budget for adoption therefore stipulated that a subsequent budget revision would be submitted for Board review and approval per education Code Section 42127(h) within 45 days of the Governor's official budget adoption, which subsequently took place on June 29, 2020. Key changes associated with the revise of the District's budget include the following:

- Updated Enrollment and Attendance projections.
- Updated Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Revenue which reflects a Zero Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for the following 3 fiscal years.
- Adoption of ADA "Hold Harmless" in FY 2020/21
- Updated Property Tax Revenue projections.
- Inclusion of scheduled cash apportionment deferrals across fiscal years and the impact on the District's cash flow.
- Inclusion of one time funding from the Learning Loss Mitigation Fund (LLMF) to support the District's transition to distance learning and operating under COVID.
- Restoration of Categorical Program funding.
- Updates to Staffing budgets to include finalized personnel actions that took place over the summer to support the District's Distance Academy and support of our EL population.
- Adjustment to the District's budget for COVID operations earmarked under the General Fund (initially at 20% of total operating expenditures).
- An updated multi year projection integrating the above stated variables and its impact on unrestricted reserves.
- An updated Criteria and Standards report, explaining in detail the impact of the revisions as it relates to key financial performance metrics.

Recommended Action:

The District Office has been in communication with the County Office of Education and expects a conditional approval of the FY 2020/21 budget by the Sonoma County Office of Education, pending these budget revisions.

In terms of timing, this 45 day Budget Revision provides an outline of the key budgetary revisions to be updated in the District's financial system and reported via the Standard Accounting Control system. The official budget revision is thereafter due to the Sonoma County Office of Education by September 30, 2020, in advance of the District's 1st Interim report, and to be submitted in conjunction with the District's official Unaudited Actuals report for FY 2019/20.

Given the above, the District recommends that the Board approve the Budget 45 Day Revision as presented.

Background:

The Education Protection Account (EPA) provides local educational agencies (LEAs) with general purpose state aid funding pursuant to Section 36 of Article XIII of the California Constitution. The EPA funding is a component of an LEA's total LCFF entitlement as calculated in the Principal Apportionment.

Pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution, school districts, county offices of education, and community college districts are required to determine how the funding received from the Education Projection Account (EPA) are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction.

In FY19/20, \$620,162 was budgeted in total EPA Funding that was encumbered for Instructional Teacher Salaries.

RESOLUTION REGARDING THE EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT
RESOLUTION NO. 3

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 30 on November 6, 2012;

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012;

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36 (f);

WHEREAS, the District shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year;

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year;

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools and community college districts;

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor or any agency of state government;

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board;

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost;

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent;

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify

whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution;

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. The monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36 and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the governing board of Bellevue Union School District;
2. In compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the governing board of the Bellevue Union School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.

The Consolidated Application is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs to school districts throughout California. Annually, each local educational agency (LEA) submits the spring release of the application to document participation in these programs and to provide assurances that the district will comply with the legal requirements of each program. Program entitlements are determined by formulas contained in the laws that created the programs.

Out of each state and federal program entitlement, districts allocate funds for indirect costs of administration, for programs operated by the district office, and for programs operated at schools.

The following programs were included in the 2020 Spring Certification of Consolidated Application for Funding Categorical Aid Programs: Title 1, Title II, Title III LEP, Title III Immigrant Students, and Title IV Part A.

Background:

The Political Reform Act requires every agency to review its conflict of interest code biennially and to notify the code reviewing body if their current code is accurate, or alternatively, that their code must be amended.

