
Last year the students complained that five minutes was not enough time for passing. This year they raised it to six minutes. So now students should have no trouble getting to class on time.

The look of the nineties is whatever you want it to be, and the students at Forest Lake High School definitely show this by the way they dress. photos by: Janine Lindblad.










#### WAR?



## CENSORSHIP

On the other hand, many teens and artists feel that censorship is an infringement on their First Amendment right, Freedom of Speech. Artists contend that parents should enforce their own censorships, which in turn would make labels meaningless. They also feel that putting these labels on albums may even increase the attractiveness of the album, because it is restricted from teenagers.

In 1927 the bridge was built by Northern









The tournament, named after a former English teacher and Forensics coach at FLHS, draws schools from the tri-state area and 27 participated this year. Over 600 speakers and 150 judges and coaches filled the cafeteria at 8:00 a.m. preparing for the first round. After 3 rounds, the cafeteria filled once again in eager anticipation of the final round postings.

There are 12 types of speech events: Serious Drama, Serious Prose, Humorous, Poetry, Original Oratory, Extemporaneous Speaking, Extemporaneous Reading, Informative, Storytelling, Creative, Discussion, and Great Speeches. Extemp. Speaking, Extemp. Reading, and Storytelling are what is called "draw events" where contestants draw a slip of paper that tells either the subject or story to be spoken about.

Around 1:00 p.m. the posters came out and were taped to the colored panels in the cafeteria. They

told the 6-8 people whose preliminary ranks were high enough to advance to the final round. At 1:30 p.m. final rounds started and if you were not participating in one, you were watching one.

At 3:00 p.m. the awards ceremony started. Awards were given to speakers in final rounds. First places were taken by Inga Lennes in Prose, Heidi Zapzalka in Humorous, and Lee Mattson in Great Speeches along with many others placing 2-7th.

Then the most prestigious award was given — the "Ralph C. Streater" award. It is presented to a coach from any school, voted in by other coaches in the area, who has shown exceptional abilities in coaching. This year the award was given to a coach from Eagan.

The tournament ran extremely smooth and Forest Lake High School was represented as a distinguished Forensics patron and gracious host.



## RANGER FOOTBA **GAINS TWELVE**




Chad Bounds — senior defensive tackle; Andy McCurdy - senior split end; Scott Norquist and Mike Humphreys — junior tight end.

further our educational opportunities."










## LEARN WHILE YOU EARN



A LAST CHANCE CHALLENGE

The Forest Lake Alternative School operates under the premise of giving students another chance to get their diploma. Its goal is to provide an environment which will allow students to achieve academic success. The words "alternative school" make the whole thing sound ominous, but all it really means is that it is a school for those people in danger of not graduating, or who did not meet graduation requirements previously. There are over 50 students enrolled in this program at this time. Some students go full time to the alternative school, while others go for just one hour to pick up extra credits for graduation. "People who attend the alternative school are more determined' says faculty member Pat Cheyne. "They have a goal and they must accomplish it."


#### WAR!




Soon after Iraq invaded Kuwait the United Nations imposed a January 15, 1991 deadline, stating that if Iraq had not withdrawn by this date, war would be declared. As this deadline neared, nations watched intently as Iraq showed no intentions of withdrawing. And on January 15 our worst fears were realized when Iraq was still firmly entrenched in Kuwait.

At 7:00 (Central Standard Time) Wednesday evening, January 16, 1991 President Bush declared to the nation "The liberation of Kuwait has begun." Later that night the United States and Great Britain began the air-raids against Baghdad.

And, although any death is one too many, because we have not yet begun ground warfare the death toll has remained relatively low. Yet, the final outcome remains to be seen.
