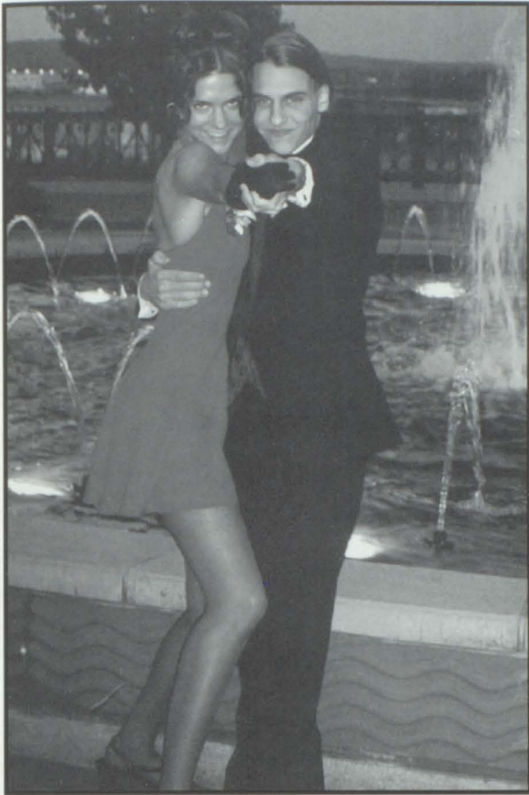

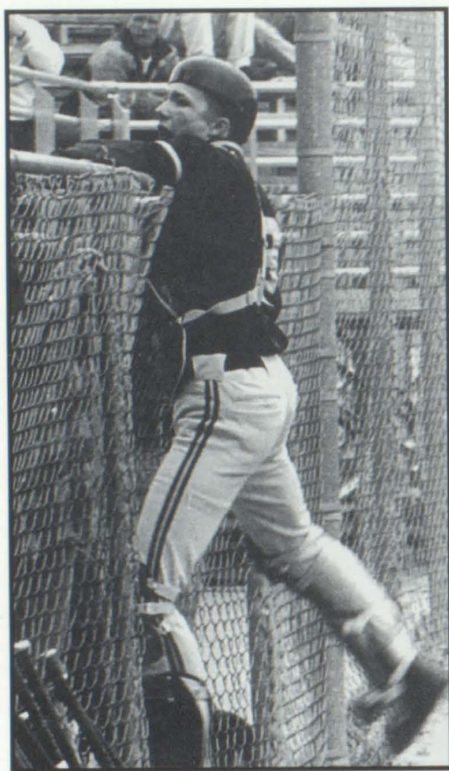
The boys varsity baseball team took second in their conference. They went on to Region 7AA and took first place.

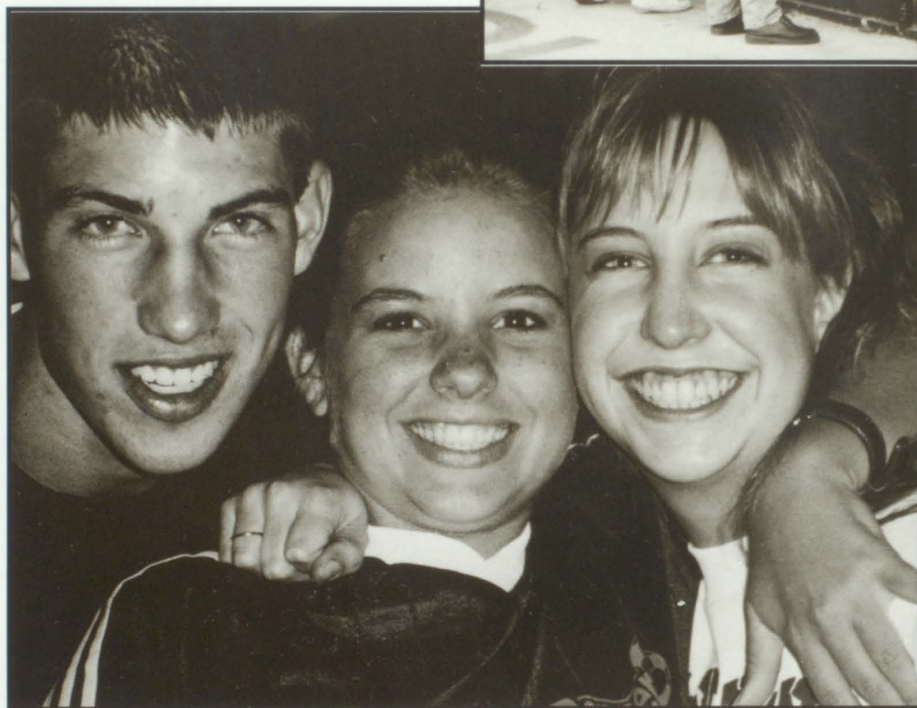

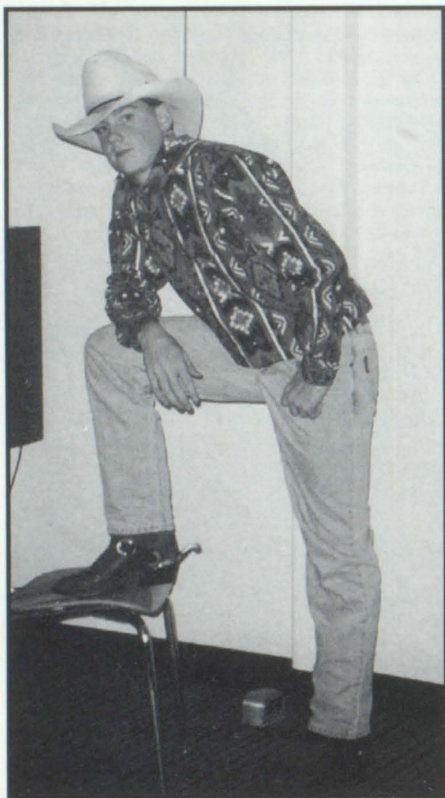

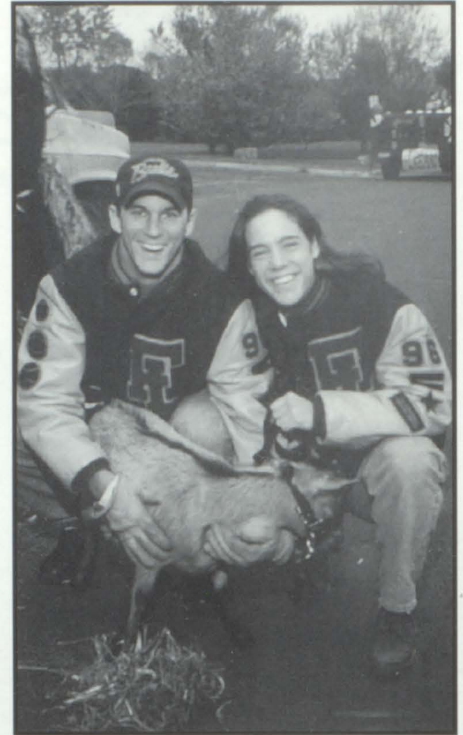

Stillwater began the scoring in the first quarter with a sixty-two yard drive.

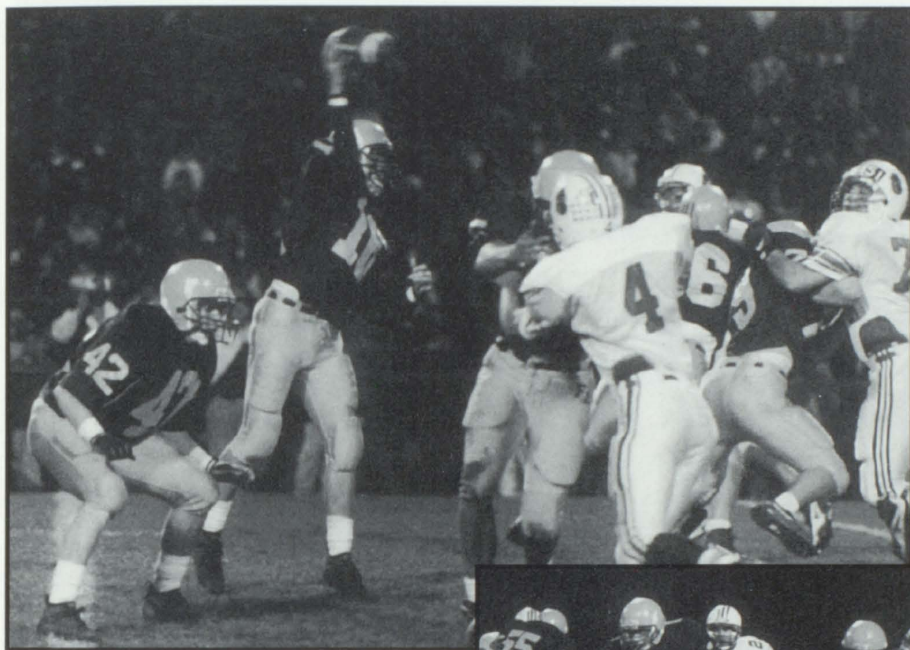

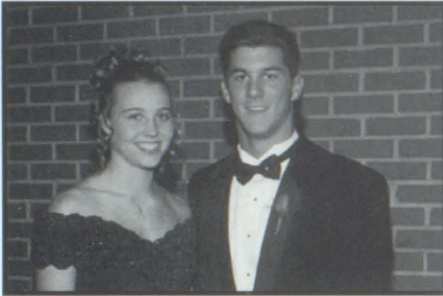

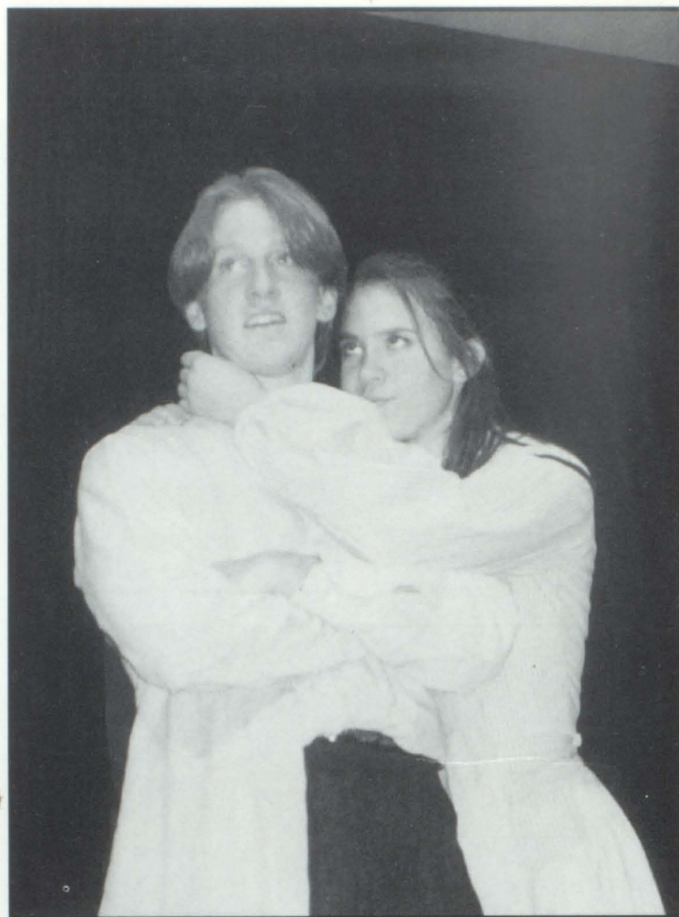

A lot of hard work has gone into making this a great show.

