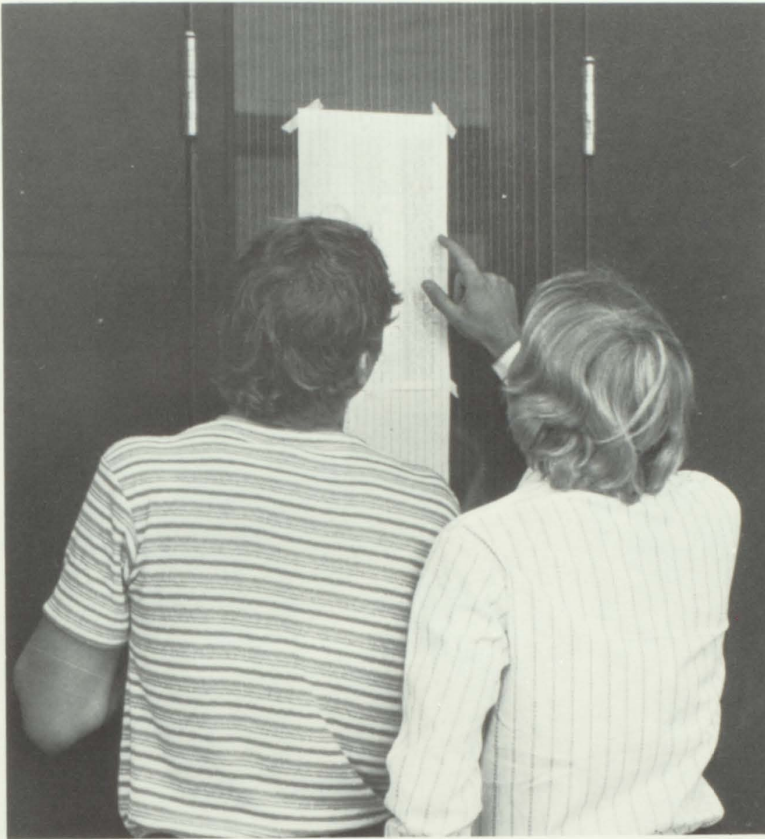

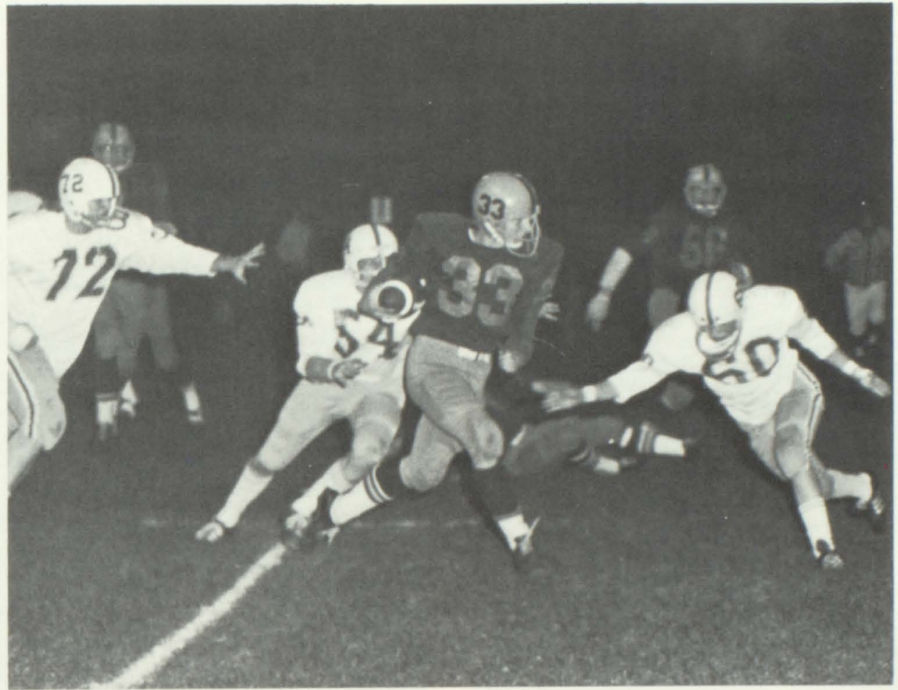

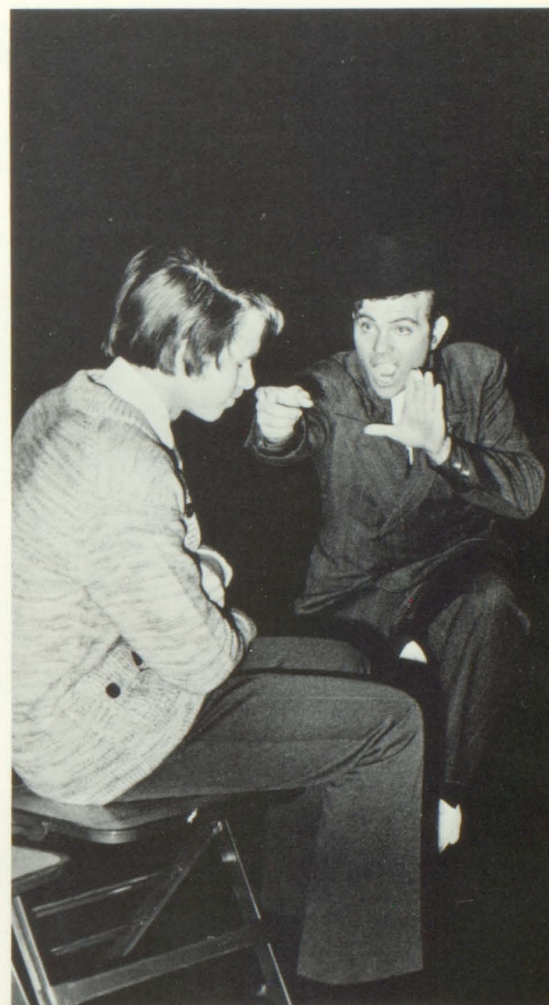
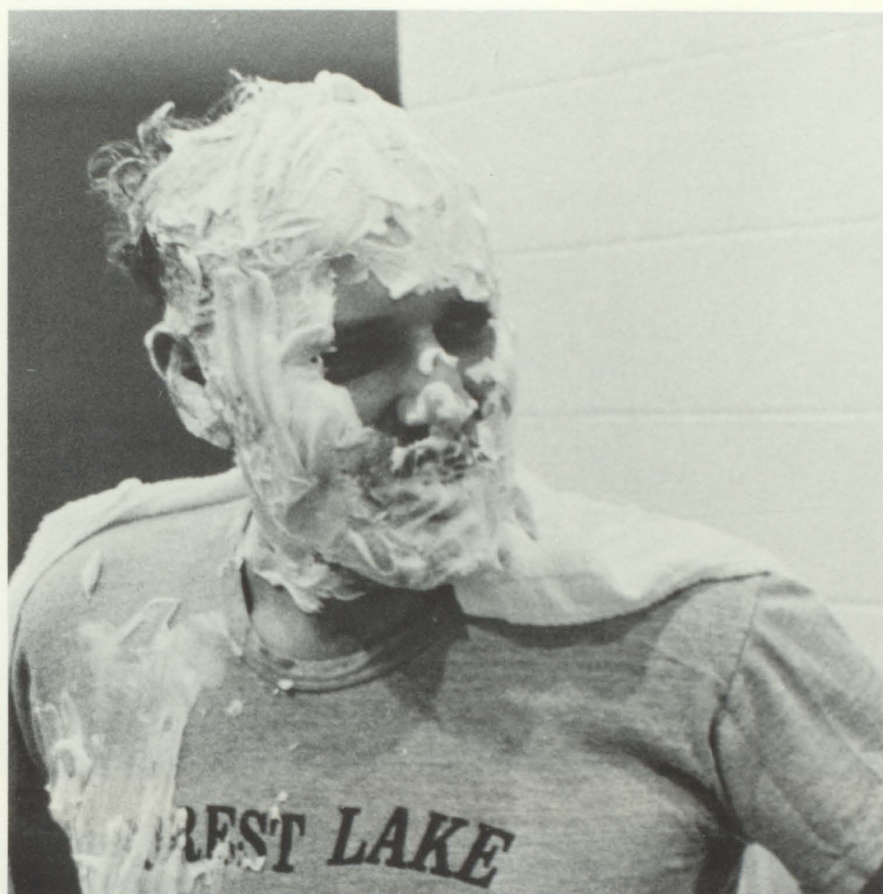
Ice Rink Brings Winter Outside

