




#### Twirlers Make Change In Their Routine Style










Wendi Steely leads her row onto the field for pre-game band show






#### AFS Gets Profit From Genuine French Dinner




## Millington Presides Over '77 School Year





#### **Custodians Cheerfully** Continue Their Chores



















#### Band Requests New Uniforms








### Bodiddlers' Chanting Made Practice








#### Girls' Tennis Really Swings

#### Wrestling Fan Support Becomes Better In '77

















#### Bucketwomen Win F.L. Invitational






#### Semi-Formal Ends Choke Anoka Days










#### Record Crowds Attend "Annie Get Your Gun"










Events outside the school community are important in determining which roads we follow. Community influence and support could be felt in all areas. Minimum graduation requirements became a popular item of concern and discussion.










#### Seniors Hesitant To Leave Halls of FLHS


