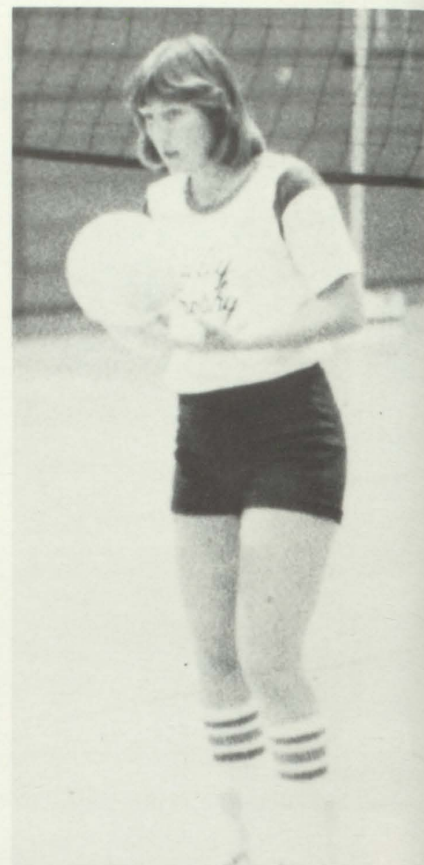
his or her time to helping in the guidance office, in the main office, the AV room and even in the library. Being on one of the tutor programs in our school is another excellent way to help a fellow student with

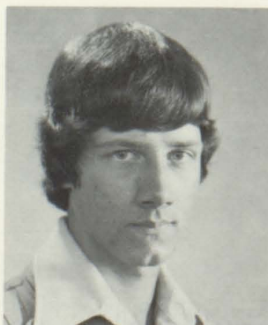
We here at Forest Lake High School have enjoyed them throughout this past year and wish them luck as they return to their home land.

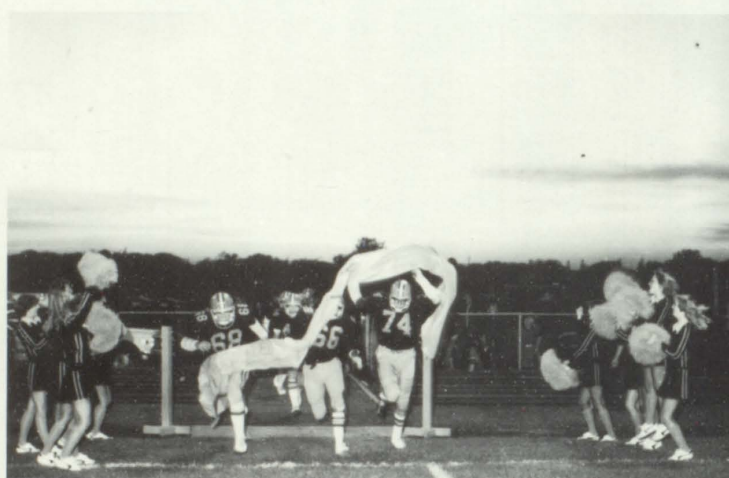
"Twin Day" was on Wednesday, where students dressed alike, and were judged by the principals.

Family Financial Statement and Financial Aid opportunities. The speeches proved to be very helpful to the students and parents who needed to fill out the lengthy forms

