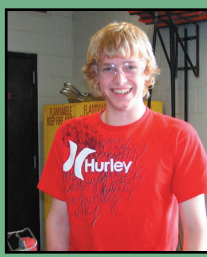

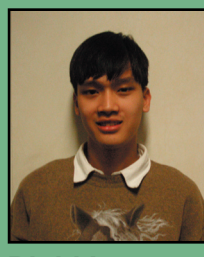

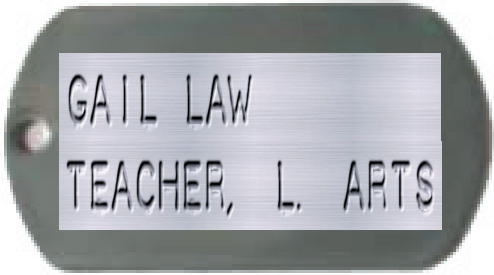

Mrs. Gail Law has been an English teacher here at FLHS for a little over 19 years. One of her most memorable moments here has been fairly recent. Since students have been choosing commencement speakers, Mrs. Law is the first female.

“It is such an honor to be chosen by them for such a milestone in the educational careers,” said Law.

In her time as a teacher at FLHS, her favorite class to teach was Speech.

“Category-wise, it would be watching student’s Persuasive speeches,” she said. “It gives them a reason to take a stand in front of a captive audience. It also gives me insight about them personally, and helps the students get to know each other. It’s also very neat to see students come in as sophomores and mature into young adults. I can see the future in them.”

Being a speech teacher, she hasn’t just taught and graded. She has spoken in front of a large audience.

“At a previous job before teaching, I narrated style shows. While I was a yearbook advisor, I would give speeches at open houses to students

and parents,” Law said. “But there is still pressure! Not only the pressure to speak well, but the nature of the speech. Because of this, though, I’m encouraged to do better. We must remember to express our views and stand behind our thoughts.”

Within her speech, Law plans to share a few personal stories that she feels will connect to the seniors. She remembers some advice she once received from a professor at St. Catherine’s.

“She would tell me, ‘Gail, keep in mind, if students aren’t with you, look for the one who is and teach to that person’,” said Law.

Her experiences as a parent have also helped her with teaching diverse students.

“Being a parent of a handicapped child, I try to look at my students as individuals and treat them how I would like my own son treated; accepted for who he is and what his abilities are. I try to gauge my students’ success individually,” said Law.

Even though Law will no longer be in a FLHS classroom next year, she won’t be idle. Next year Law will be tutoring in the Hudson school district, closer to where she and her husband live.