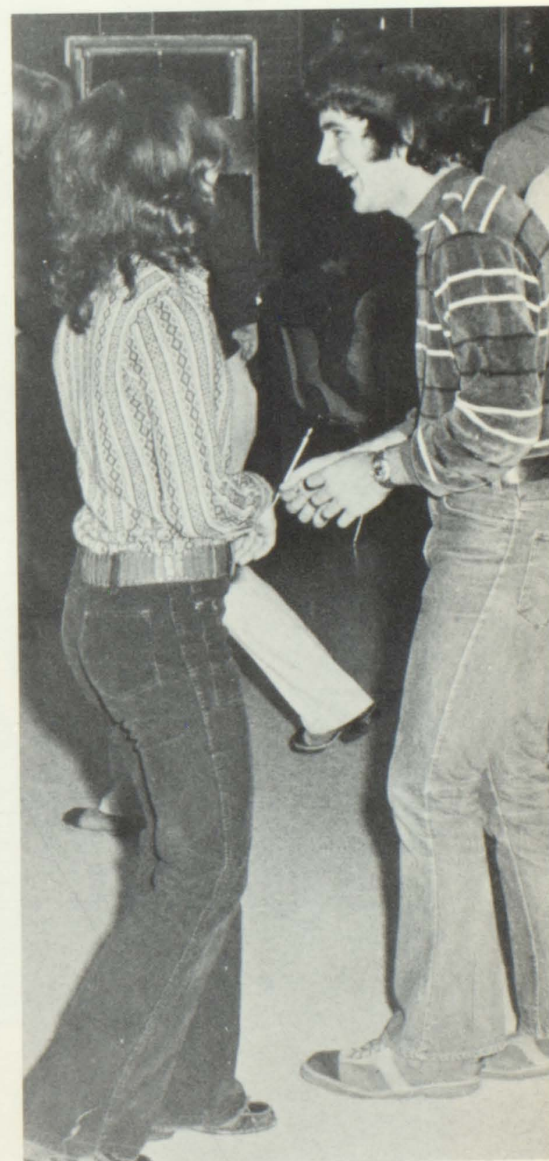

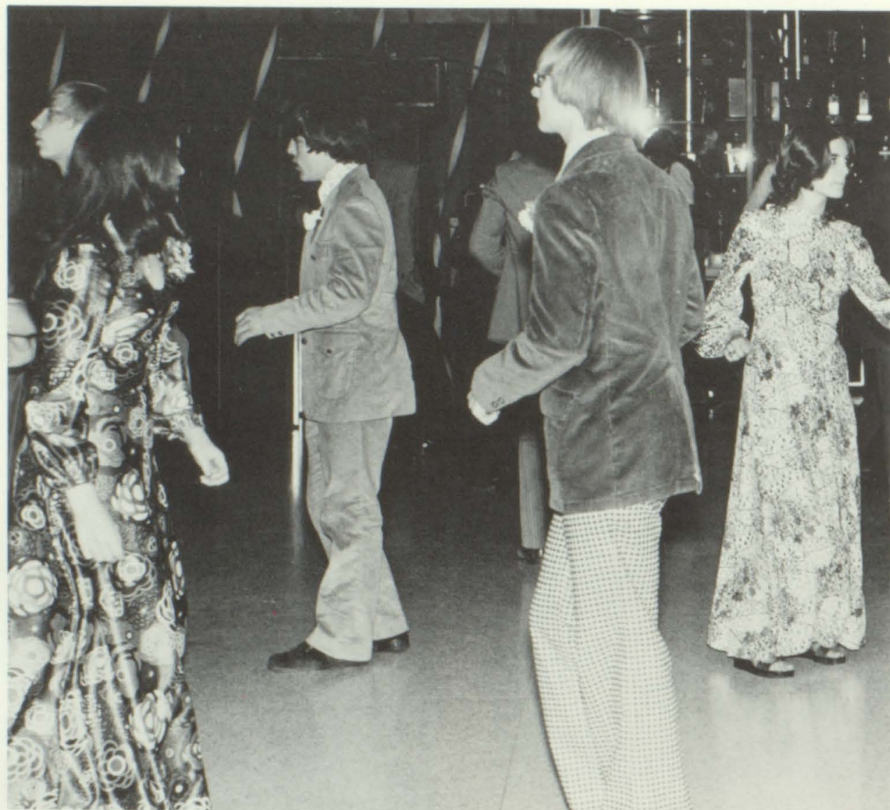

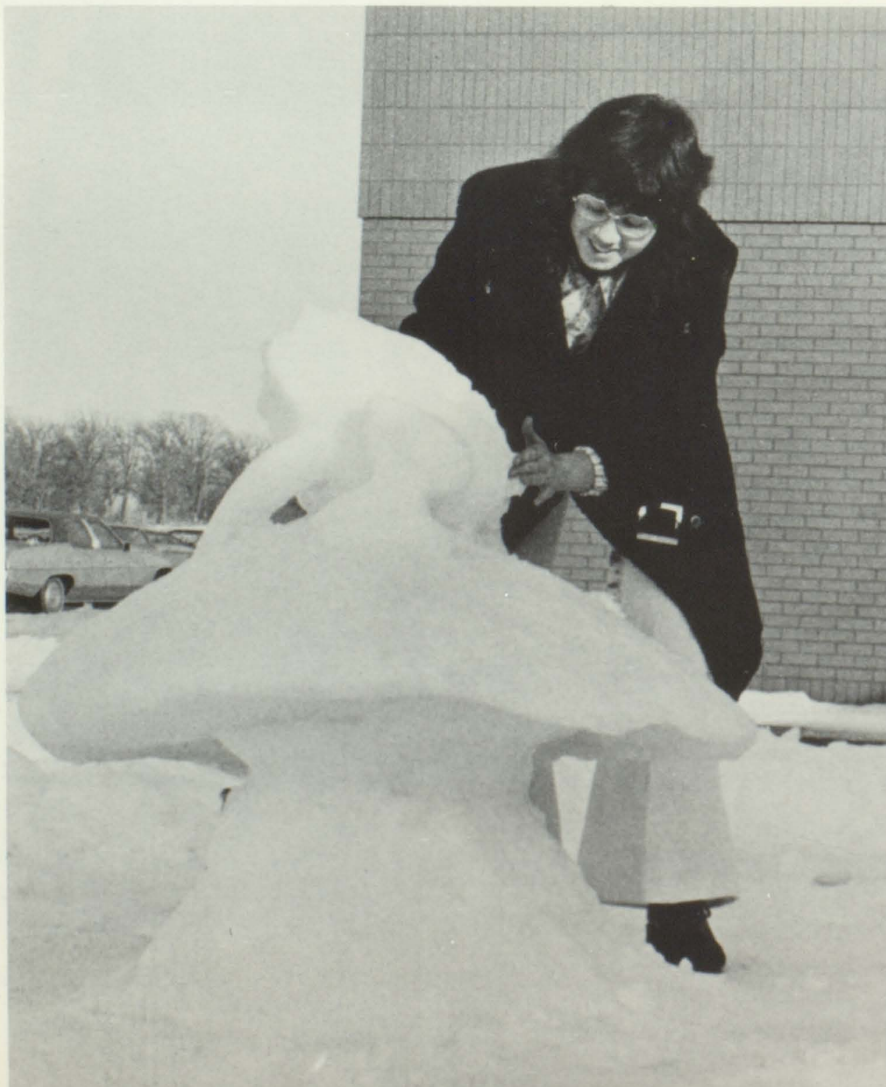

Sno Week '73 Is a First for FLHS

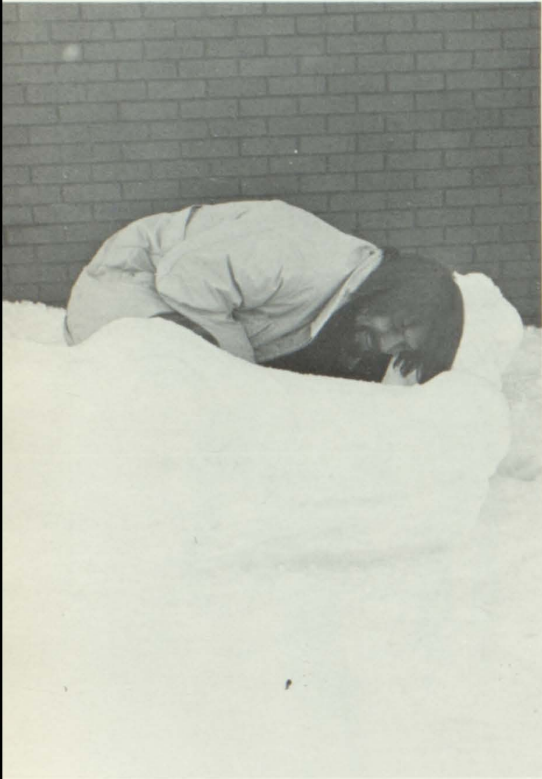