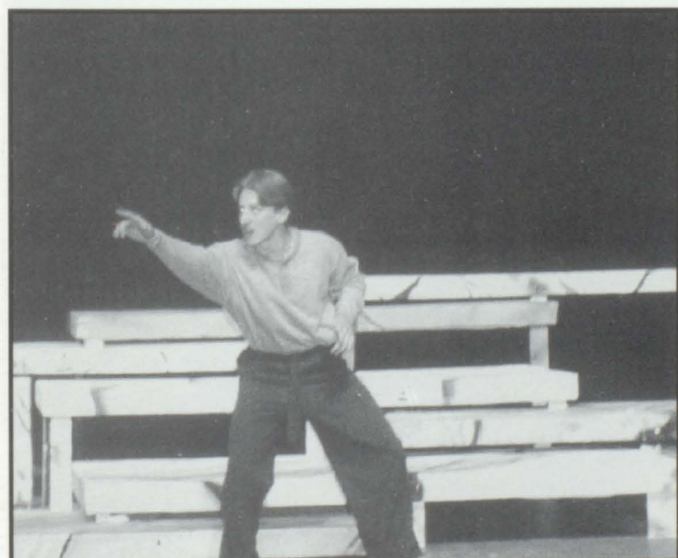

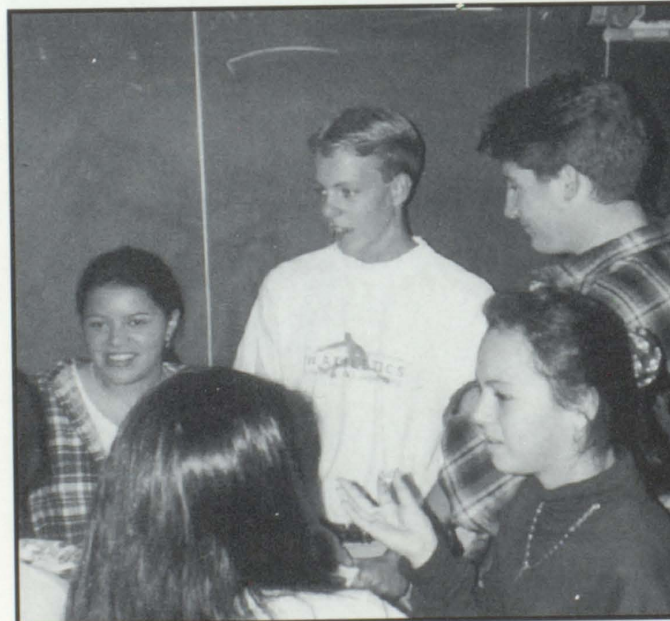
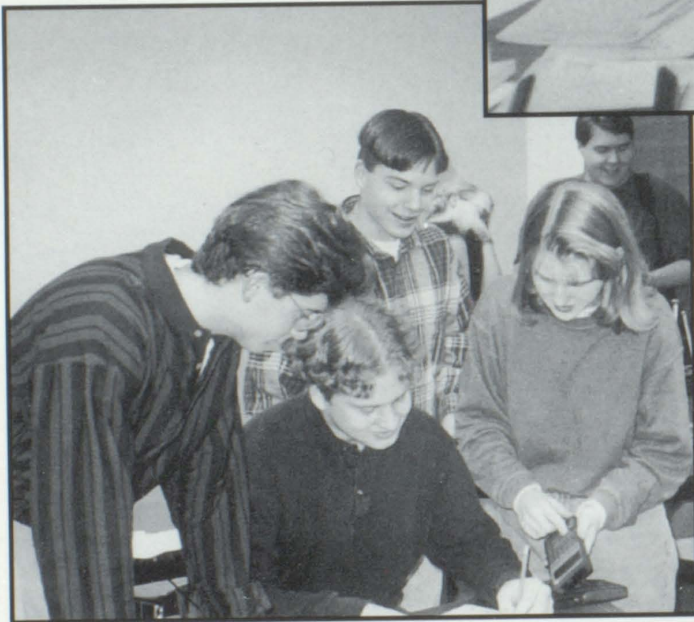
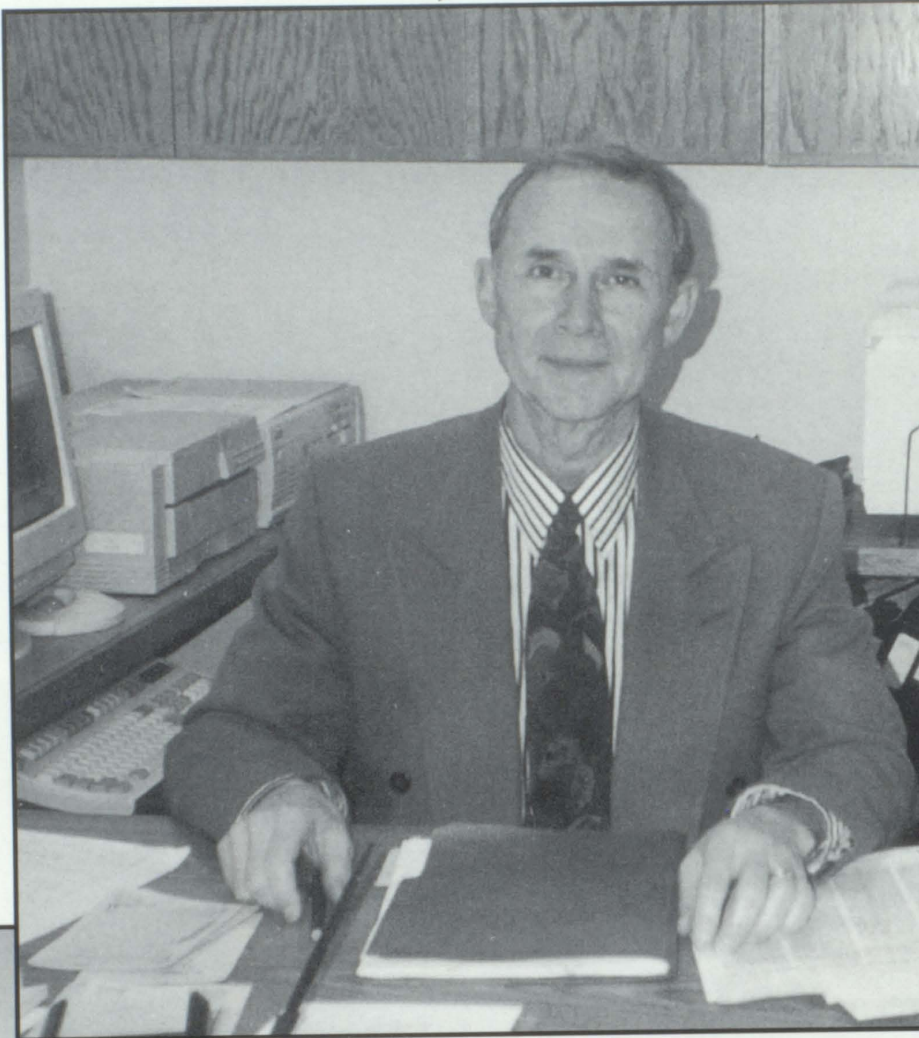
Superintendent Update

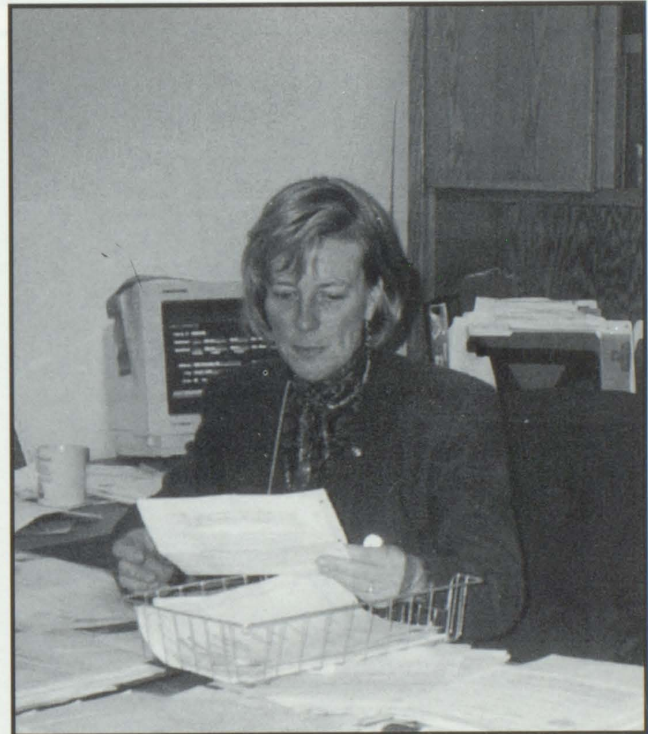
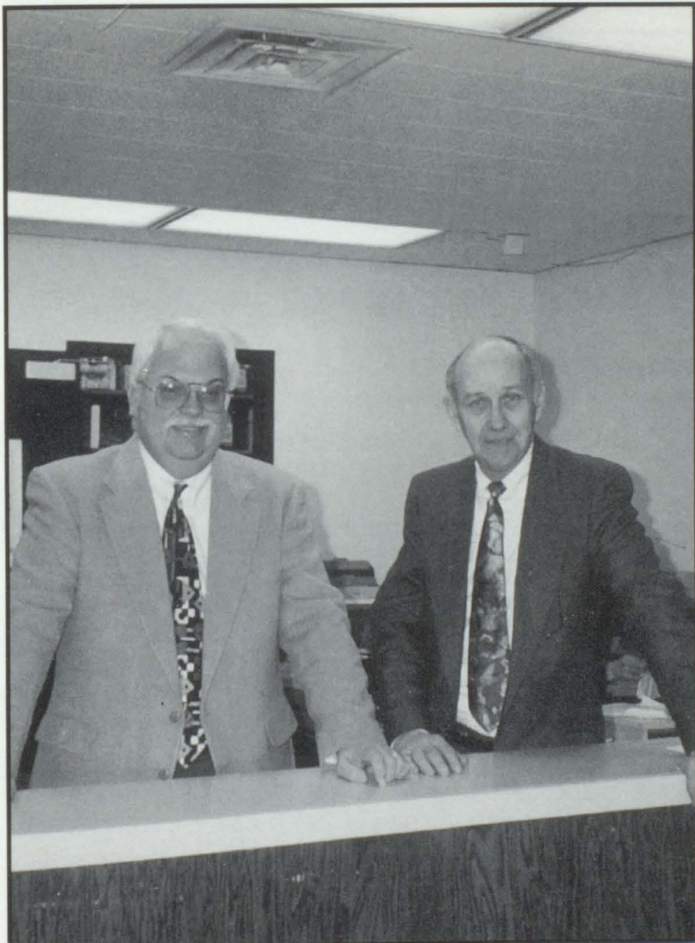
Administration

The industrial arts department consists of woods and drawing. The woods class is taught by Mr. Kevin Rivard and the drawing classes by Mr. Thomas Pogreba.

