




#### Homecoming '94








Mounds View got the ball first in OT and scored a TD. Score: 20 - 13. Rangers' turn. The Mounds View defense played well and

The Rangers won 27 — 26 on a much needed win to up their record to 2 - 2 in the conference.















Forest Lake, a school of academic excellence. Debate, speech, and National Honor Society are among many organizations which helped to build its strong academic backround. The qualified teachers instruct advanced placement classes and college level courses so that the students always have a challenge. To show for this, sixtyeight percent of 1993 graduates went on to higher education after high school.

Last year, forty percent of the juniors took the PSAT and five percent of those students were National Merit Commended students. Forest Lake even had one finalist for the National Merit Scholarship.

Fifty-five percent of juniors took the ACT. Minnesota is in the top ten in the country with ACT scores. Overall, Forest Lake has above average scores for the ACT. Forest Lake also has a very high percentage of graduating seniors.


The students at Forest Lake High School are well prepared for college, and feel like they know what they are getting into. The counselors are very proud to stand behind the academic excellence of their students.

# Community and Schools

#### Communication is Basic

Communication is an important aspect between schools and the public. The Forest Lake school district has found that it is very difficult to communicate with the public on what is happening in the schools. There are many reasons for this. One is the district is large and spread out. In total there are seven elementaries, two-junior highs, and one high school. There are about 18,000 households in the district.


Superintendent Dr. Donald Ruble, says that he felt the district was lacking in communication because it does not have a vehicle to communicate with. There is the Forest Lake Times, which reaches about 3,000 homes. There is also a newspaper called the Messenger which goes to those households in Scandia. This does not nearly cover the 18,000 households that are currently in the district. The local television station covers some of the board meetings, but not all families have the chance to see these coverages due to the fact that it is a cable channel


In order to educate the public on what is going on in the schools, Dr. Ruble encouraged the use of newsletters. One of which is the *Principal's Newsletter*. This goes to the parents of the students at the senior high. The other is the *Superintendents Newsletter* and it goes to every household in the district.


The way these newsletters are put together is.... A letter is sent to all the schools in the district asking them for feedback on the good things taking place in their schools. The schools then send back articles that they want in the newsletter. Carol Johnson takes these articles and wordprocesses them. From there they go to William Somrock and Jill Somrock. Together they take the articles and any pictures they have and they put together the actual layout of the newsletter. Last year was the first year with the new format, designed to resemble a newspaper. Along with the newspaper format, came more pictures.

Dr. Ruble feels that the best way of enhancing communication between the schools and the public would be assigning one person the job. This person's responsibility would be going to the different schools and getting information on the good things taking place. Afterwards that person would relate the news to the public.

Communication between the schools and the public is gradually improving. The newsletters are a great start and hopefully more improvements will follow.









# Scheduling

#### Planning For the Future





When choosing your classes at the senior high there is a lot to consider. There is the possibility of post secondary, which many of the Forest Lake students take part in. Students need to have an idea about what interests them so that they have a direction in which to head. Students also must keep in mind their requirments and number of credits needed for graduation.

For an average student coming from one of the two junior highs, registering for classes at the senior high can be frustrating. Students in the ninth grade receive information on registration from their social studies teachers. The senior high counselors preview all the registration procedures with the students at the junior high, The social studies teachers then help their students with a three year plan. Two weeks later the counselors come back and make sure students have enough credits and are taking their required courses.

Students new to the district are required to take a reading test and bring a copy of their transcript from their former school. The next step is taking the reading test. This takes about an hour and a half. After the test is finished the student meets with his/her counselor. Together they choose the student's classes. In all, the time spent with the counselor is about an hour. New students are then given a tour of the building by the circle of support students. After their tour they are assigned a locker and a PIN number for lunch.

For both new and old students in the district there is a lot to consider when choosing classes. When looking into post secondary a student must have a GPA of 2.0 for seniors and 2.5 for juniors, and their credits must be on track for graduation. Course load should be carefully considered when going to college. No more than four classes are encouraged to be taken at one given time. Students can also consider going to high school part time and college part time.

Students choosing high school classes are frustrated at times, but it still should be carefully considered. There are a lot of choices and opportunities at Forest Lake High School.

# Welcome Back!







When looking at FFA members, something unusual stands out. These people are caring, considerate, and open-minded. They like to contribute to the community and help people in need.






### Speech

### Debate

The standards for success were set in the 1993-94 season; the returning debators along with the new members far surpassed this with the 1994-95 season. Led by the fearless staff of Dorothy Sunne, Steve Kult, and Andrew Kloster with the addition of Lori Whitt and Don Berry, Pat Cheyne, and Dave Kunnen, the debate team charged onto victory. The season's policy resolution was resolved: that the United States Government should substantially strengthen regulation of immigration to the United States. Michael Kloster, and Sarah Sicheneder took the honor in not only making it to final rounds, a task Flake has not done since 1976, but won final round, something Forest Lake has never done.

The season closed with a supurb finishing at the State Tournament. Christopher Wheatley and Robyn Peterson taking the top honors and the opportunity to debate at the National Tournaments in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

The promise of next year's success is anticipated by all. One of the four captains, Sarah Sicheneder captures the essence of Forest Lake — "A good debate team can be only measured by success in all divisions, judging by those standards, Flake is the most successful team in the state."




### Calgary

Choir is a music elective, it is one of the only classes that can be taken every year while still receiving credit.



### Breeze






### World Languages






### On The Job Training

On the Job Training students concentrate on attendance and punctuality. OJT is offered to help students gain credits, learn job skills, and make money all at the same time.





to the U.S. they take advantage of some of our extracurricular activities such as: Odyssey of the Mind, soccer, and swimming.



It looks like we'll have to wait until next year to see how inexperience will effect the Rangers's success.










The outlook for next year looks great. With an undefeated sophomore squad and a high level of play in the juniors, the team is prepared for victory.





















### Girls

### Cross Country Running


Give 100% of all you've got all the time. Is the motto for the Forest Lake cross country team this season. This year's cross country team has definately been dedicated to giving their all.






# Skiing Downhill






## Syncronized Swimming


### Baseball




# The Orucible by Arthur Miller





Head Coach Greg Patchin commented that he believes "that the 1995 boys tennis team has the potential to be the best."







Volume 57 of the Forester contains 216 pages with a 9 X 12 format. Eleven hundred copies were printed by the Taylor Publishing Company, Dallas, Texas. The pages were printed on 801b enamel paper. The main type face used in this book was Garamond. The cover is lithcote material, with vineyard, gold and black color applied.

Approximately 1,580 Forest Lake Senior High students were pictured in this year's Forester. Seventy ads were sold raising an estimated \$2,600; reducing the amount of the book.

This was the first year that the early bird special was offered for \$35 a book. In mid September the price increased to \$38. One hundred extra books were ordered for people who wished to be put on the waiting list at a cost of \$40 per book. The total cost of this year's book is aproximately \$38,000.