The District must complete a Biennial Review regardless of how recently the designated filer's exhibits have been approved by the Code Reviewing Body. An Agency's amended code is not effective until it has been approved by the Sonoma County Code Reviewing Body through eDisclosure.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act, Government Code [87300-87313](#), requires each public agency in California to adopt a conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Bellevue Union School District has previously adopted a local conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, past and future amendments to the Political Reform Act and implementing regulations may require conforming amendments to be made to the district's conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, a regulation adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, 2 CCR [18730](#), provides that incorporation by reference of the terms of that regulation, along with an agency-specific appendix designating positions and disclosure categories shall constitute the adoption and amendment of a conflict of interest code in conformance with Government Code [87300](#) and [87306](#); and

WHEREAS, the Bellevue Union School District has recently reviewed its positions, and the duties of each position, and has determined that (changes/no changes) to the current conflict of interest code are necessary; and

WHEREAS, any earlier resolutions, bylaws, and/or appendices containing the district's conflict of interest code shall be rescinded and superseded by this resolution and Appendix; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Bellevue Union School District Governing Board adopts the following Conflict of Interest Code including its Appendix of Designated Employees and Disclosure Categories.

The provisions of 2 CCR [18730](#) and any amendments to it adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, together with the attached Appendix specifying designated positions and

disclosure categories, are incorporated by reference and shall constitute the district's conflict of interest code.

Governing Board members and designated employees shall file a Statement of Economic Interest/Form 700 in accordance with the disclosure categories listed in the attached Appendix. The Statement of Economic Interest shall be filed with the district's filing officer and/or, if so required, with the district's code reviewing body. The district's filing officer shall make the statements available for public review and inspection.

APPENDIX

Disclosure Categories

1. Category 1: A person designated Category 1 shall disclose:
 - a. Interests in real property located entirely or partly within district boundaries, or within two miles of district boundaries, or of any land owned or used by the district.
 - b. Investments or business positions in or income from sources which are engaged in the acquisition or disposal of real property within the district, are contractors or subcontractors which are or have been within the past two years engaged in work or services of the type used by the district, or manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery, or equipment of the type used by the district.
2. Category 2: A person designated Category 2 shall disclose:
 - a. Investments or business positions in or income from sources which are contractors or subcontractors engaged in work or services of the type used by the department which the designated person manages or directs.
 - b. Investments or business positions in or income from sources which manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery, or equipment of the type used by the department which the designated person manages or directs. For the purposes of this category, a principal's department is his/her entire school.
3. Full Disclosure: Because it has been determined that the district's Board members and/or Superintendent "manage public investments," they and other persons designated for "full disclosure" shall disclose, in accordance with Government Code [87200](#):
 - a. Interests in real property located entirely or partly within district boundaries, or within two miles of district boundaries, or of any land owned or used by the district.
 - b. Investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments.

Disclosures for Consultants

Consultants are designated employees who must disclose financial interests as determined on a case-by-case basis by the Superintendent or designee. The Superintendent or designee's written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements based upon that description. All such determinations are public records and shall be retained for public inspection along with this conflict of interest code.

A consultant is an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the district, makes a governmental decision whether to: (2 CCR [18700.3](#))

1. Approve a rate, rule, or regulation
2. Adopt or enforce a law
3. Issue, deny, suspend, or revoke any permit, license, application, certificate, approval, order, or similar authorization or entitlement
4. Authorize the district to enter into, modify, or renew a contract that requires district approval
5. Grant district approval to a contract that requires district approval and in which the district is a party, or to the specifications for such a contract
6. Grant district approval to a plan, design, report, study, or similar item
7. Adopt or grant district approval of district policies, standards, or guidelines

A consultant is also an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the district, serves in a staff capacity with the district and in that capacity participates in making a governmental decision as defined in 2 CCR [18704](#), subsections (a) and (b), or performs the same or substantially all the

same duties for the district that would otherwise be performed by an individual holding a position specified in the district's conflict of interest code. (2 CCR [18700.3](#))

The team is incredible and deserves big kudos. He thanked Trustee Reyes for calling him out and reminding him to also take a break. Dr. Alexander said he’d take his break after school gets going. He thanked the principals a 1,000 times for giving up their summer vacation. “We couldn’t do it without you.”