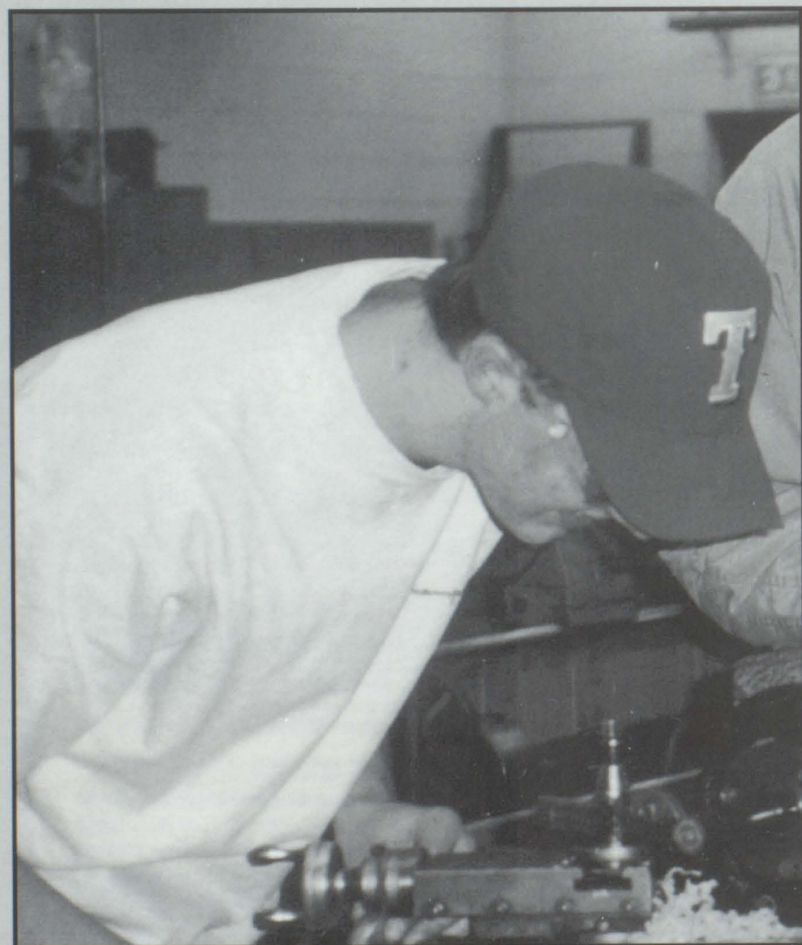
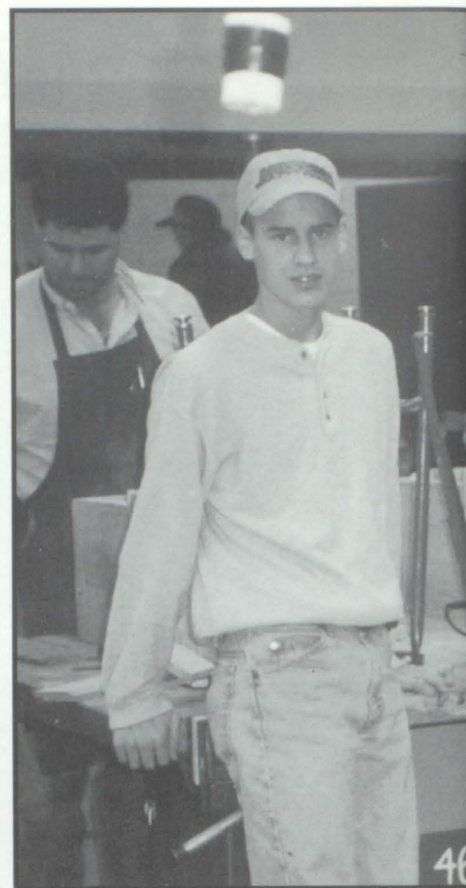

The woods students have several different choices when selecting their projects. Among these are, clocks, tables, cabinets, nightstands, desks, and cedar chests.

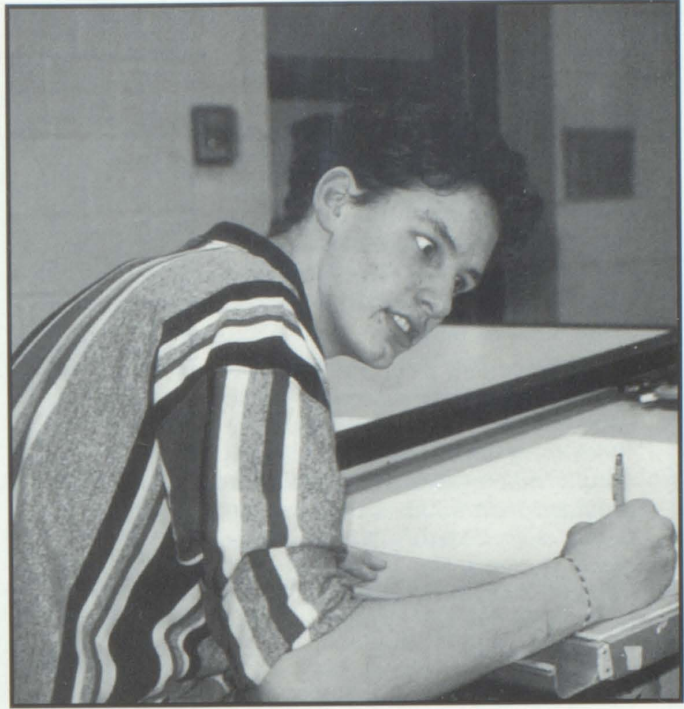
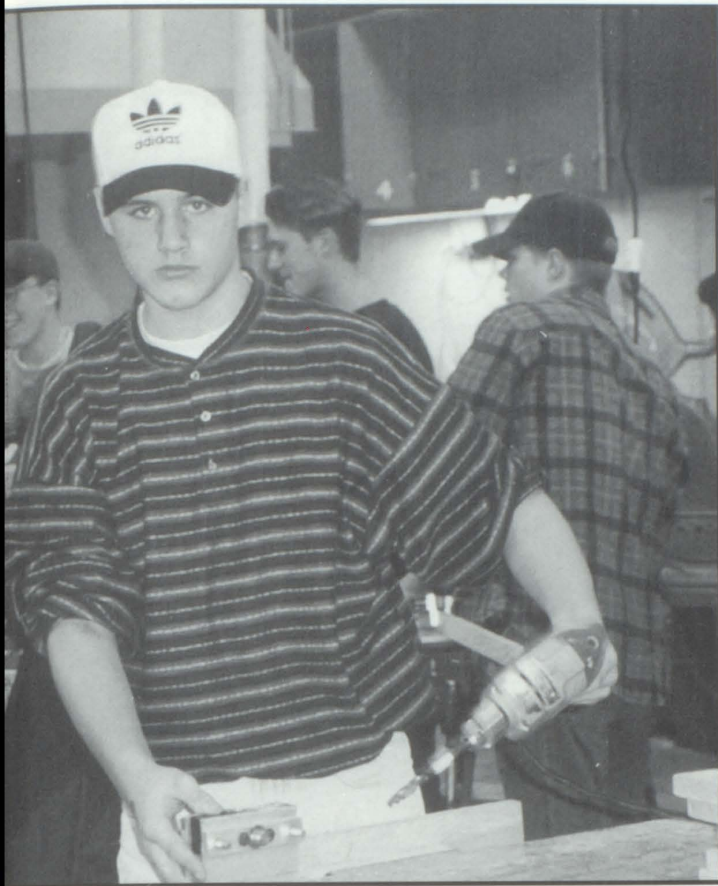
The woods class gives students the chance to explore career options and become more comfortable working with tools. Many students find that after the class, woodworking becomes their lifelong hobby.

This year's metals classes are headed by Mr. Tim Taylor. He teaches metal-working to a number of Forest Lake High School students. His classes prepare students for jobs, vocational school, and college.