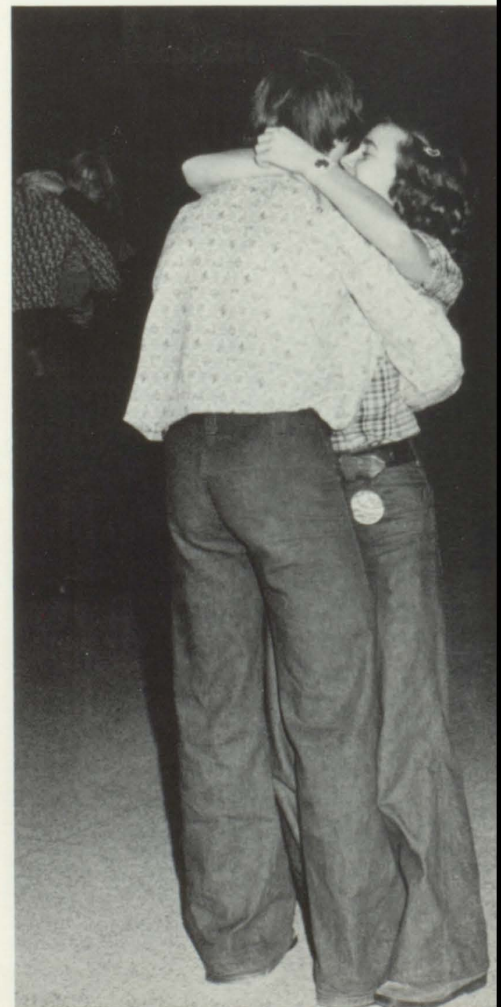

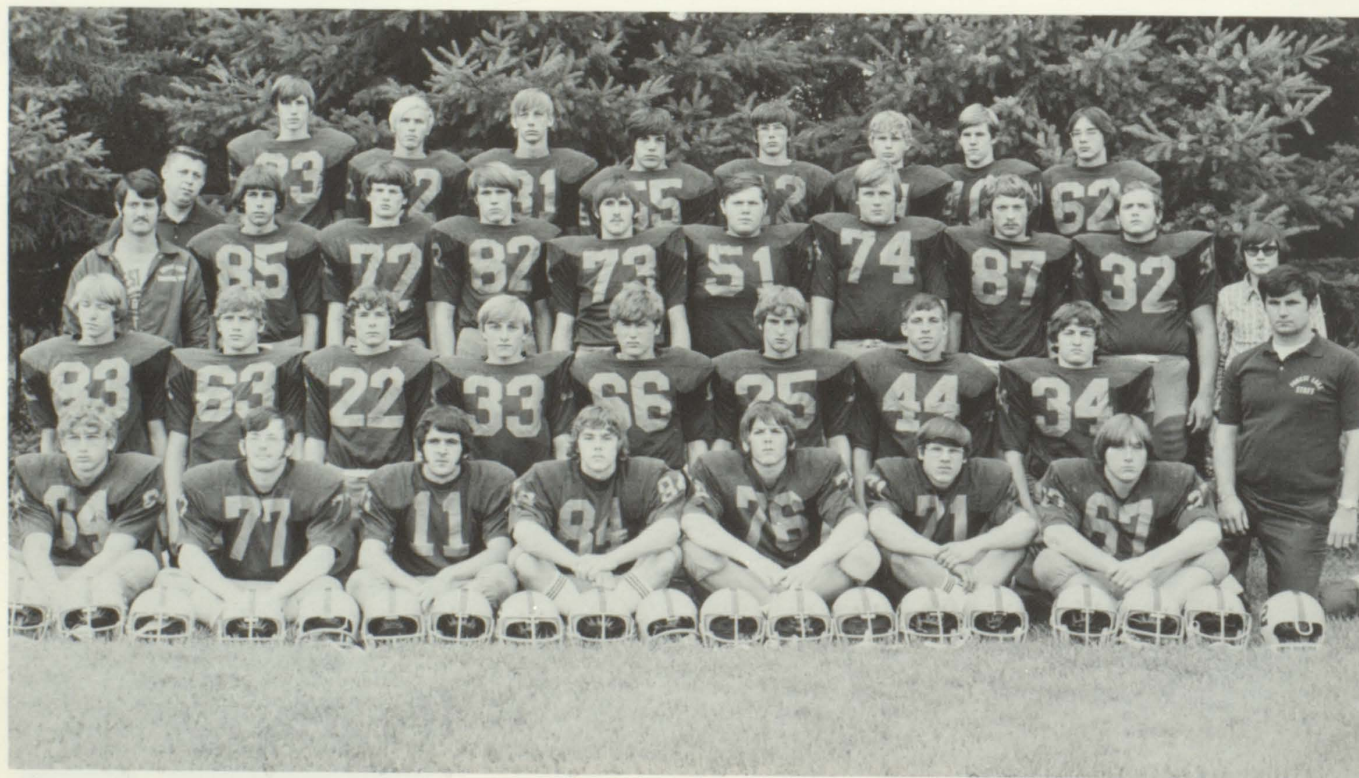

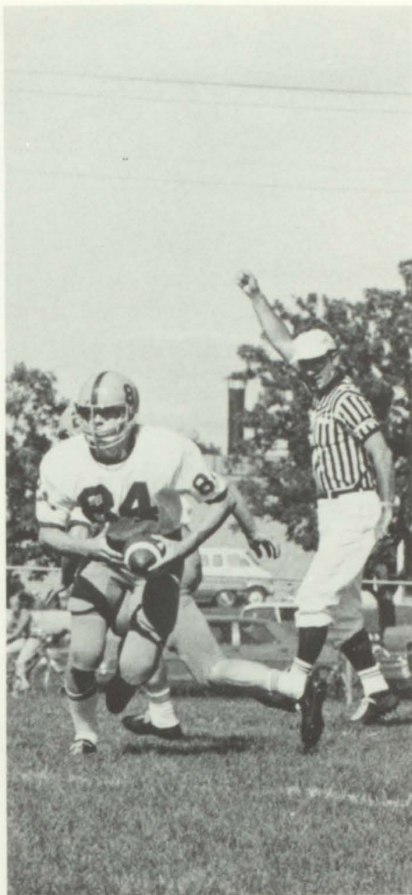
Injuries Plague Varsity Gridders

