


Change has always been inevitable, but this year everything is changing. From lunch tickets and classes to a new principal. Thus, the theme for this year's book; the sound of change.



Students are curious about what Mrs. Kluznik thought about the Forest Lake school district. We thank her for taking the time to answer our questions. Q: Why did you choose to apply at Forest Lake Senior High rather than another district? A: Forest Lake has a good reputation of being a super community. It has strong academic and athetic programs. Q: What are your short and long term goals for Forest Lake? A: My goals in short term in Forest Lake is to get more involved with the student body, staff, and parent community. I think we need to know whats going well around us, and whats not, we need to enhance. We need to all look at our strengths and grow. Q: What do you hope to accomplish at Forest Lake in the presective of curriculum and activities? A: I like to see opportunity for all the students to get involved either with sports, fine arts or clubs. Getting students involved helps make them part of the community. Q: How does Forest Lake Senior High differ from your past experience? A: In the past I've worked at both junior high and senior high schools as a teacher and administrator. No matter where, students are students. For me the only change here is not dealing with a Freshman class. Q: What progress have you gained on working toward non-violence in the schools? A: A lot of good things are going on at Forest Lake with the programs. I think we should take a stand, and get people to work together toward the same subject. The best way to go about doing this is to set common goals.

A: I think because she's around more and aware of what students expect, she may make a few changes and influence the students opinion of school.

Students bring their money to school and deposit it into an account. The computer then keeps track of the amount and automatically subtracts the cost of your lunch when you punch in your PIN, personal identification number.

Also new this year, students are allowed to purchase extra entrees with their meals. In this case students can ask the cook for another serving of their choice and when they pay, at the end of the line, the additional entree is added to the price of lunch. 
SPIRIT

A)"We miss our family, friends, and the food! The food is so much better back home."




The Final Chapter





The Votes Are In Seniors Cast Their Ballots



Ranger gymnast, Rebecca Huntosh, participated in state, but due to an injury early in competition she was unable to finish.


Swimmers Brian Gay, Jeremy Wendt, Aaron Maki, and Trevor Dahnke qualified for state in the 200 medley relay.








Back Again !!!



The team may have had a disappointing season, but they stuck together all the way through.












OJT teachers, Mrs. Wiley and Mr. Wilson, want students to know that the class is a great way for all students to find and experience jobs which interest them. They also think OJT is a great economic and educational experience for students. Chad Whiting says, "I think it helps kids learn how to adapt to the work place and it teaches you what your rights are in the workplace, which most kids do not know."

While in OJT class, students cover many areas ranging from consumer skills, taxes, banking, and job hunts, to learning how to get along with your employee or employer. Students also practice writing resumes, filling out applications, and interviews. Whiting also says, "I can handle a checkbook without errors, I can do my taxes by myself. I know my rights in the workplace better because Mr. Wilson pushes you to do your best at school and work."

Depending on the amount of credits an OJT person has, they leave school after fourth, fifth, or sixth hour. The fewer credits they have the later they leave. Students work at jobs ranging anywhere from fastfood, secretarial, gas station, retail or mechanics.

This year's "Yearbook Camp" took place during the last week of June, at St. John's University in St. Cloud. Camp offers hands on opportunity for staffs to get a head start on actual production of their yearbooks.

Volume 56 of the Forest Lake Senior High **Forester** was printed by the Taylor Publishing Company of Dallas, Texas. All Pages are printed on die-cut finished 80 lb. enamel paper. This year's cover is dual textured with a leather look called whirlpool, with a foil stamp containing artwork.

1492 Forest Lake Senior High students were pictured in this year's **Forester**. The yearbook contains 192 pages of both black and white and color photos. 54 ads were sold bringing in around \$2,000 toward reducing the price of the book. 1,000 copies of Sounds of Change were sold for \$35 each in the month of October. 100 extra copies were ordered for late buyers at the price of \$40. The typeface used in the book was souvenir. The total cost on this year's yearbook was \$35,000.
