This month every teacher got an Apple TV installed in their classrooms. We are both big fans and use them every day. It allows us to not be tethered to one spot as everything is wireless and we can screencast from any device. We can use our ipads to take photos of student work to show to the rest of the class or turn our ipads into whiteboards that the students can use to show their classmates how to do different math problems. The second trimester is coming to an end in a couple of weeks so teachers are busy doing assessments and starting report cards. We also attended an ELPAC training last week as we prepare to give the ELPAC to our English Language Learners. A lot of time and practice has gone into getting ready for this test so we are eager and excited for our students to "rock the test" and show all of their English knowledge.

BEA will be sending two representatives to the superintendent interviews next month. We are looking forward to working with the board to find a great new leader for BUSD.

After two very long years, we are starting to see the light at the end of this Covid tunnel and things are starting to feel more "normal" everyday. We look forward to seeing you again in March.

9.2. Principal Report

Principal's Report: Denise McCullough, Kawana Springs

Good evening members of the Board, Dr Alexander, District Community Members,

Well, BEA said everything I was going to stay. Here's what I can say, Principals please stand, "We are still standing!" Thank you and good evening...just kidding.

Staffing shortages primarily due to COVID protocols have continued to put increased pressure on us and our employees, requiring us to think out of the box and come up with creative solutions to finding coverage in order to keep our doors open to students. Many of our staff members have shown incredible flexibility and willingness to help wherever they can, even if it means doing different duties for an hour or a whole day. We truly appreciate this and wouldn't be surviving without them.

We want to acknowledge the work that our teachers and instructional assistants are doing each day. We principals have subbed enough to know that teaching animatedly and instructing many students in a second language, while wearing a mask all day, is not an easy job.

Yet we are moving forward with state requirements and teachers, in addition to outside examiners who we are very grateful for, will be administering the ELPAC exam to our English Learner students over the next month. Aracely provided an informative training last week to prepare us for this.

Good news; we've also had many students who met our district's reclassification criteria and have been Reclassified as Fluent English Proficient recently. These students will not be required to take the ELPAC exam this spring and will be monitored for the next couple of years to make sure they are achieving at high levels or whether they need additional support.

Our implementation of the SIPPS program is well underway, with paraprofessionals using it for literacy intervention and teachers using it as part of their CORE English language arts instruction. We are beginning systematic support for paraprofessionals, with the help of Sally McDaniel. Lauren Ridgway from SCOE is helping to support our teachers with additional support and learning to ensure the best implementation possible.

The end of the trimester is soon approaching on February 25, so you know what that means... students will be busy showing us what they've learned through assessments and soon teachers will be working on report cards. While we are concerned about learning loss from the pandemic and high numbers of absences this year, we look forward to analyzing the assessment data from this trimester, once we have it, and remain hopeful that learning has happened on many levels and growth will continue to occur.

On an exciting note, boys' basketball season has officially begun... our first games were today, we're fortunate that the health order restricting large gatherings expired just in time for us to cheer for our teams.