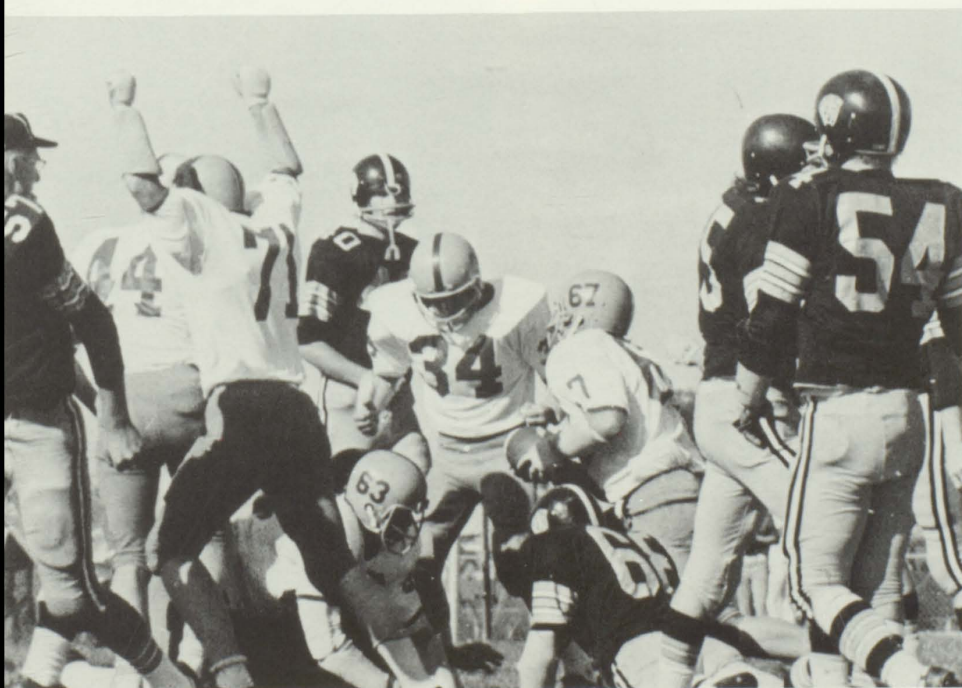

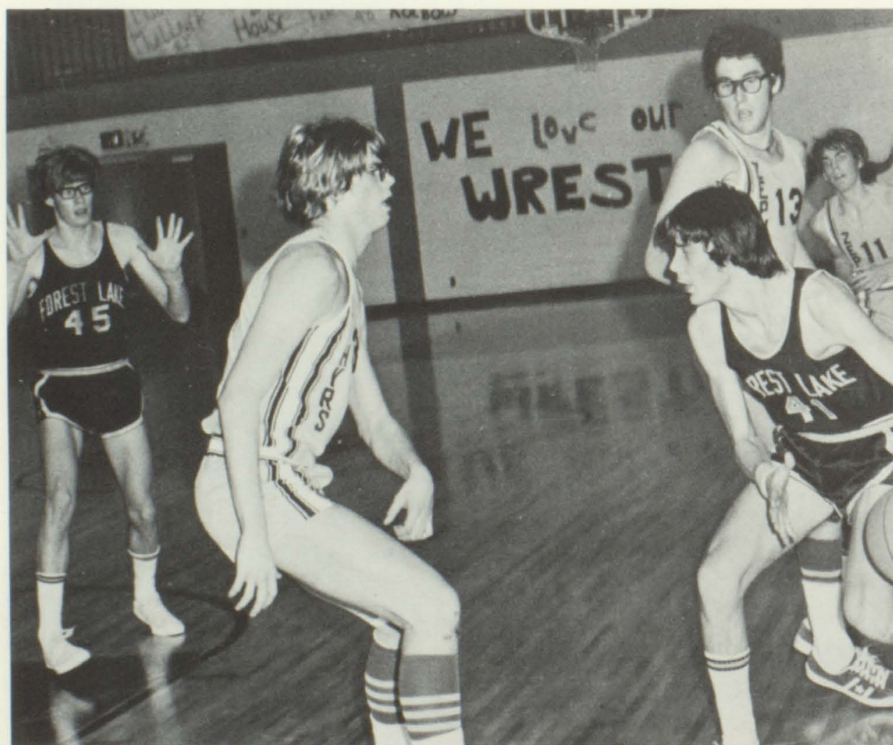

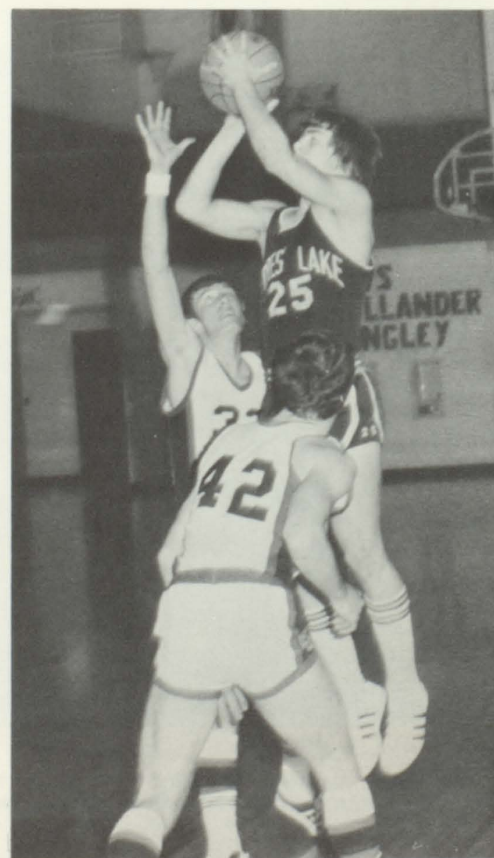

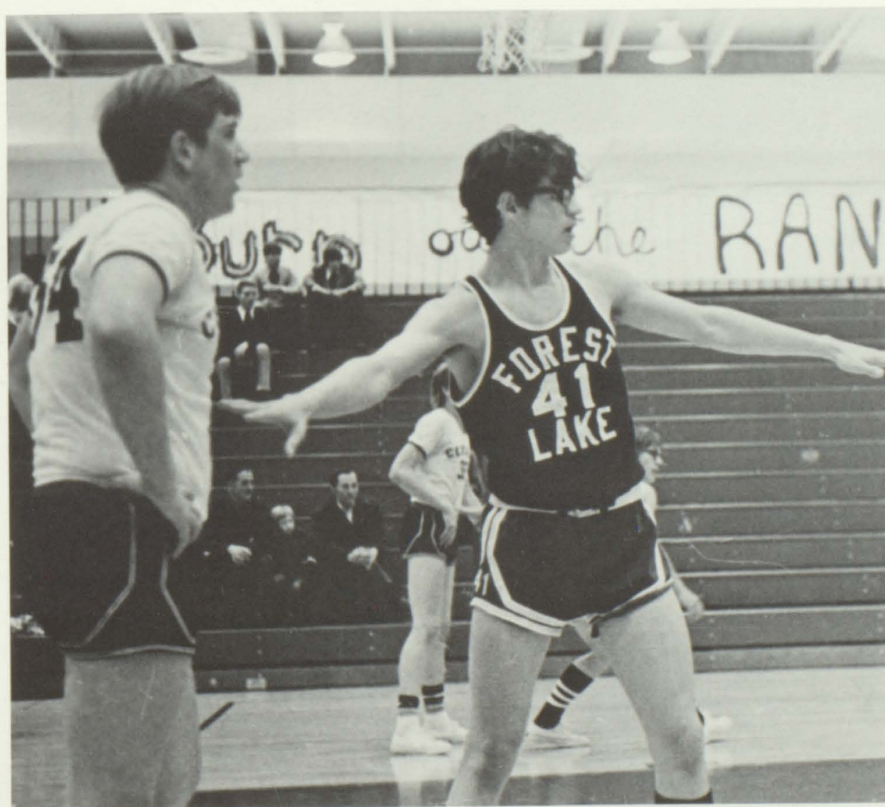
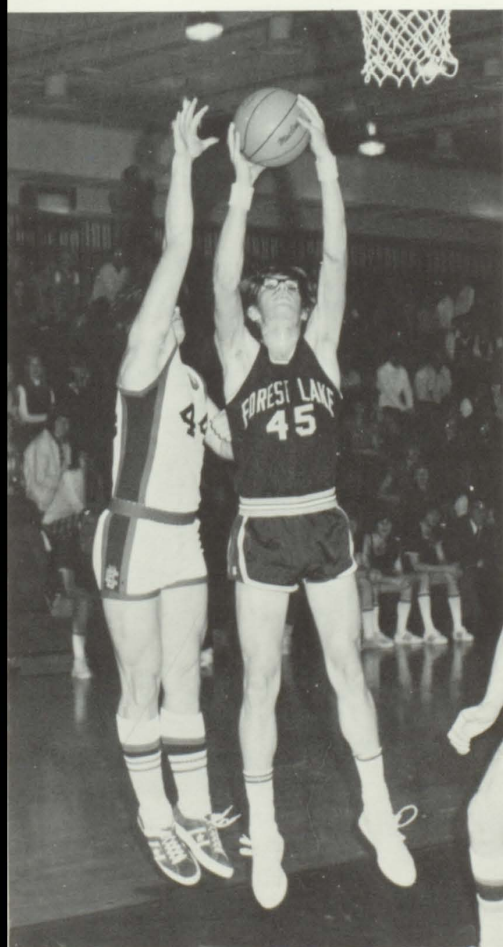

