







Communicating with passion


This year's speech team has started out strong and bold! With new sophomores, and the returning juniors and seniors, they've had a amazing season thus far.



Debate finished stong this year, ending by going to State! They had many accomplishments this year from having three team member going to State, to Garret Swanson getting into


the top 20 in State.



Planning a better future






Working hard for a better place

Masterminds behind the Forester







The Deep







Link Leaders






Painting a better picture





The Special Olympics is all about giving the kids the opportunity to get a the chance to become a team and create new friendships. The students work together to be the best possible person they can be.






The team was outstandingly large this year with seventy-four swimmers and divers. Well divided up, the team consisted of seventh through twelth graders.


The Forest Lake basketball







The Forest Lake Dance team had an overall great year. They made history and achieved many of their team goals and personal goals this year.



- Journalistic in nature, the yearbook informs and entertains its audience in a broad, fair and accurate manner on all subject that affect readers in the areas of academics, community, groups, sports and student life. The entire student body of 1700+ prospective readers constitutes the book's target audience. Secondary audiences include school personnel, community members and scholastic journalism groups.
- Coverage
 Content focuses on coverage which will meet the wants and needs of the majority of these students, so long as those wants and needs are not contradictory to the principles of scholastic journalism. • The staff encourages constructive criticism of any part of the book, both before and after publication. However, final authority for the content of the yearbook rests solely in the hands of the yearbook students under the guidance of their advisors. . No material which is libelous, irresponsible and/or an advocate of illegal activity will be published. No material which the advisors deem in poor taste will be printed. • The content coverage period lasts from the summer before school starts to March, when the yearbook is

completed. Events occurring past this date are impossible to include in the yearbook, and are subsequently covered in the spring supplement. • The subjects for class features are selected by the staff in trying to represent a diverse group of students who have made significant contributions through academics or organizations. • While the yearbook staff strives to include all official school sports and organizations as equitably as possible, the ultimate decision for page allocation is decided by the advisors. • Group photographs for clubs and organizations are taken by official school photographers. All faculty and staff are notified at least two weeks prior to this date. Seniors must submit (or have one submitted) an appropriate traditional photograph from to the yearbook staff no later than the stipulated deadline. Seniors are given the opportunity to have a photograph taken by Picture Place a number of times both at the studio and at the school. Life Touch pictures are used for IDs only . Any student who does not have a photograph taken by the stipulated deadline, may not have a chronological, or other portrait included in the yearbook. It is not the responsibility of the yearbook staff to ensure that seniors get a photograph taken.

· Each student's official grade

classification on the first day

of the school year, or the first day the student enrolls at Forest Lake, will be used to determine portrait placement by grade level. A grade level change after the start of school cannot be reflected in the yearbook portrait pages. • Sensitive Issues • Should a student or school personnel pass away anytime during the current coverage period, the yearbook staff will not allow for special coverage. Family and friends are welcome to purchase an advertisement to honor and remember the life of the person lost, and the advertisement will be included in the designated section of the yearbook as the production schedule allows. • Advertising • All advertising accepted by the staff must meet the same guidelines as editorial content. Acceptance of advertising does not constitute an endorsement by the Forester staff, Forest Lake High School's administration, faculty, staff, or students, or the Forest Lake Area School District. · Senior advertisements,

- ranging in price from \$30 for a twelfth of a page to \$50 for a quarter of a page, are sold from August to December. The Forester staff discourages advertisements which include boyfriends/girlfriends because advertisements cannot be removed or changed after submission. The yearbook staff does not guarantee the safe return of any photos submitted for advertisements.
- Client Satisfaction •

 Because the yearbook is a student production, complete satisfaction is not guaranteed to the purchaser. Refunds will not be given for minor errors such as poor portrait quality, misspelled names, etc. Books returned for refund must be free of damage or writing. The book consists of 192 full color pages printed on 100# Enamel paper stock and a 12 page supplement covering spring activities delivered with the book.


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