No matter what a student's interest is, Mr. Tim Taylor suggests taking a metals class. Students benefit in life from the hard work they do and the job skills they learn. 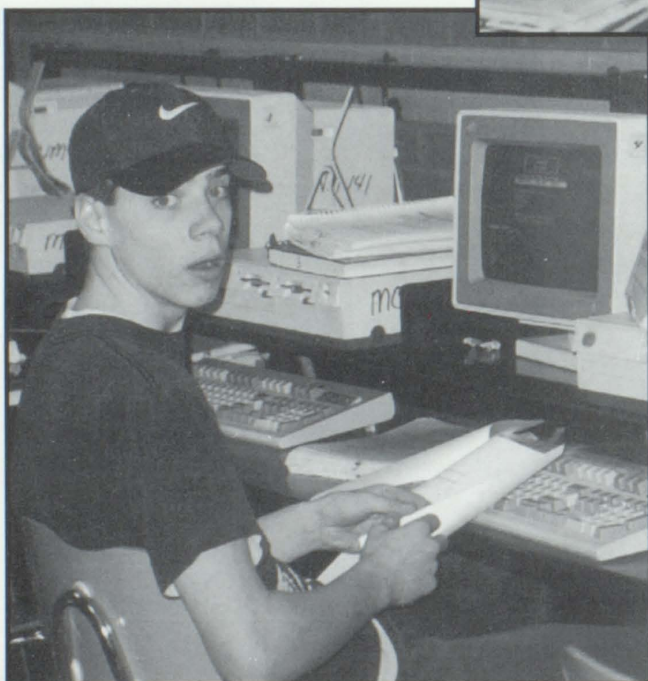
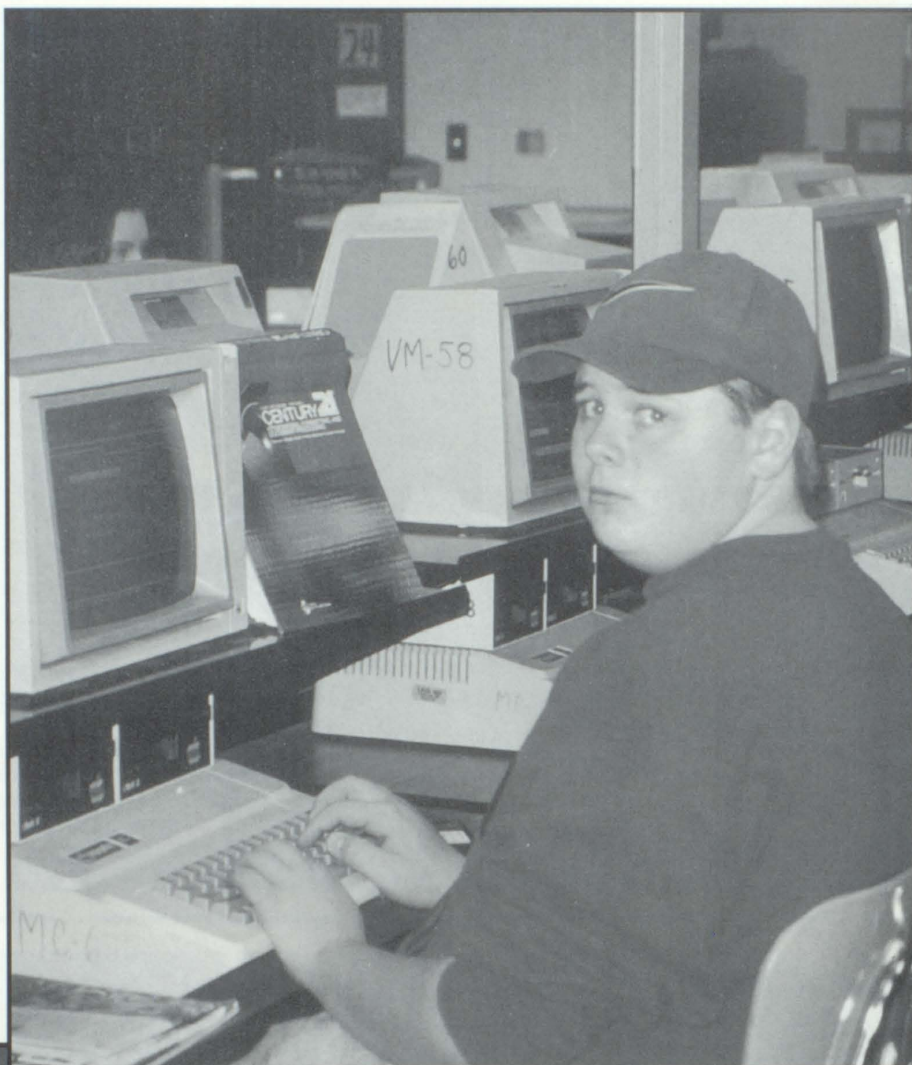
Technology

Life Science

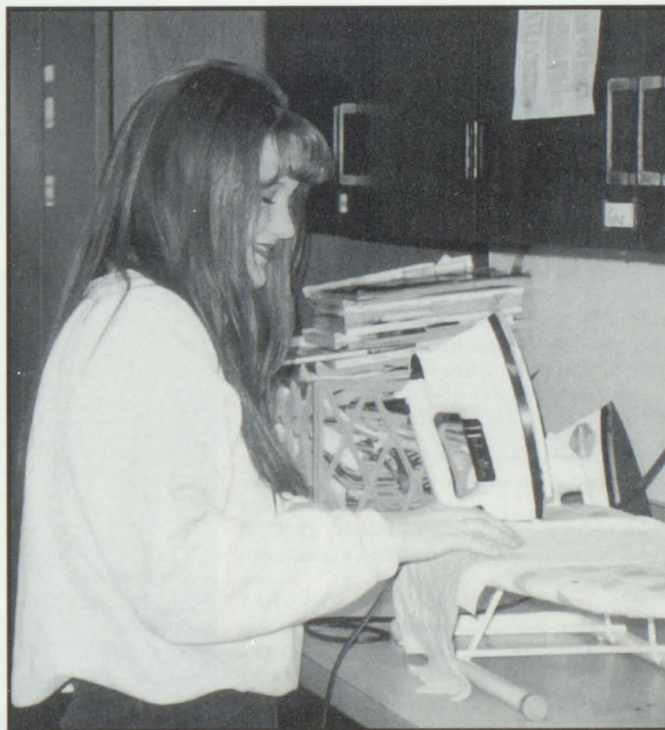
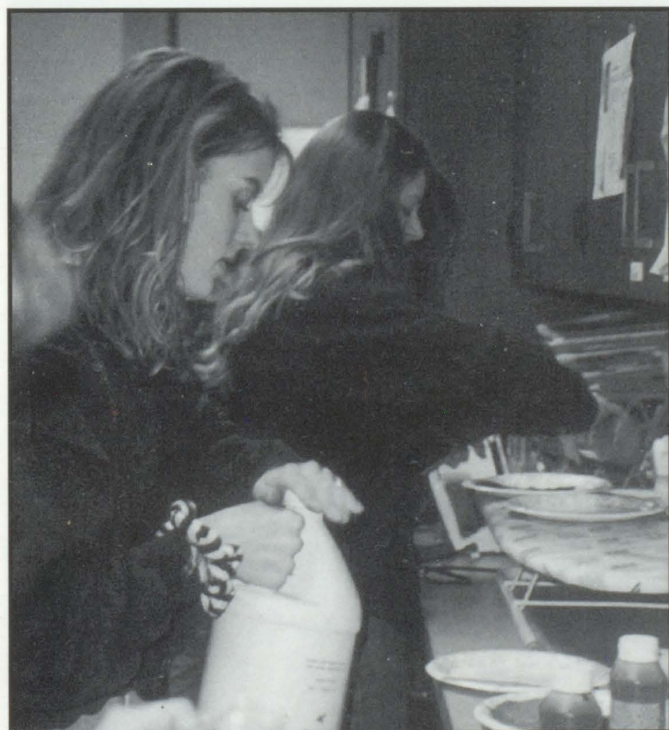

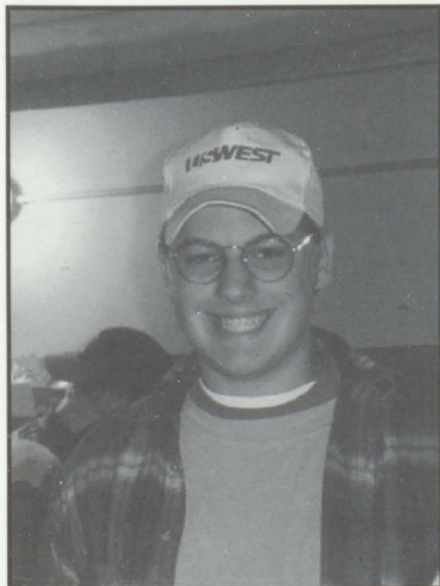

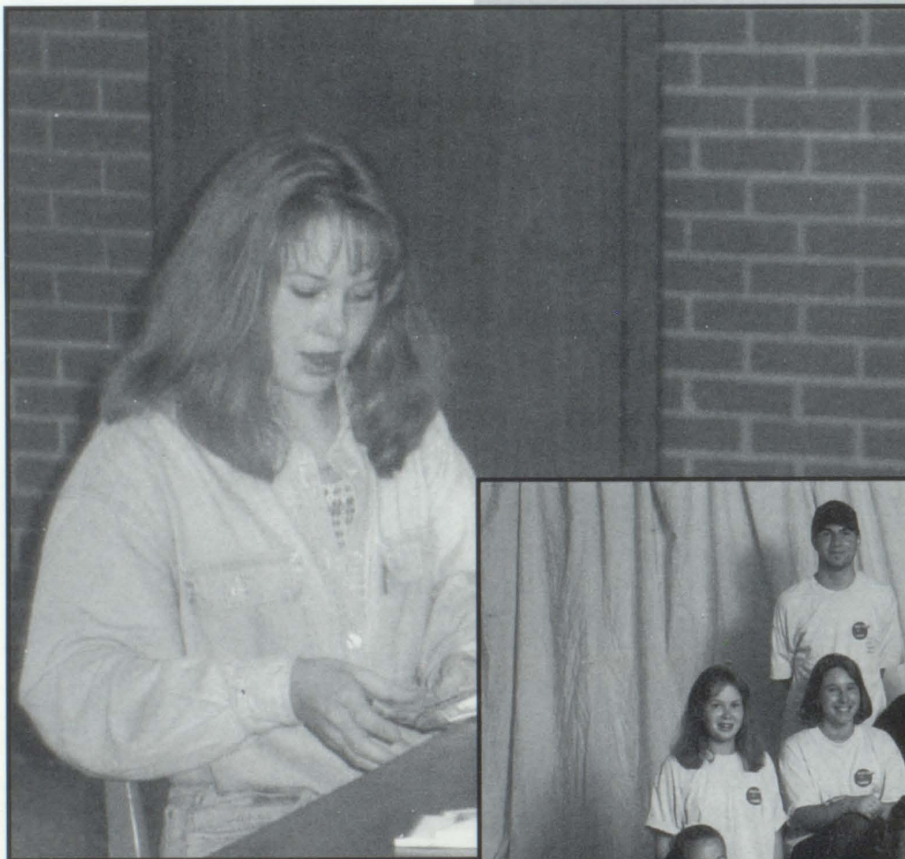
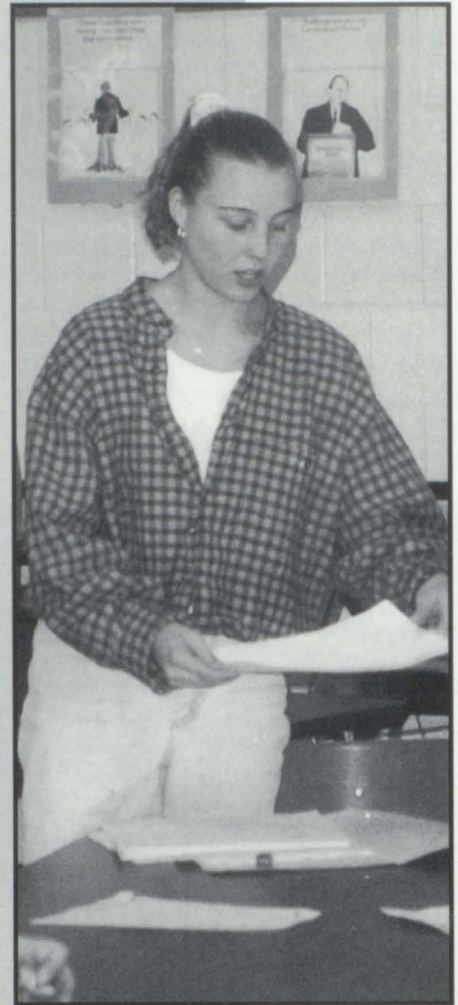