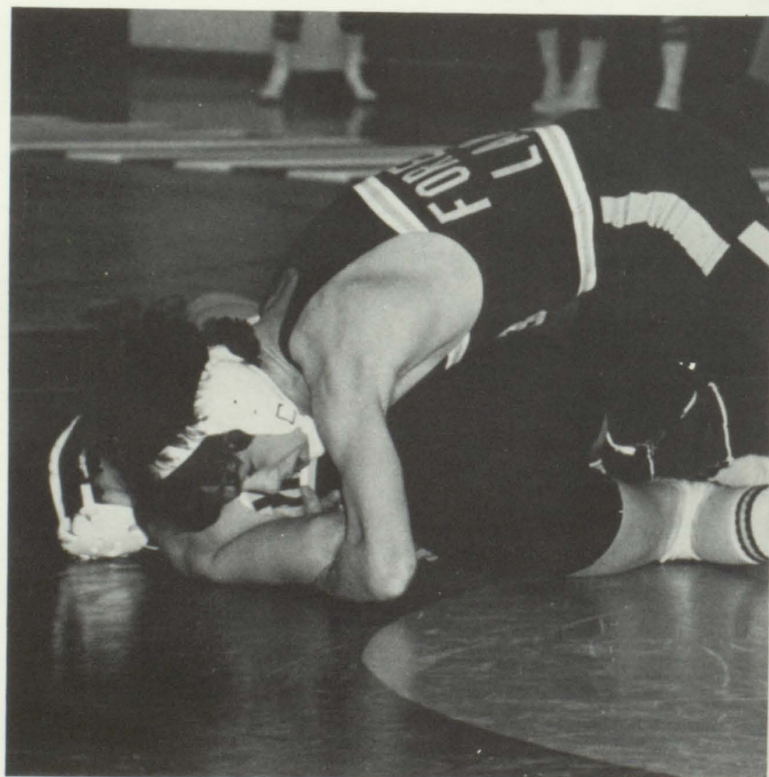



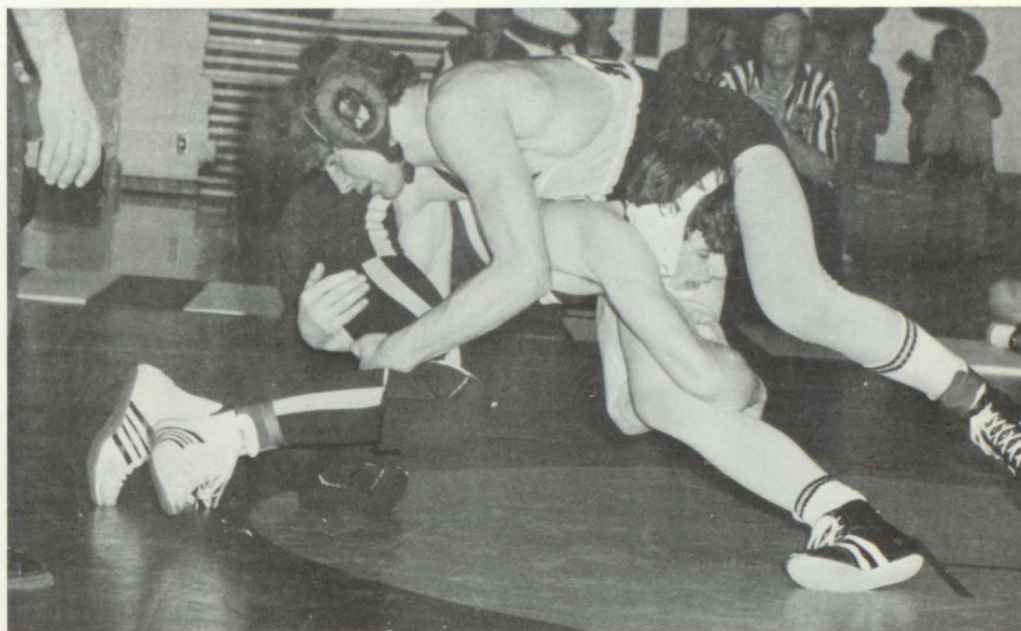

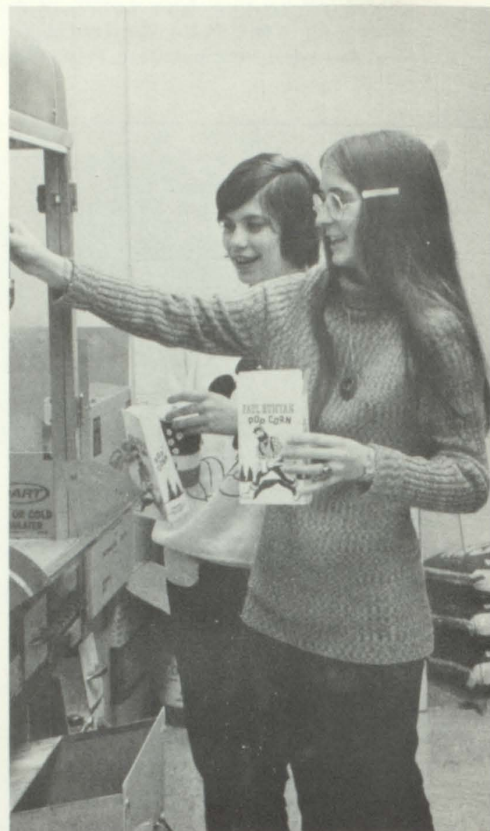

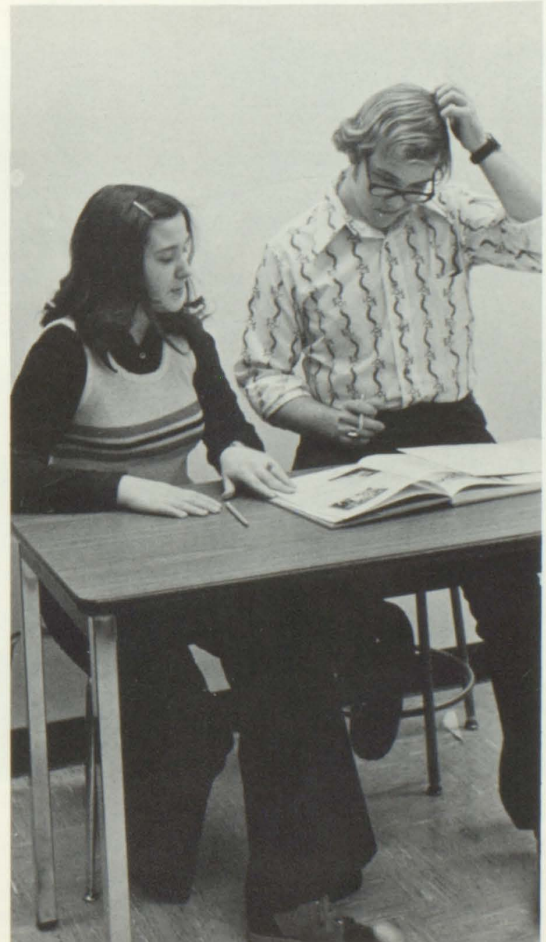

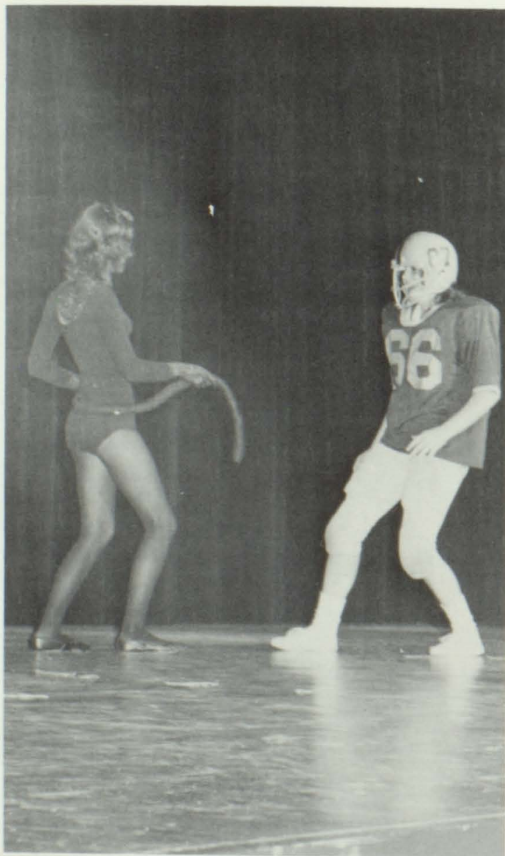

