


Juniors can look forward to being the leaders of the school and enjoying their last year.






TRENDS OF THE PAST AND PRESENT






1992 ROSE BOWL PARADE BOUND!







Raising Technology to a Higher Power!




From Minnesota Wildlife to Advanced Placement Chemistry, the science courses offered give hands-onstudents experience and the problems.


Since 1972, many changes have taken place in the Industrial Arts Department.

Friends and Memories













Alternative School

Alternative school gives students a chance to earn a high school diploma without actually going to high school.

The alternative school in Forest Lake is coordinated by Cam Hedlund. Lois Weber is the counselor and Steve Novak is the principal of the school.

There are over seventy students participating in the alternative school. The average age for most students is from 16 to 21 years, but there have been students taking part who have been between 28 and 33 years old.

The alternative schools offer eighteen different classes. There are four English classes, four math classes, four social studies classes, and two science classes. Other classes offered include art, physical education, OJT, and a leadership class.

At the maximum, one class holds fifteen students. This gives students a great opportunity to get personal help from their teachers. In fact, there is hardly any homework for the students because the majority of homework gets completed during class time.

Alternative school semesters are the same as in high school. The only difference is that students in alternative schools get credits for quarters instead of semesters.

The teachers' main goal for the students is to help them get into a technical or community college.

Through the alternative schools program, many students are able to achieve their goals and make their career dreams come true.

The play was a very strong effort, taking place at the sub-region competition on January 30. The play then advanced to region competition on February 6, taking a close second place.














With the combination of some veteran and younger players, the boys and girls golf teams were looking to be competitive from the upper-half to the middle-half of the conference.






Boys Track Is On The Jump
















ZERO HOUR

When considering the benefits, students don't seem to mind getting out of bed earlier to come to school.





College In The School








Freshman Writing is worth 5 credits at the universities and ½ at the high school. Class requirements include writing 4 papers. In these papers they are presented with a problem and must use their writing ability to solve it. After their papers are written, the students get into groups and evaluate and grade each other. A.P. Classes; A College Head Start

The advanced placement classes offered at Forest Lake H.S. provide motivated students with the opportunity to take college-level courses. From A.P. Calculus to A.P. Art History, there are a variety of courses to satisfy student interests. Mr. Hanson, who teaches A.P. Art History, explained, "I like the hands-on experience the students get to take part in. It really is an excellent way to prepare for collegelevel study." With the challenge and diversity presented through A.P. classes, students are generally well-prepared to take an A.P. examination in late spring to earn college credit.

Mollie Murphy is a senior enrolled in A.P. Spanish, which is a class covering in-depth studies of Spanish grammar, literature, and culture. She decided to take A.P. Spanish so she could earn a college credit while still in high school. In order to earn a college credit, she can choose to take the A.P. Spanish Language Examination in May. To get admitted into A.P. Spanish, Mollie had to successfully complete Spanish 3 while maintaining an above- average G.P.A. in her previous Spanish classes. When asked what the most challenging aspect of the class is, she replied, "We move at a very fast pace, much faster than any of the other Spanish classes." One of the more beneficial aspects of the class includes that it is a small enough class where help is readily available from both the teacher and fellow students. Although it may be a very demanding and challenging course, Mollie feels that it is an excellent way to prepare for a successful and rewarding college career.














* PROMISING SIGNS *