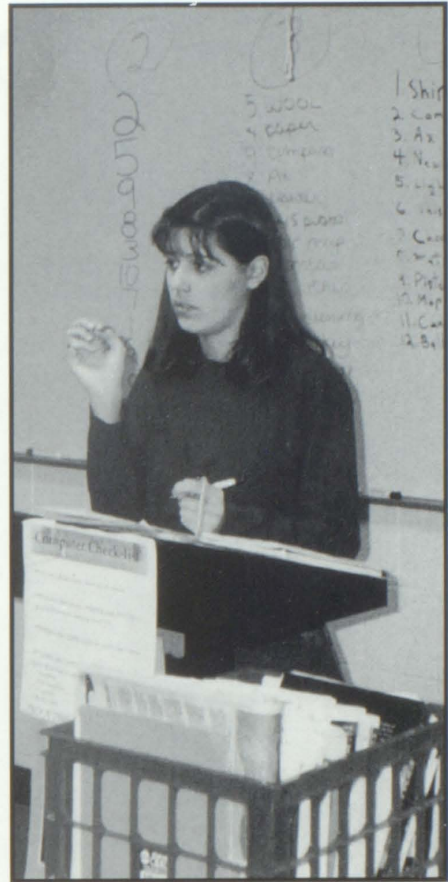
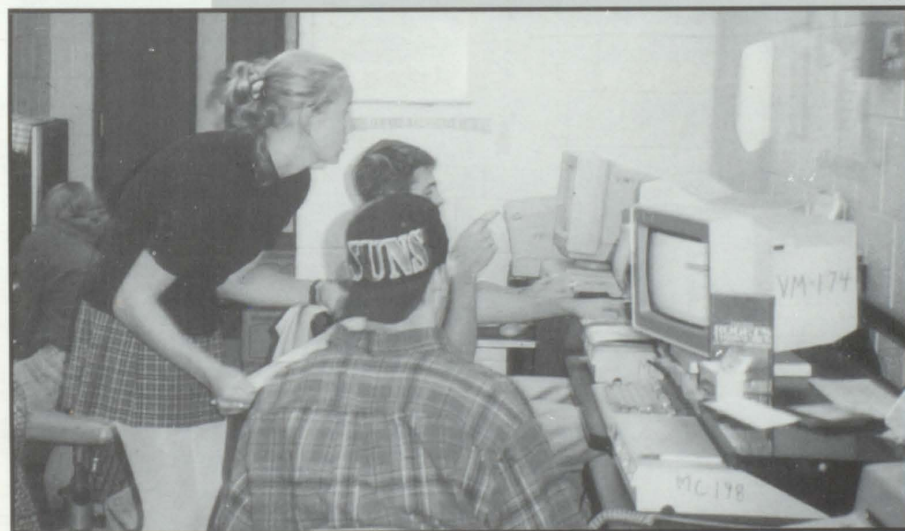

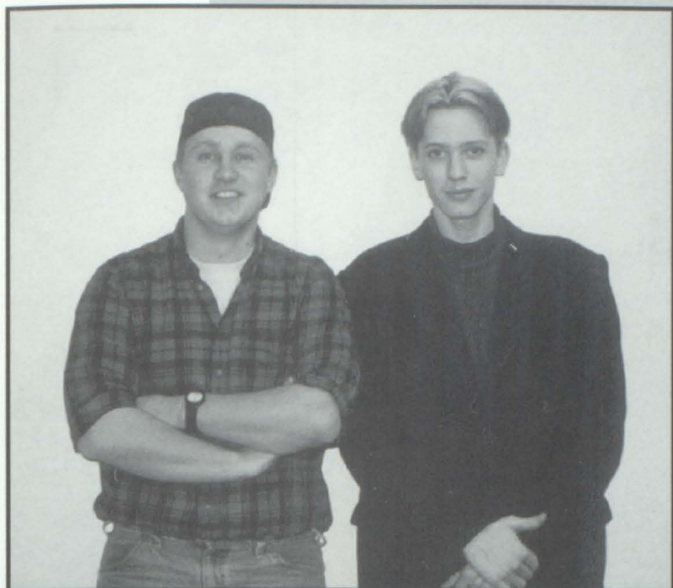

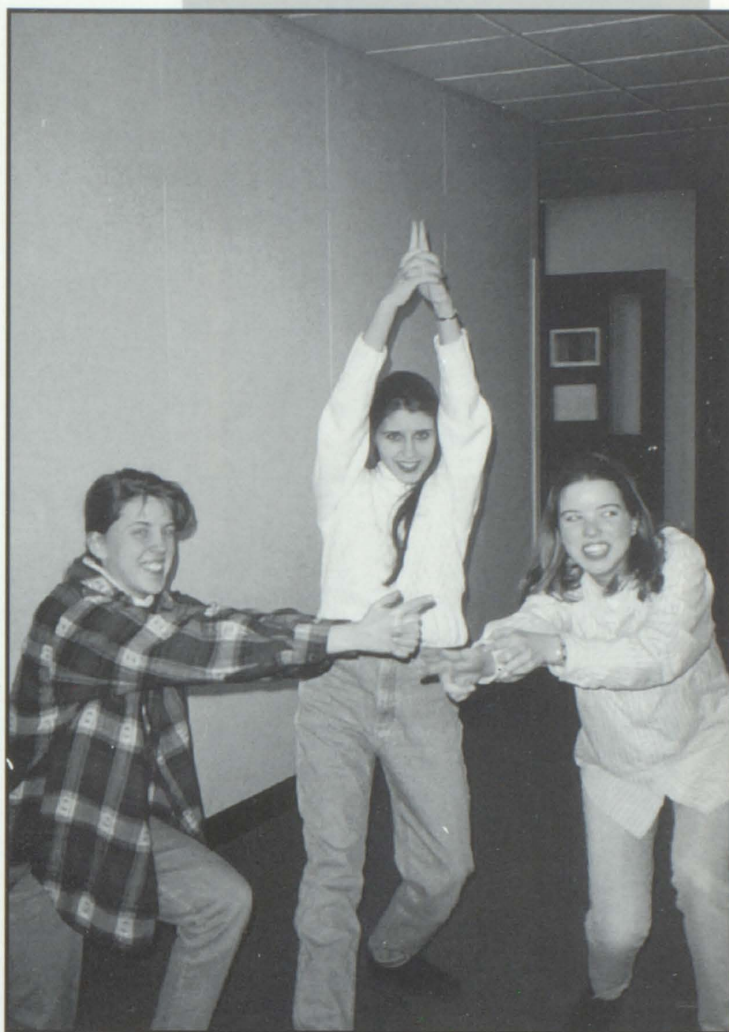

This year's coaching staff consists of first year head coach, Rachel Baumann, assistants Pat Cheyne, and former FLHS debater, Don Berry.