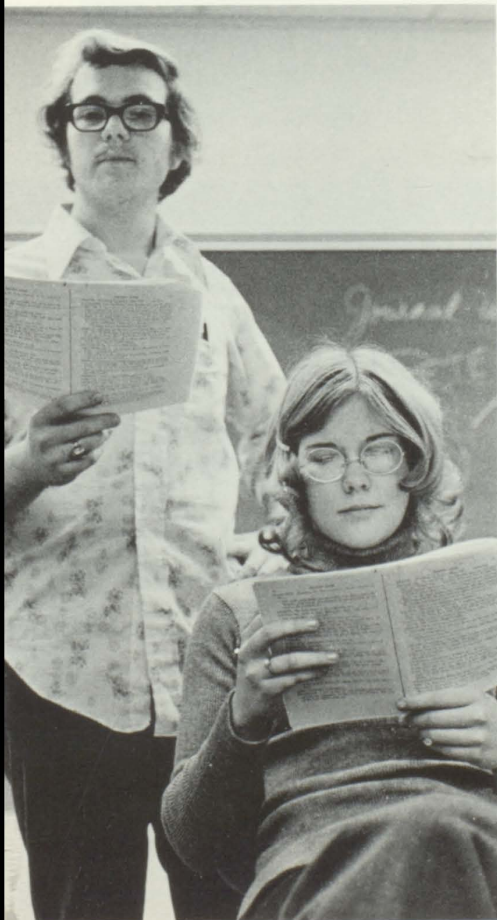

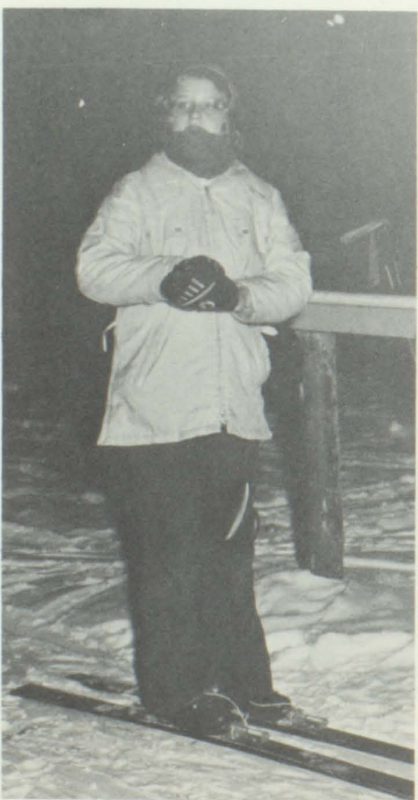

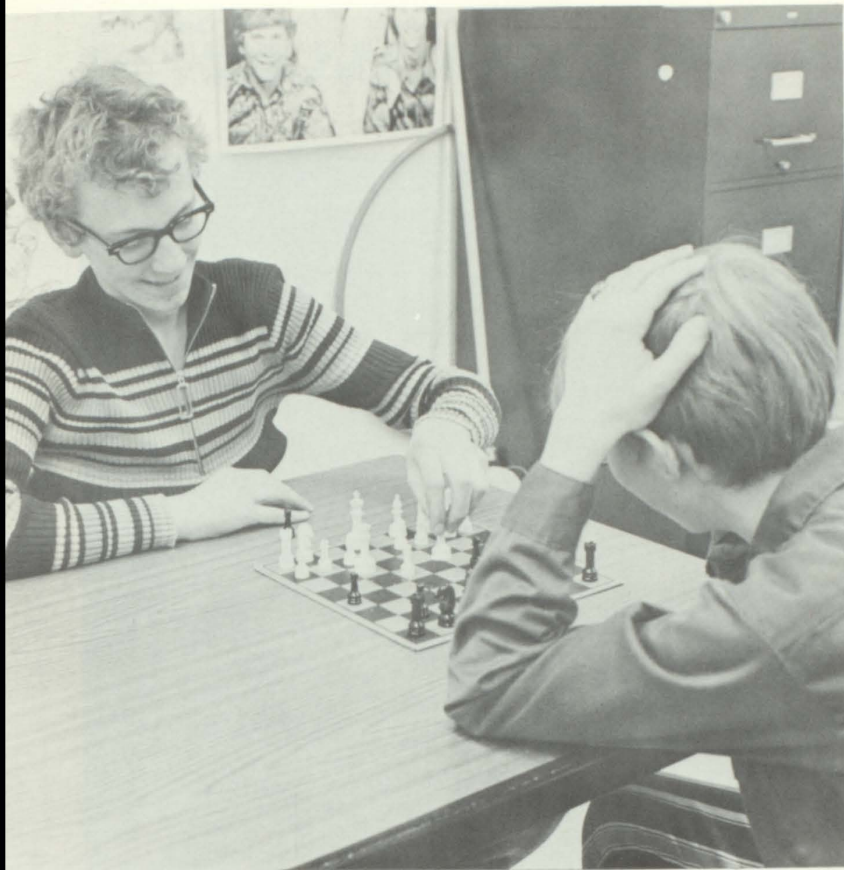

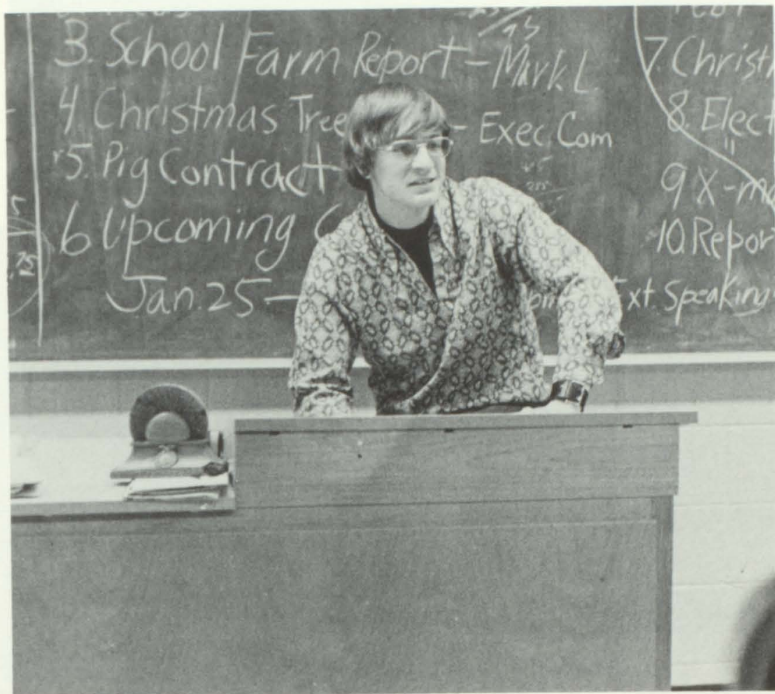

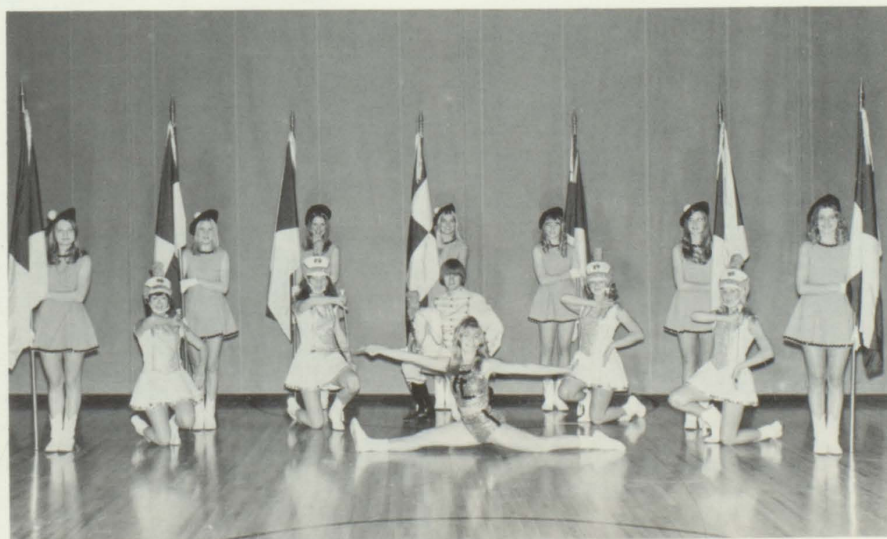

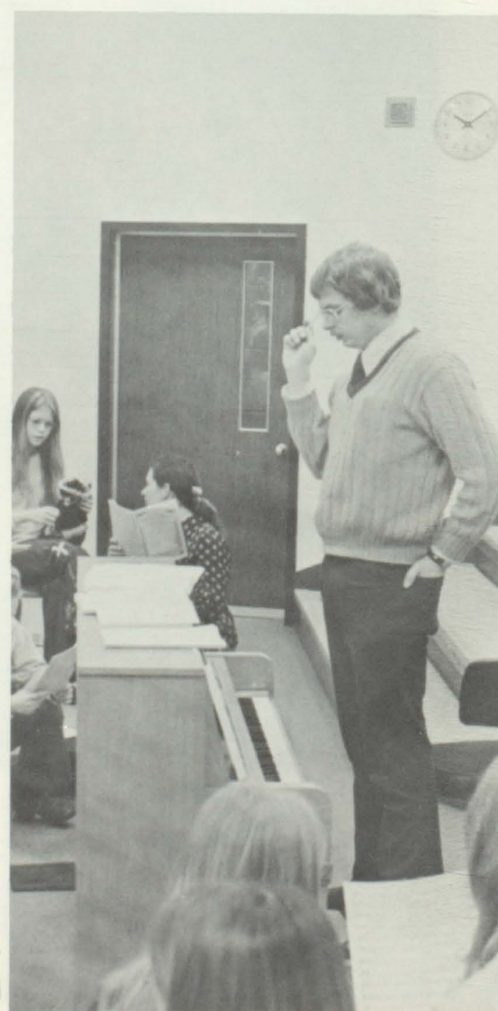