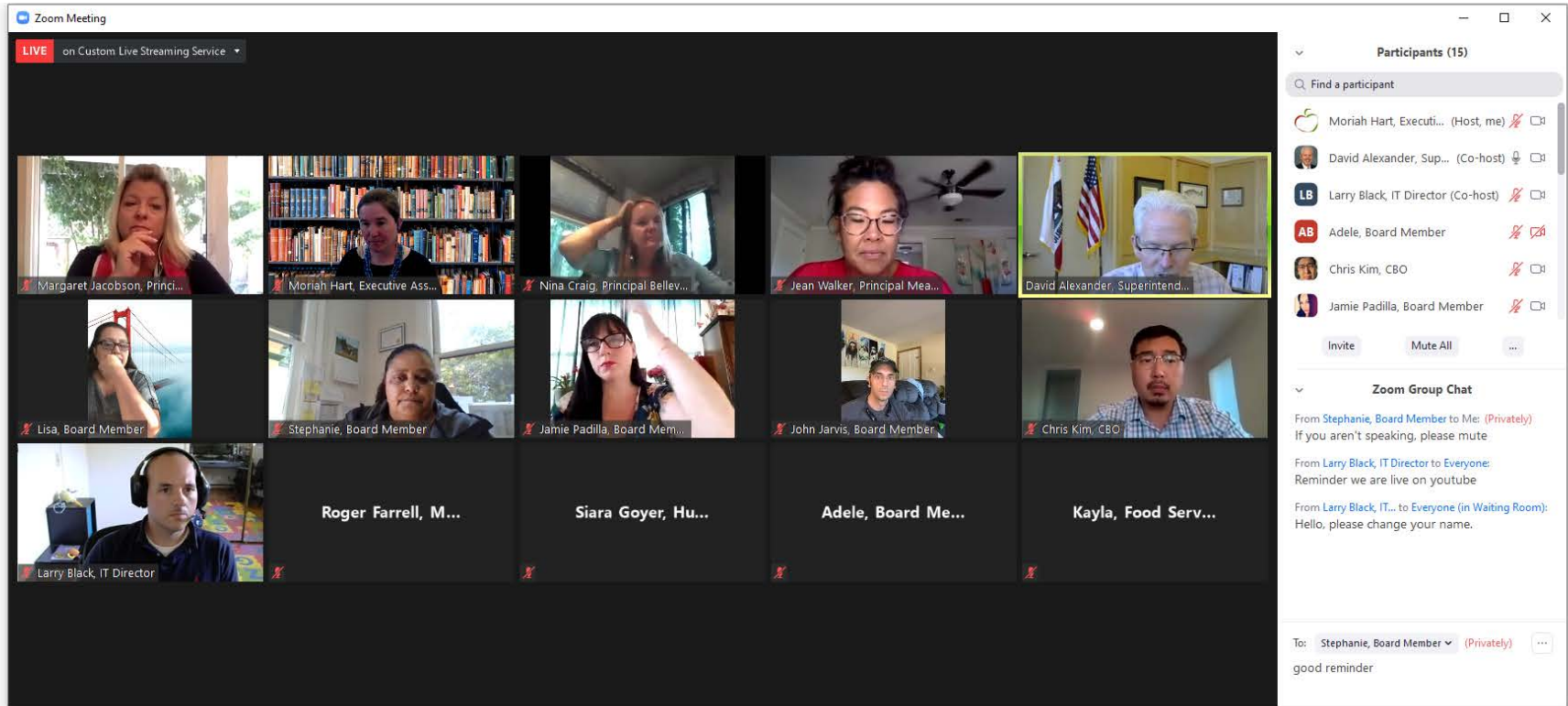

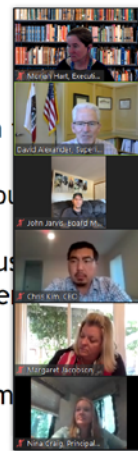

Safe In-Person School Based on Local Health Data

1. In counties on the state monitoring watch list, school must remain distance learning only.
2. They can consider reopening for in-person instructions once the county has been off the monitoring list for 14 consecutive days.
3. Sonoma County is currently on the watch list through at least August 16. This means that the earliest possible date that schools could reopen would be August 16.
4. Criteria to get off the watch list are strict.
5. Once off the watch list, districts are still subject to SB 98 requirements that they "shall offer in-person instruction to the greatest extent possible."