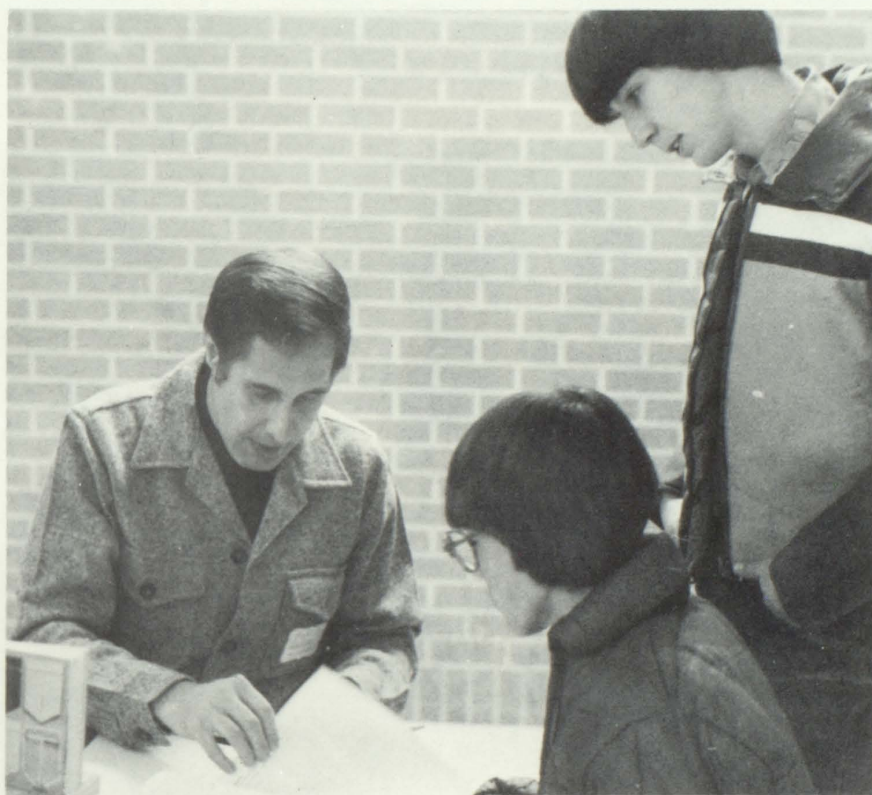

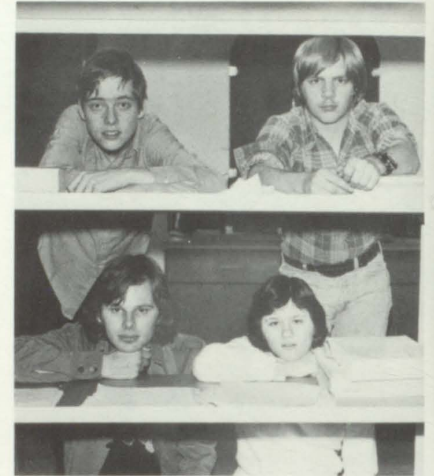


Aides and Tutors Important to School Functioning

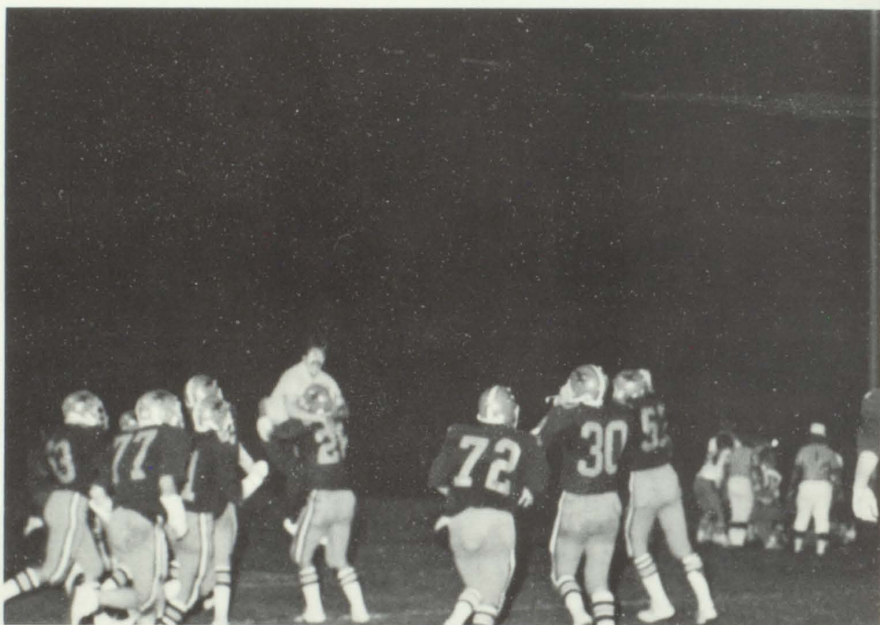


Gridders Go Gold