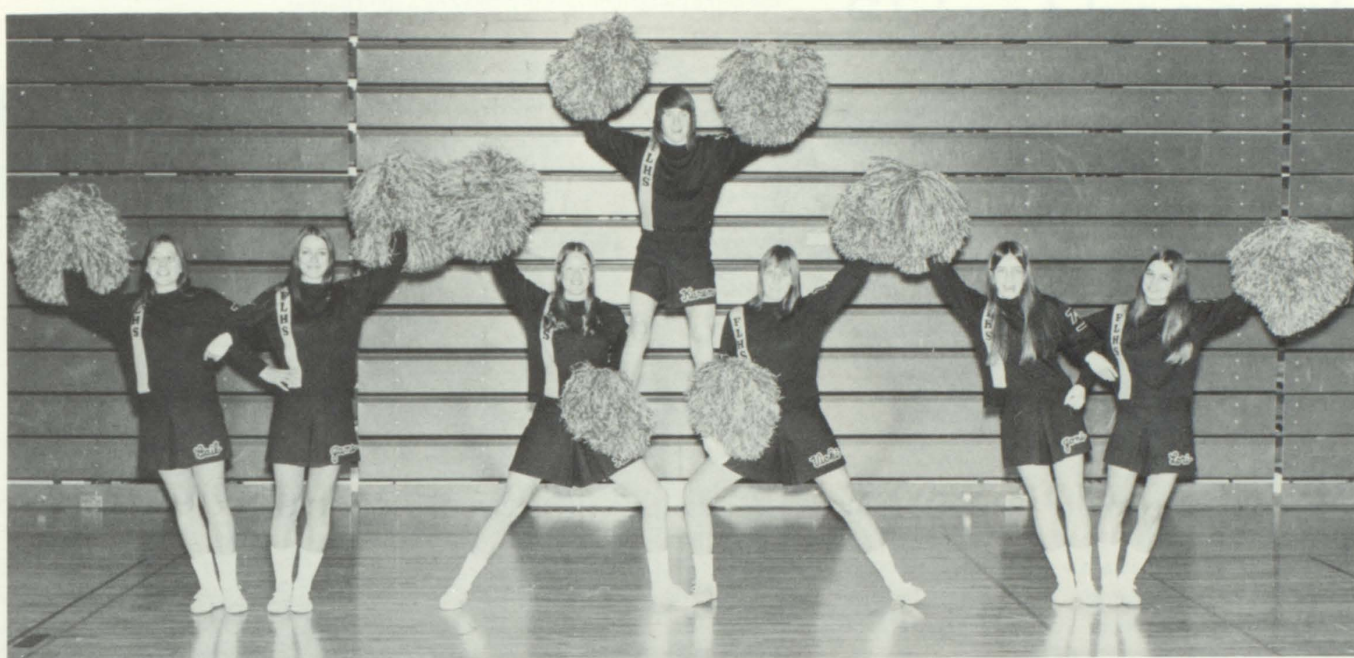

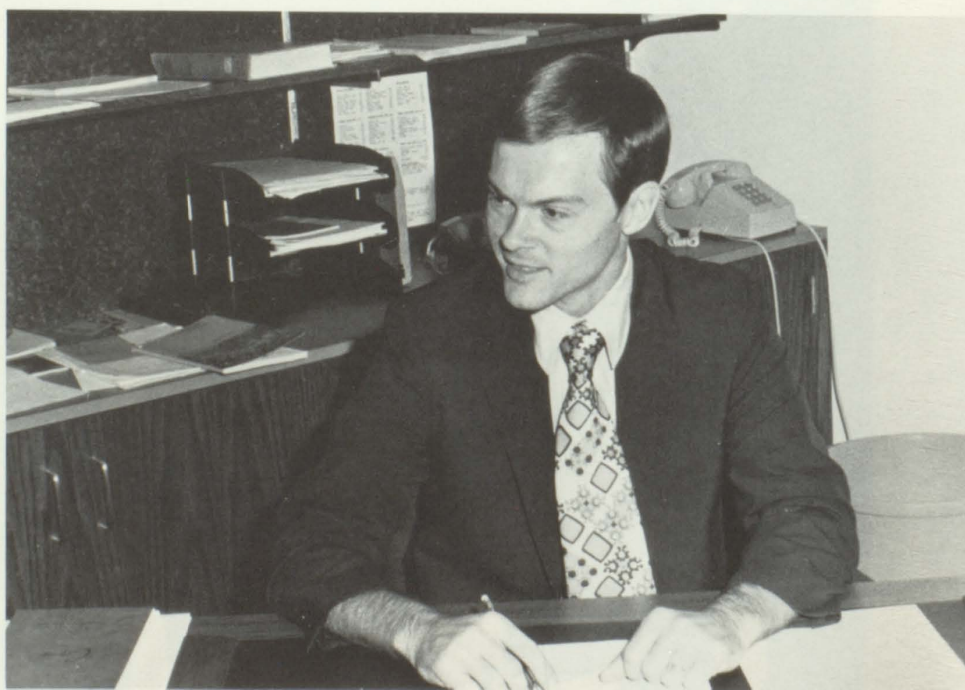

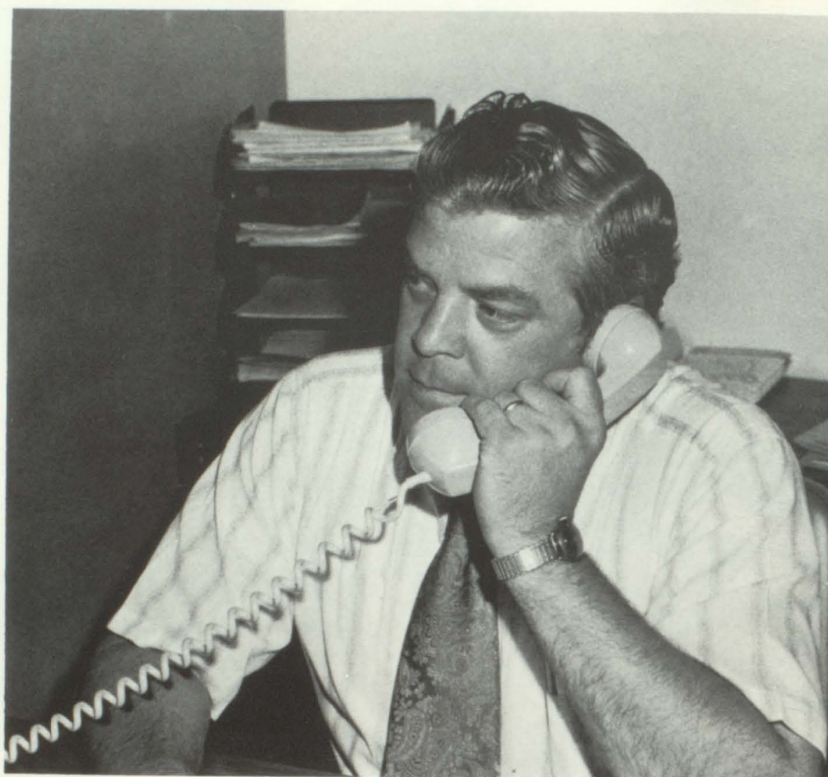

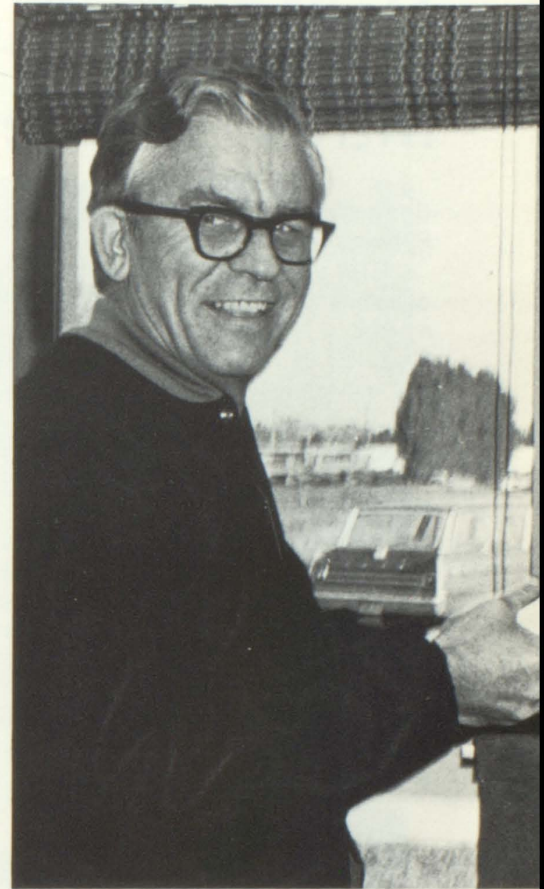

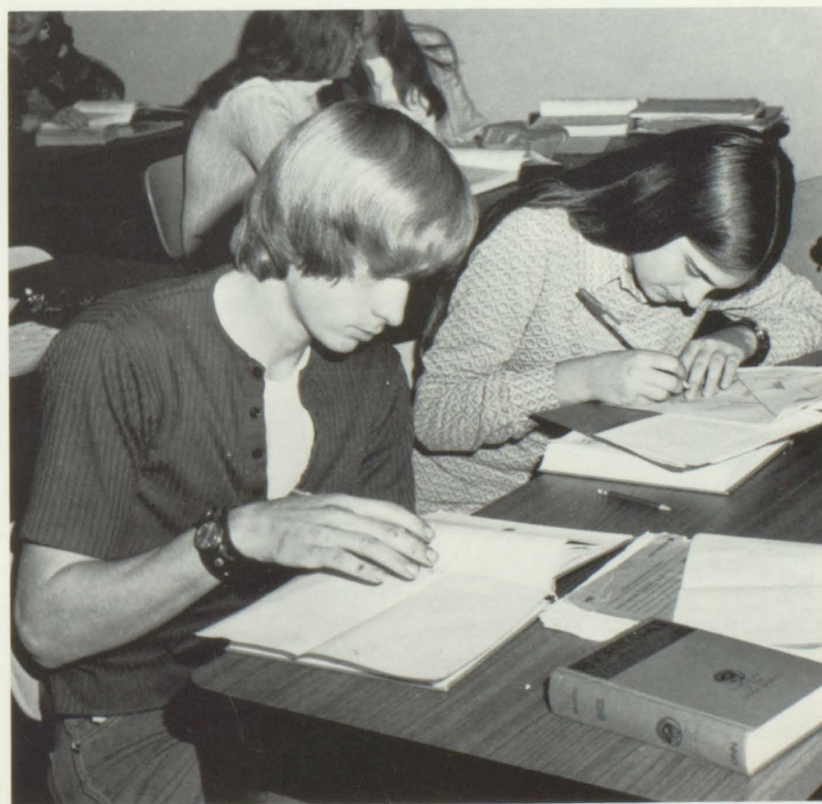