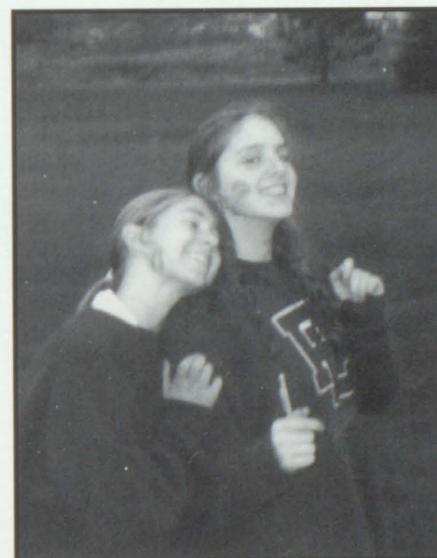

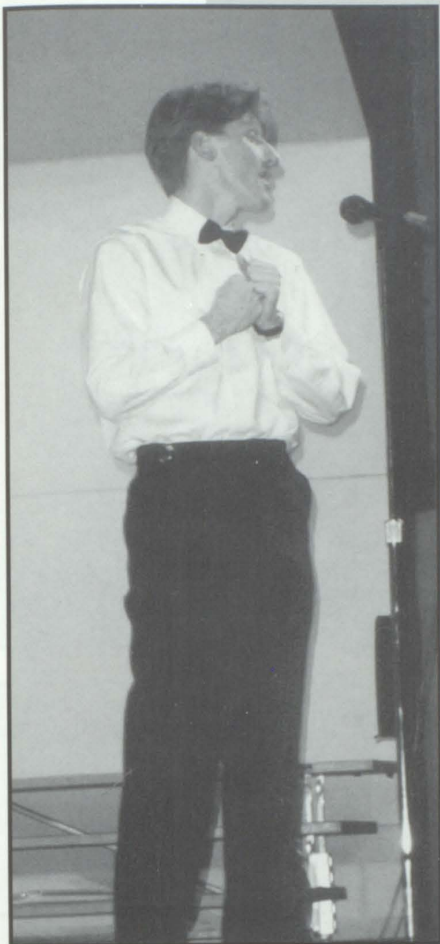


Beat, Rhythm, and Time

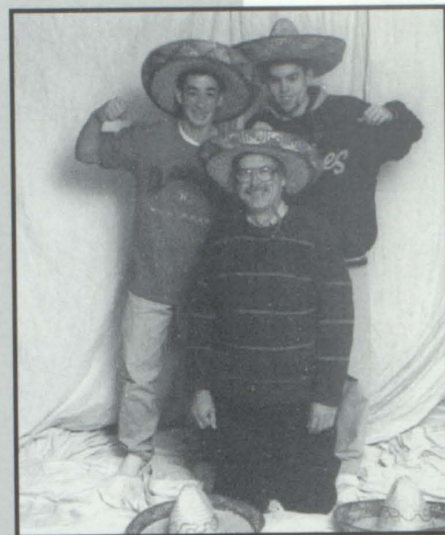

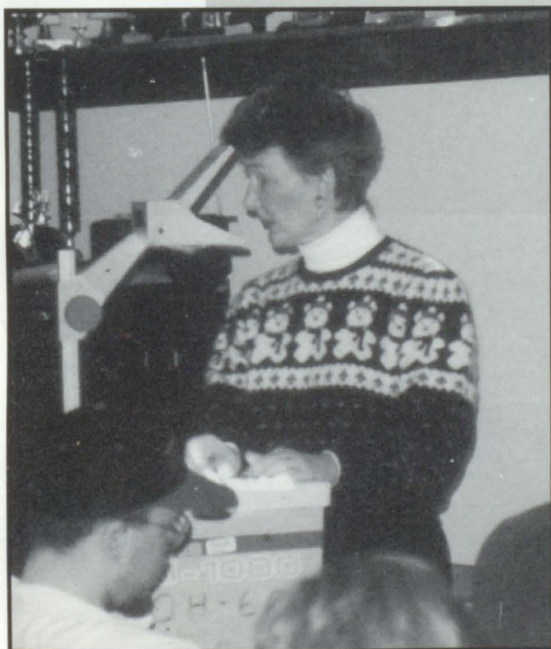


Hands On Learning

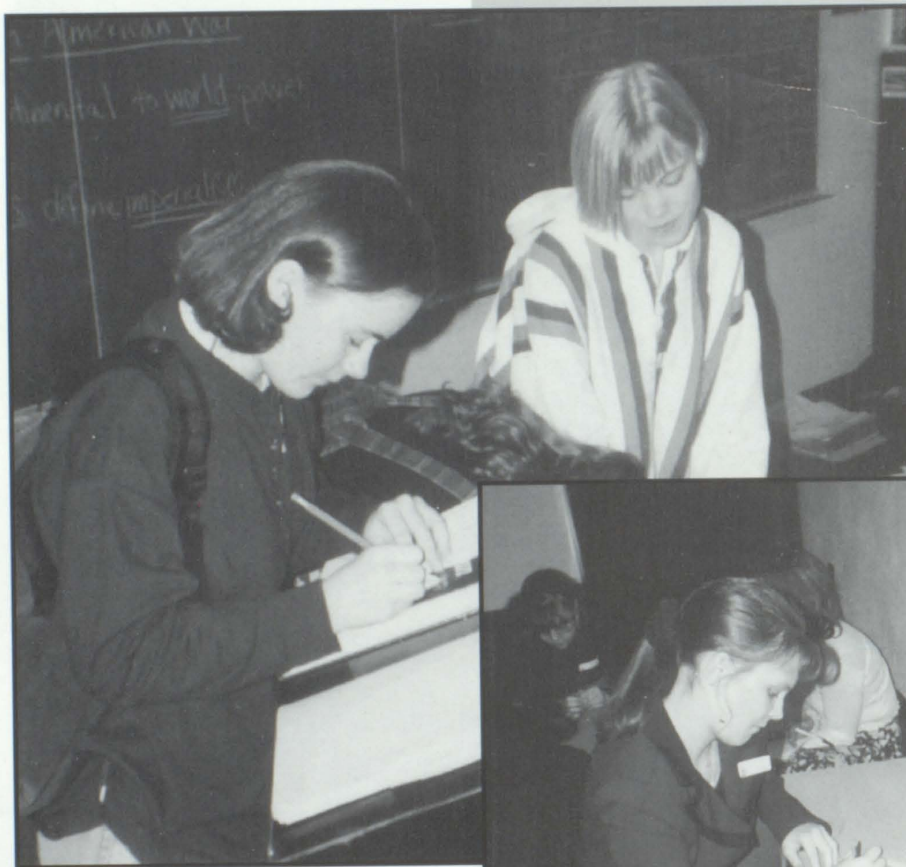
Circle of Support

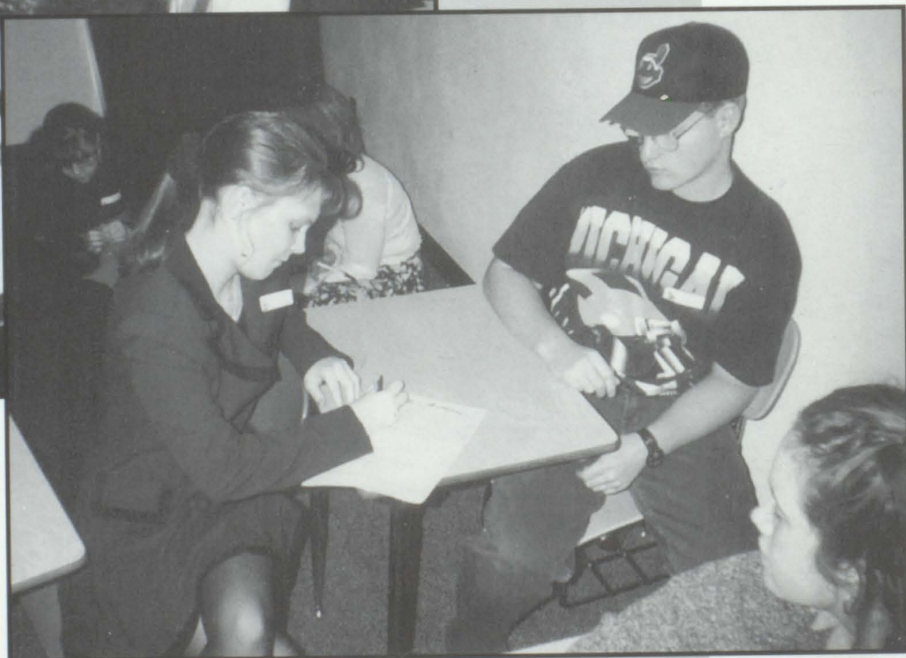
With the strong involvement with the community, this program will continue to expand in both size and support.

