



Last years group: Andrew Kloster, Lisa Fandel, Jenni Olsen, Jake Silverberg, Mike Anderson, Erik Anderson, Jason Brendan, and advisor Mrs. Cheyne, worked on a technical problem in which they had to devise five vehicles, each of which had a specified propultion system that caused it to move. The systems to be used were: air, mechanical energy, electrical vibrations, and a free choice (they chose another mechanical). Each car had to move 20 feet and pop a balloon, and one car had to climb three stairs. The students performed a play about Santa needing a new sleigh to make the competition more fun, and it gained them points. Last years O.M. students took second place in the world!

Odyssey of the Mind is for creative students with excellent problem solving abilities who are ready for a challenge. As Andrew Kloster stated, "It is a fun activity where you can let yourself go crazy".

As the year comes to a close, Forest Lake High School will always have the memories from their past and the goals for their fu-





















Experience shows that students enroll in a for-

Student council helps to let the good times roll, and the memories last forever.











Many of these students do more than just walk the halls, they contribute to the needs of the faculty.









Peers Supporting Each Other Circle Of Support




Members of circle of support go quickly about their business. Not loudly or visibly, but listening and supporting others, often using new strategies for listening.

















Pushed To The Limit

A majority, if not all the dances, are made up by the team themselves. They put their hearts into the dances in order to entertain the crowd and be wonderful symbols of our school.










The 1992-93 hockey season was picked by many to be another bad season, but wins over St. Bernards, Centennial,


a balanced mix of young and experienced talent.








PAIN IS TEMPORARY, PRIDE IS FOREVER

Coach Mark Carlson, for the last three seasons has turned the Forest Lake swimming program around from a losing team to a more successful team he has formed today.







Astronomical. Great. Excellent. These are words which describe the Forest Lake Speech Team. The team has outshined the rest for a number of years, giving the program an aura of excellence in the league. One mark of excellence is winning the region championship for twelve consecutive years. Also Forest Lake holds numerous Minnesota State High School League records. The team is also tied for second in the state for the most medals won by a school in a single year by earning ten in 1989, '91, and '92. After summing up all these medals, the team has come up with the second most in the state, totaling 84. The individuals who make up the team also have gained countless championships. Forest Lake and Apple Valley are neck-and-neck for the most state individual championships in a single year (five in 1989, three in 1990, and four in 1991). To top that off, the team holds the distinct honor of the most individual championships by a school in all contests, gaining a grand total of 28, ahead of second place Apple Valley by seven.

So much goes into winning these honors, in the form of hard work and dedication; writing, practicing, speaking, and more practicing. The members practice in ways that seem different to most, but are common doings for them. Members speak into a mirror, or talk to some inanimate object, such as a wall, all the while improving on little things that may stand in the way of excellence. After all, the speech team's motto is, "Excellence is the goal, winning is the bonus." Excellence has become a tradition for them, and tradition is a very big part of

One way tradition is carried on is a Thursday night all-team practice. On Thursday nights, the whole team gets together to have a "mass union of

usually call on some unsuspecting person to give their speech to the whole group." Another ritual is Mrs. Bendix's yearly "Go get 'em gang!" speech, a brilliant motivational talk that gets the kids to strive for their best. It's like the typical, "There's the door," speech with a certain tanginess. The pep-talk is a factor that the kids expect, and something must be wrong if they don't get it. Another factor in the speech program is Ralph C.

Streeter's legacy. He was an assistant coach to the team for 25 years until his death in September of 1987. He was described by Coach Bendix as having a, "deep, robust laugh, a brilliant sense of humor, a love of language, and he loved arguing. . .(he was) a stable factor." From evidence it can be extracted that R. C. Streeter was an all around great person. His memory lives on as an award at the Forest Lake Tournament; the R. C. Streeter Excellence in the Spoken Arts Award given to a coach worthy of it.

As in any group, the speech team members are close-knit because they all have one thing in common, they love language and love to compete. The instinct of competition has brought these kids a long way. Not only that, but one junior member, Jessica Warning, revealed the recipe for much of the excellence they put forth. "Good coaching, concentration, and confidence." Sarah Anderson said, "Late night and early mornings, and insanity is acceptable."

With thirteen different events, it is no wonder that so many kids do so well. Since the team joined the National Forensic League in 1983, they have sent 48 speakers to the national tournament, which is almost unheard of in the NFL. So far the team has had two national champions with Heidi Zapzalka in 1989 (Humerous Interpretation) and Valerie Marsh in 1987 (Prose Interpretation). Nationally, Forest Lake has been in the top 20 almost

A sign hangs in Mrs. Bendix's classroom that says it all for this team. "Going for great," is all it reads. It means that good is not good enough, and the kids must, in Mrs. Bendix's words, "Continue to move forward. We should uphold a tradition of excellence not by basking in the glories of the past, but rather by being inspired by the past and going for great - always."