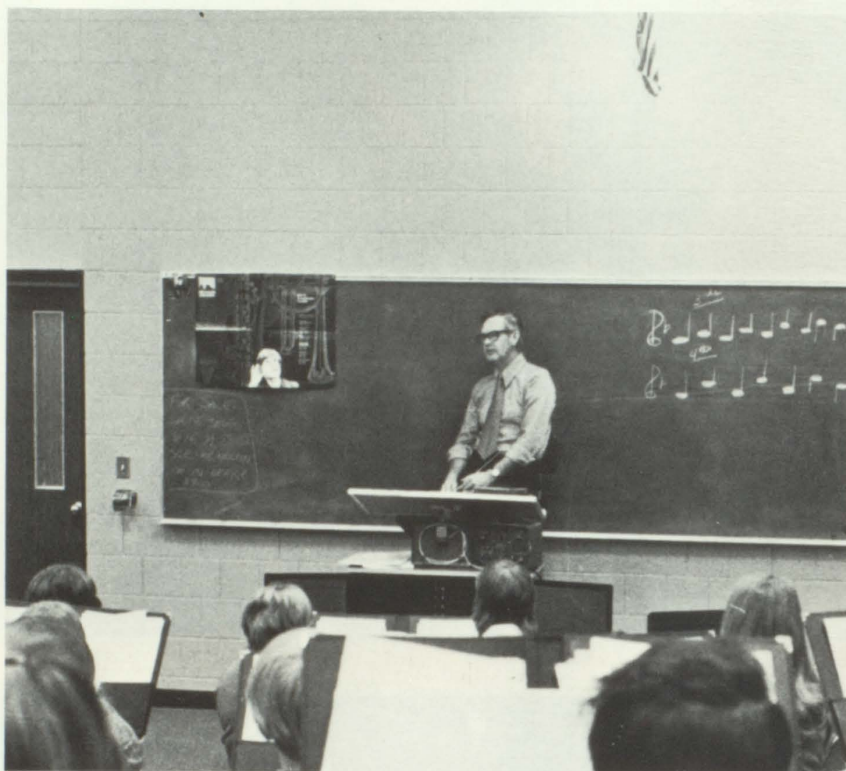

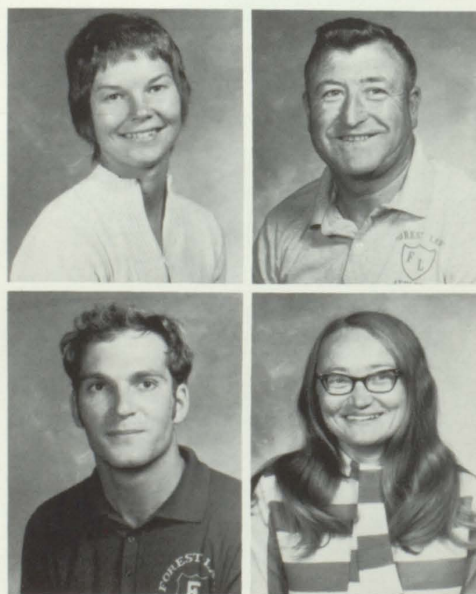

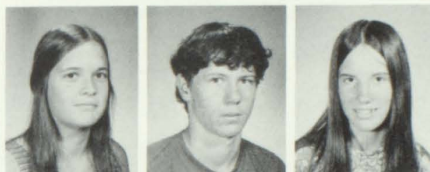

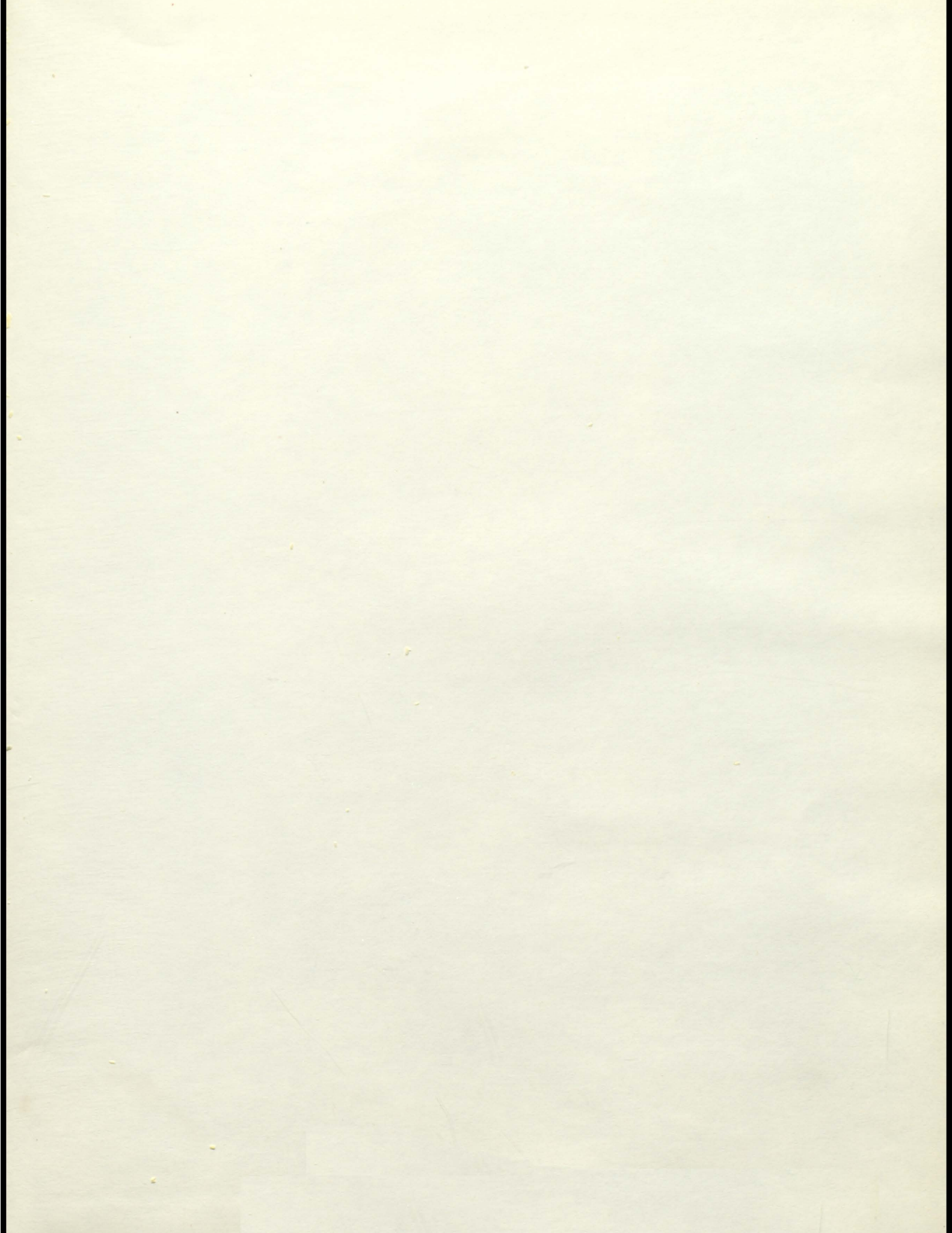
Editors' Notes:

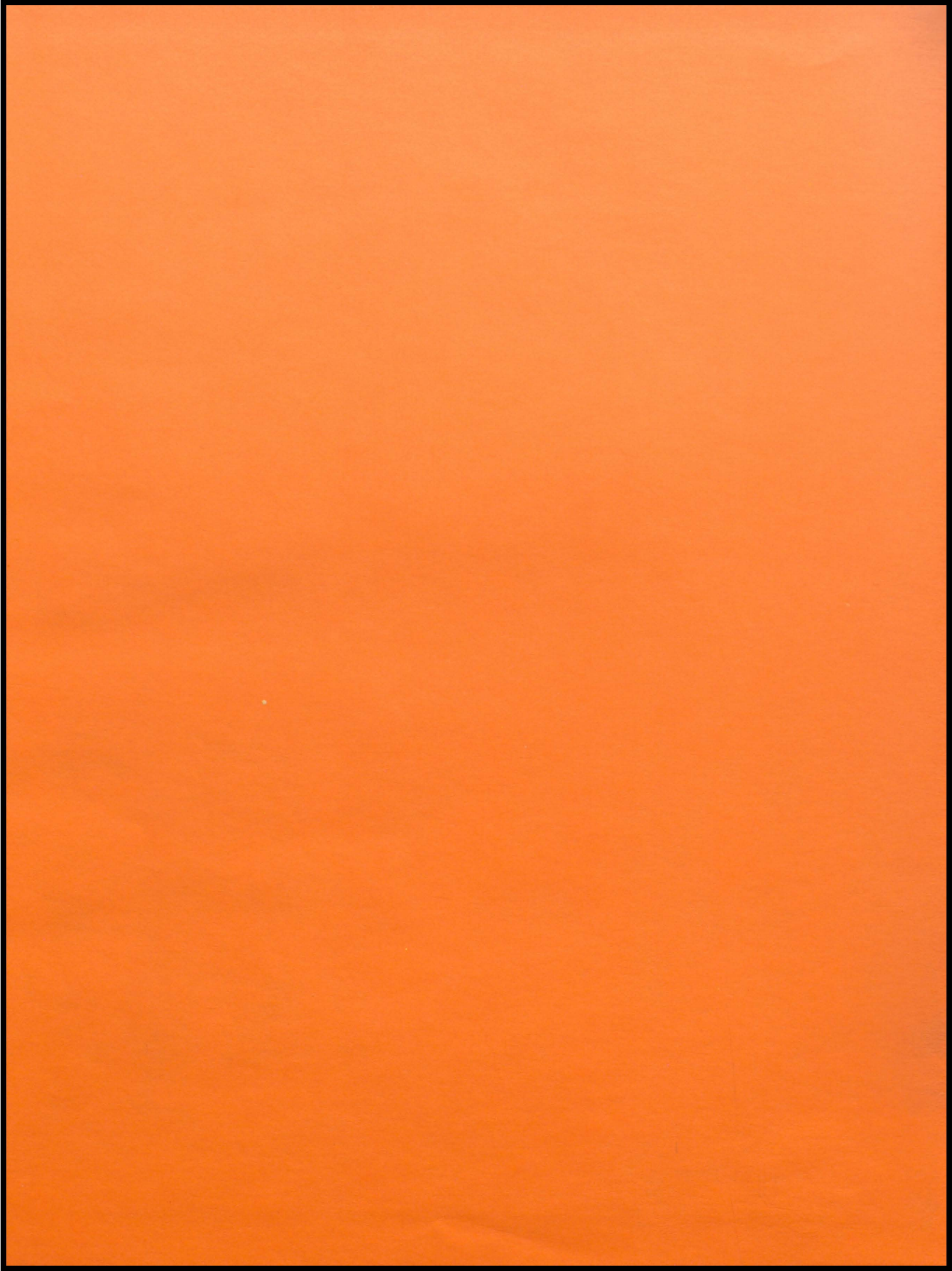