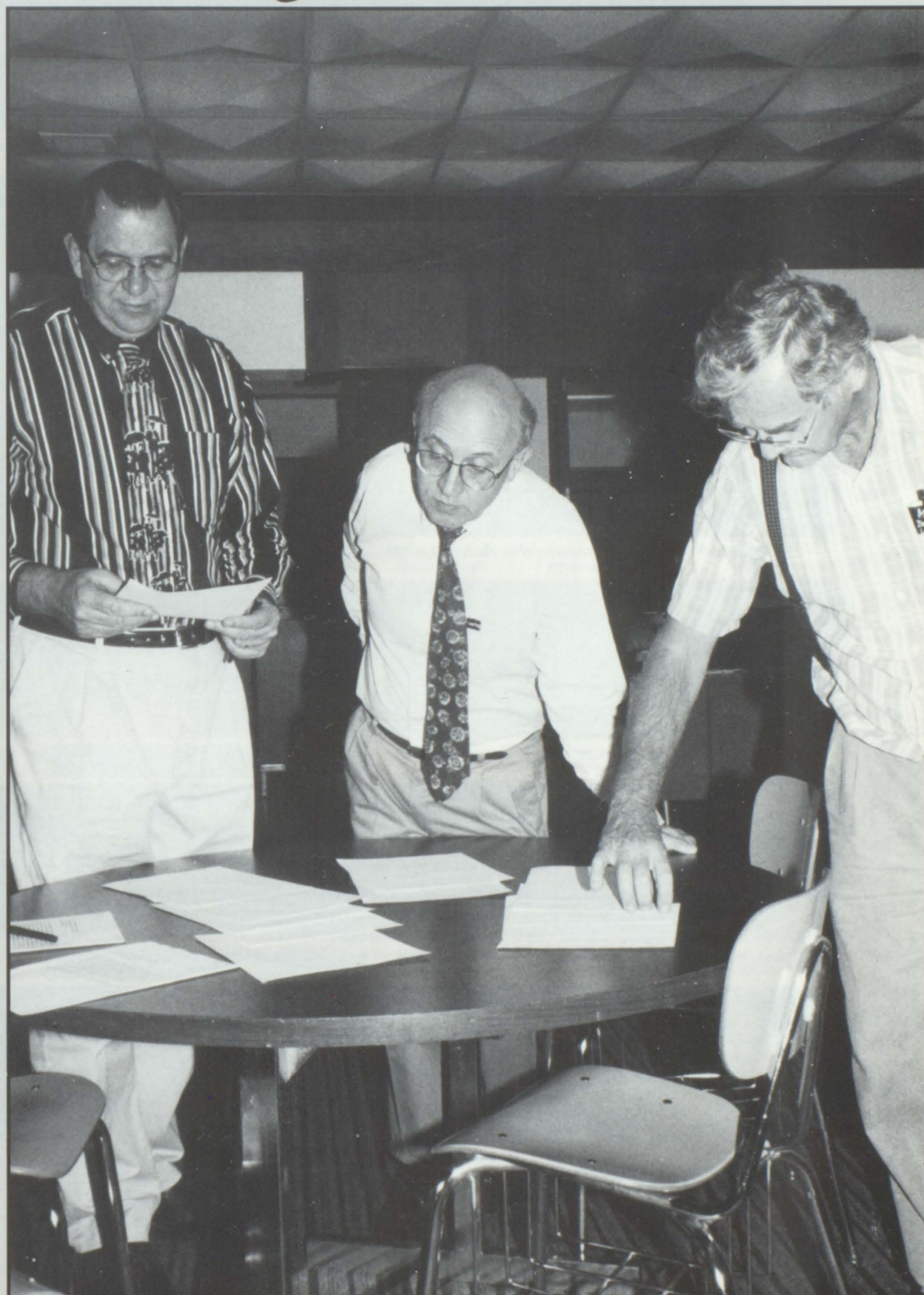

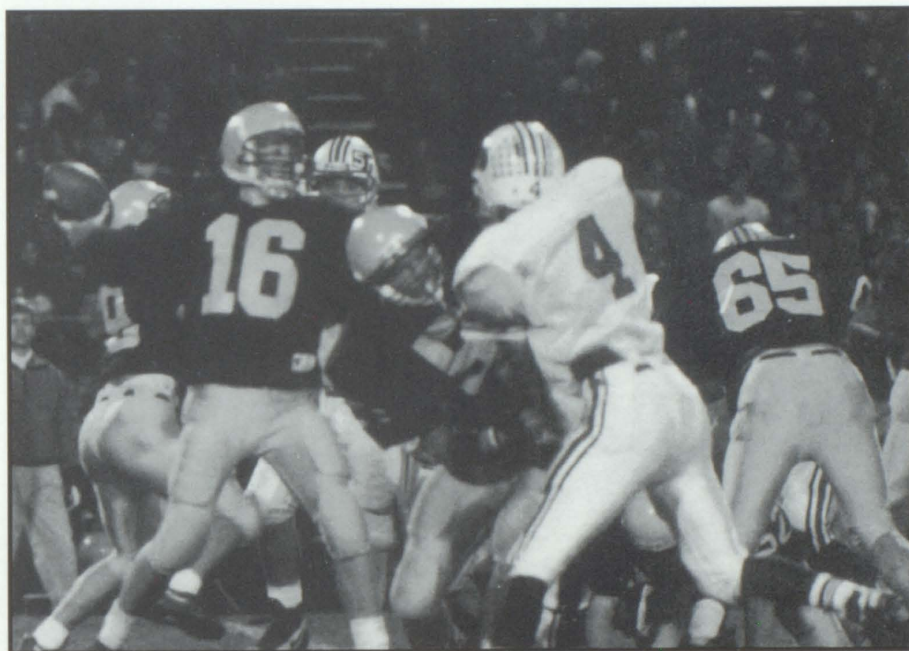
Kicking It Off

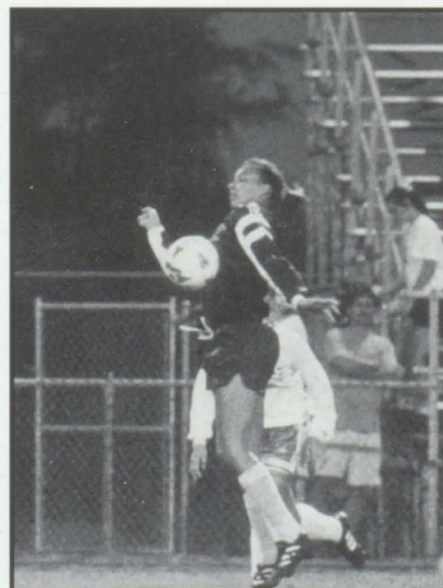

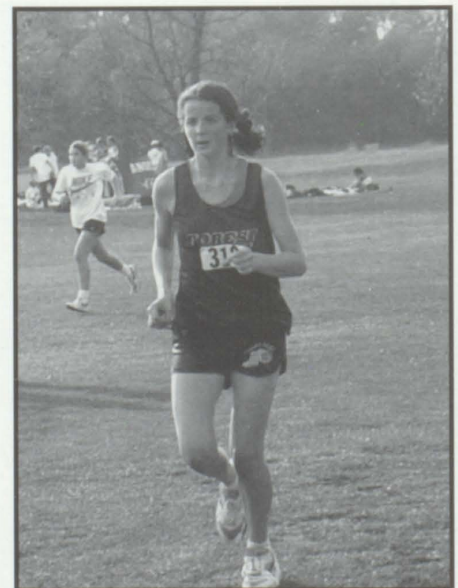

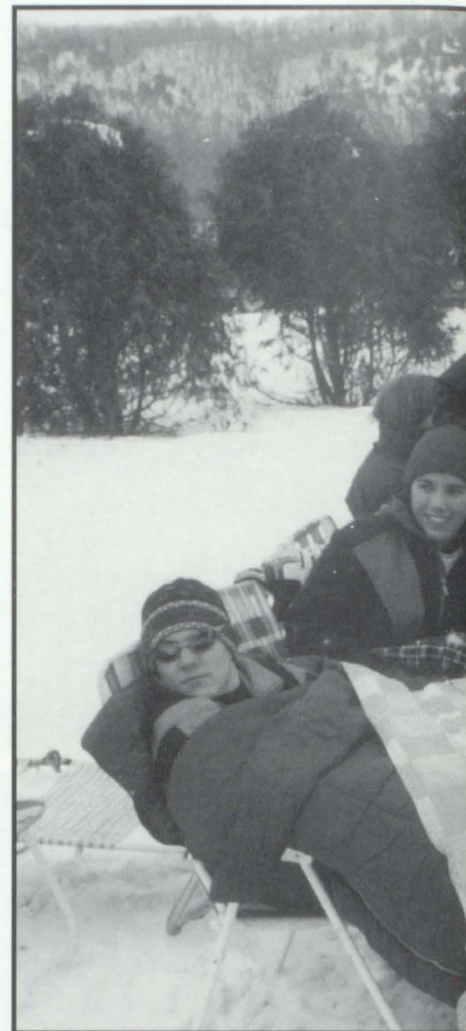
Down Hill Skiing

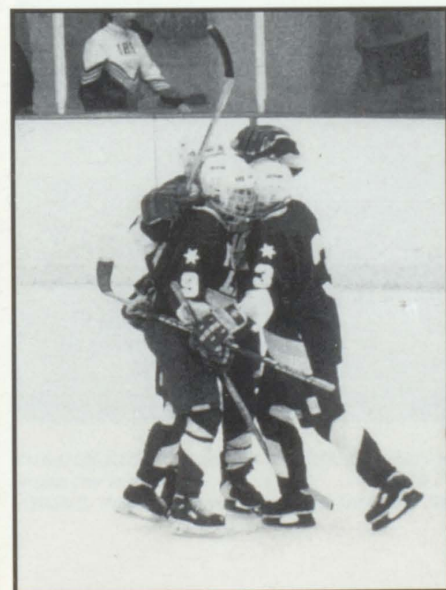

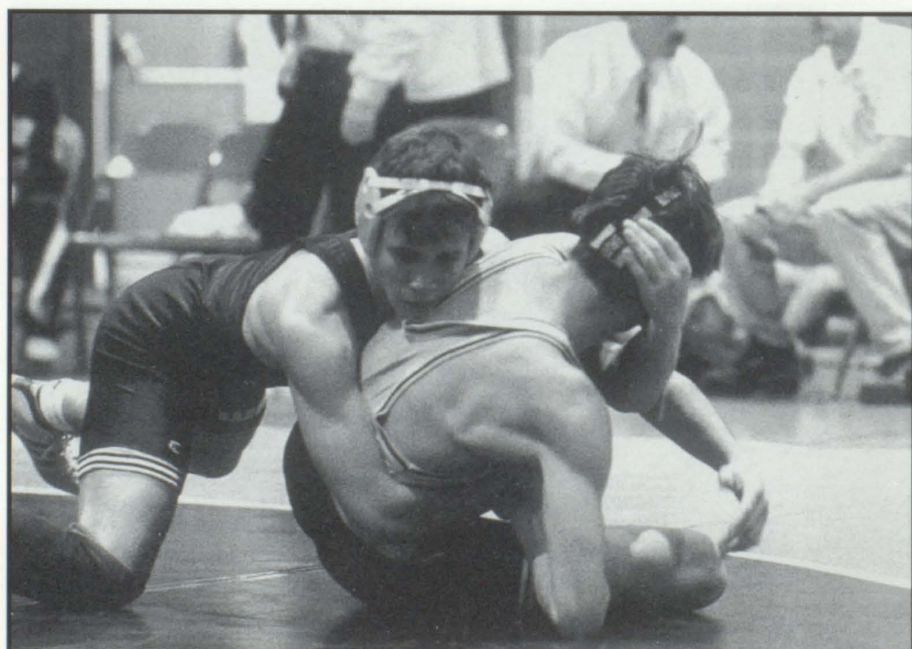
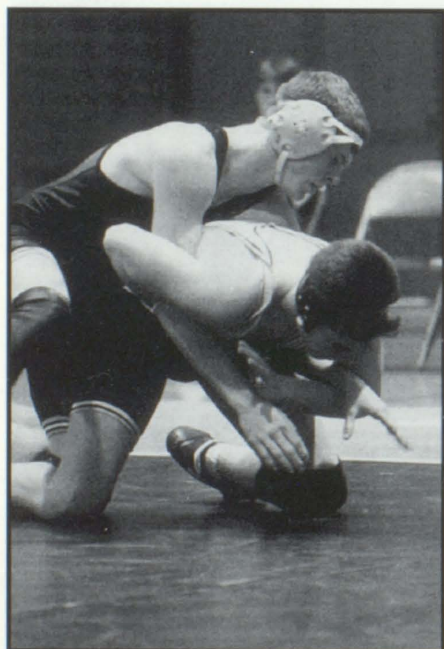
Airborne Rangers

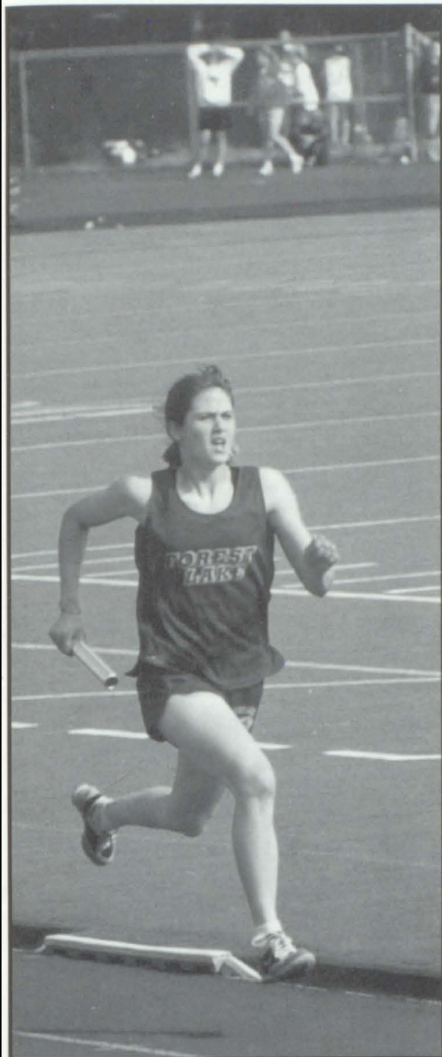

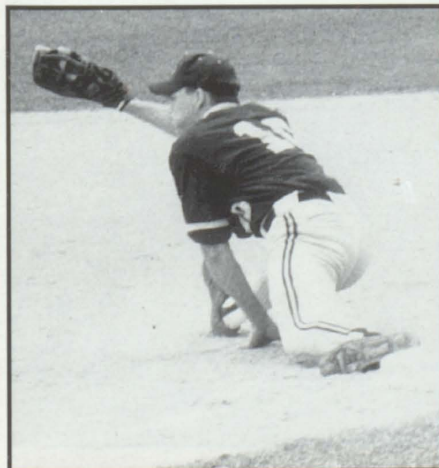
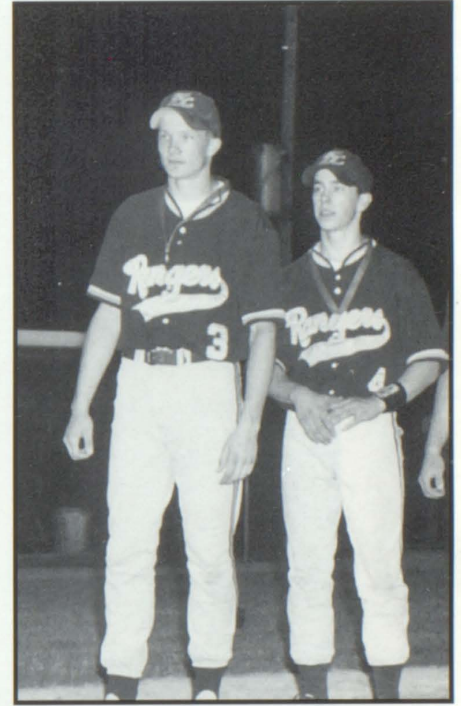