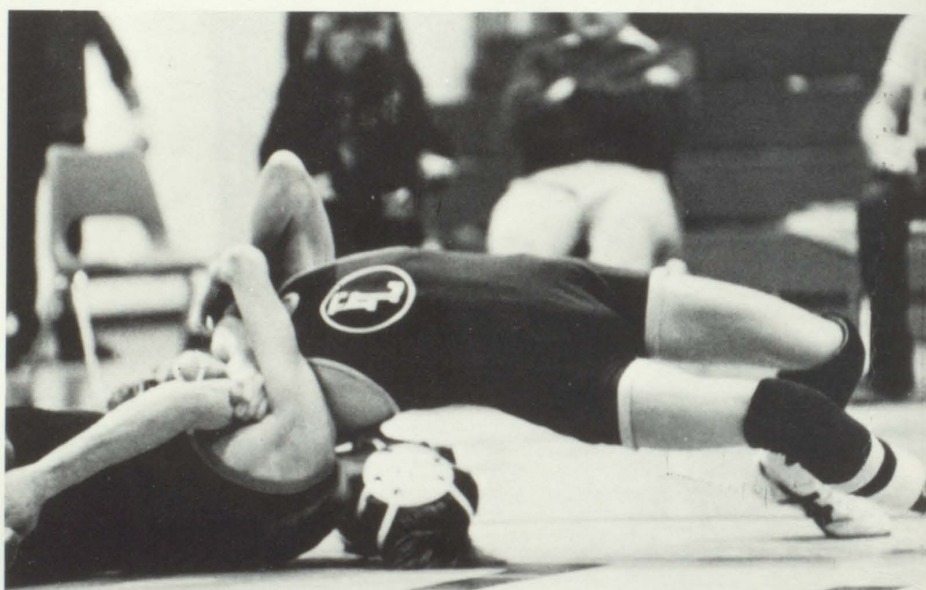

The team won the Forest Lake Invitational and the season ended with a fifth place in conference.

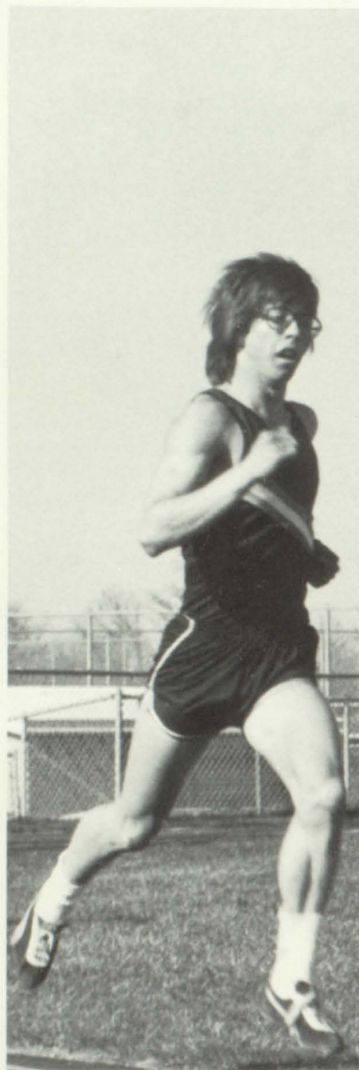

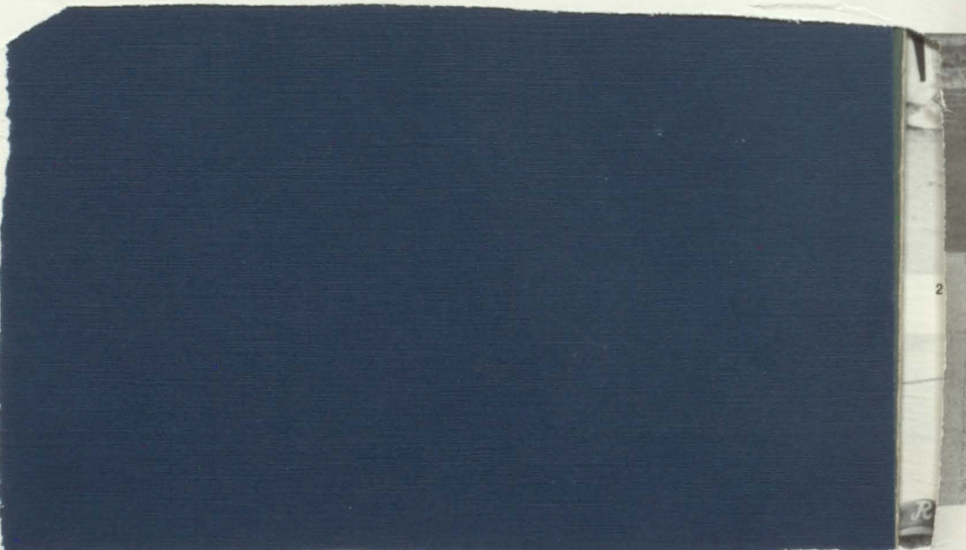
Batter Up!