Baseball

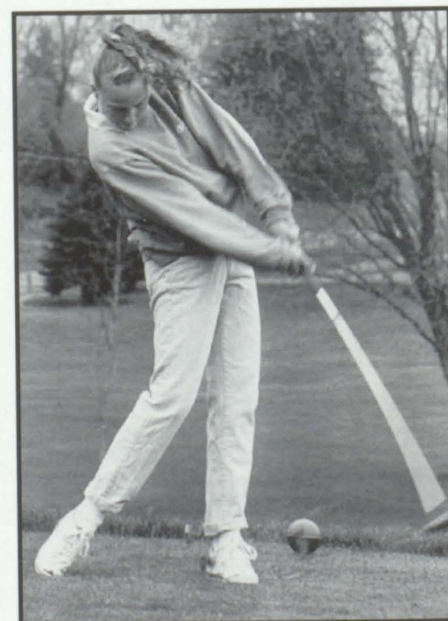

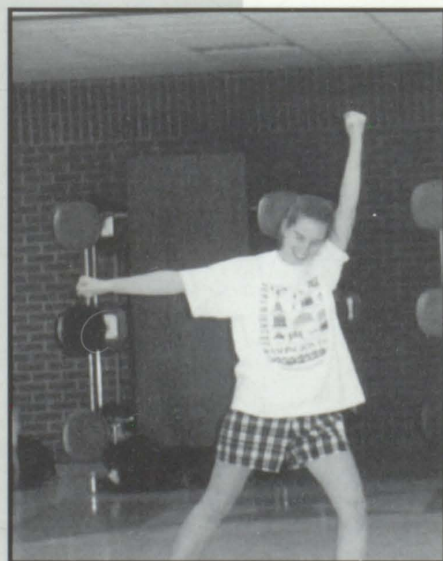

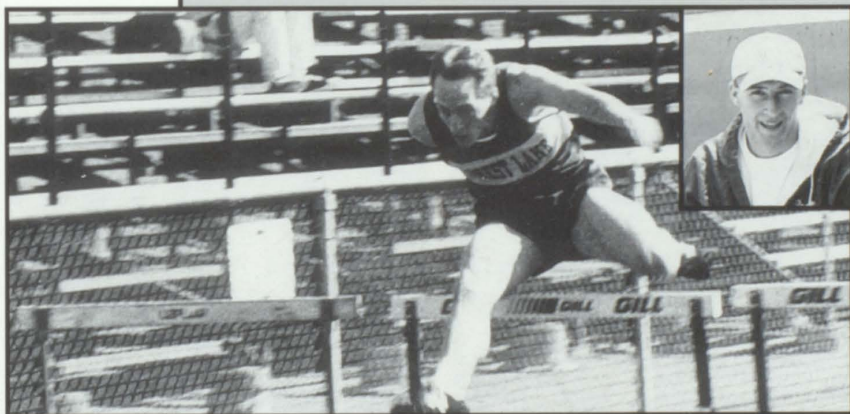

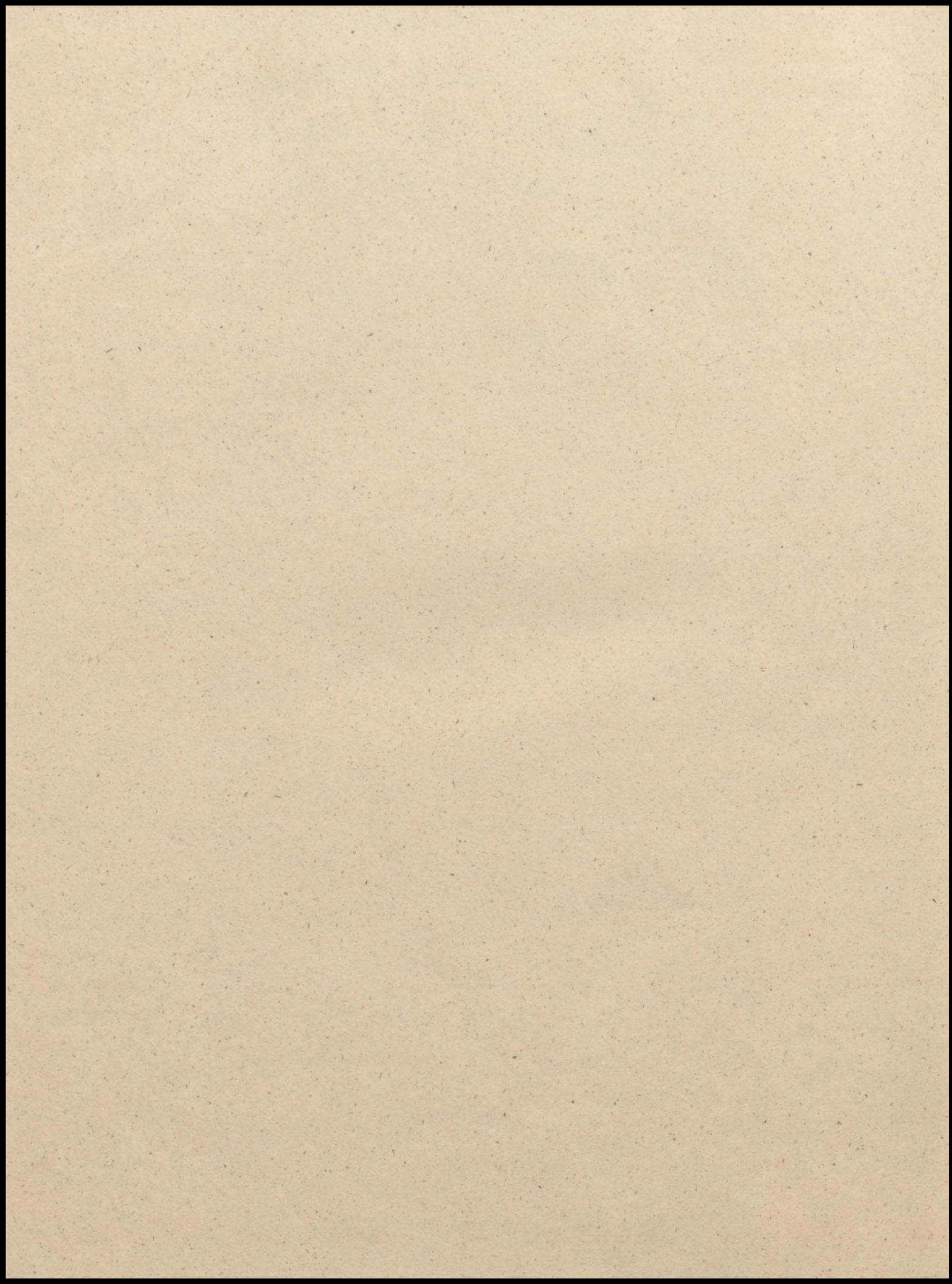
Approximately 1,500 high school students were pictured in this year's Forester. Over 45 ads were sold raising an estimated 3,500 dollars.

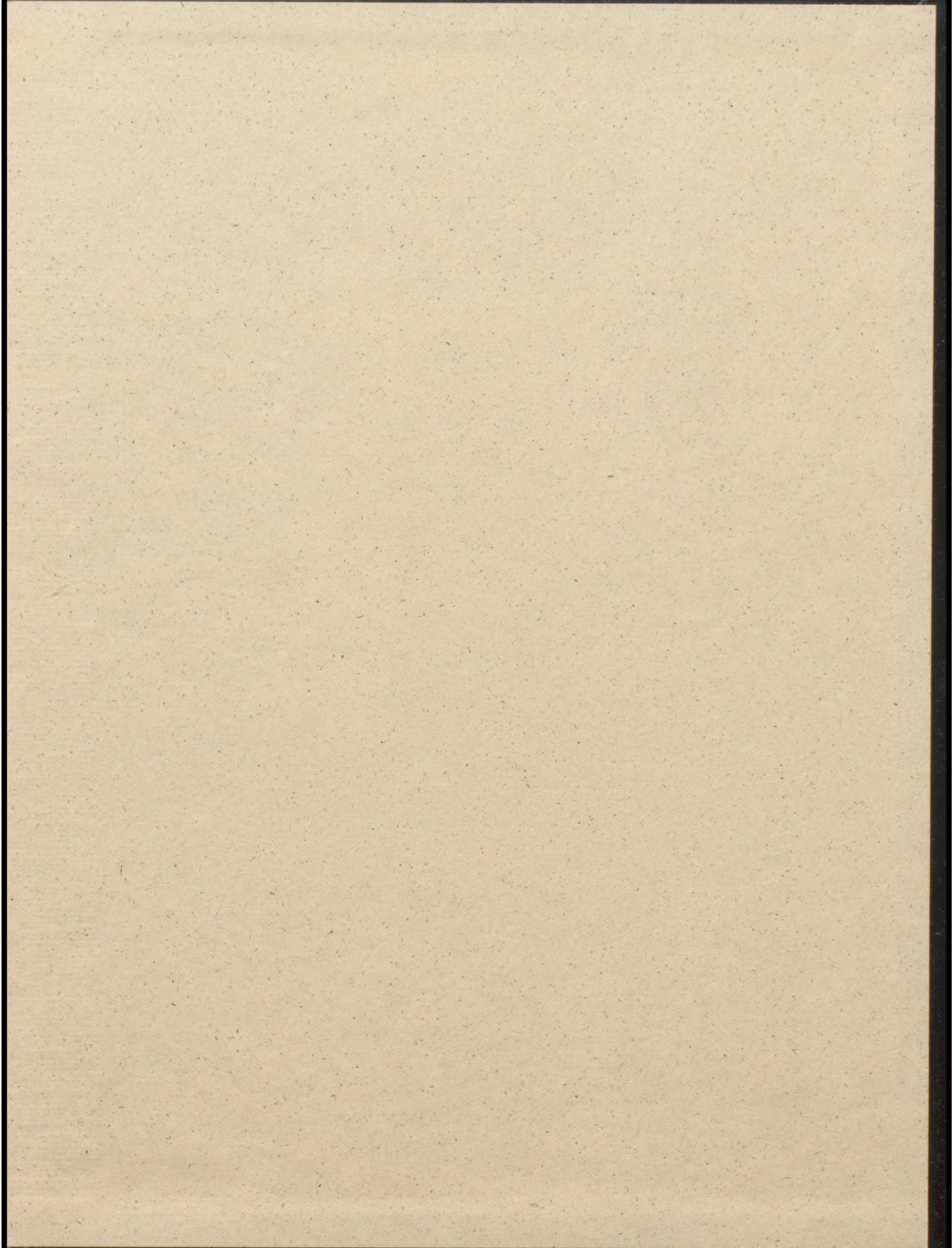
