ABSENTEEISM REMINDERS

 Parents are expected to notify the school office by 9:05 AM when their child is going to be absent. You may call the office at 717-677-5200 or email Mrs. Trostel at d.trostel@upperadams.org to report an absence. Parents who do not notify the school office will be contacted by our parent notification system to verify that they are aware that their child is not in school. A written note or doctors note must also be provided when your child returns.



• Within 3 days of an absence, a note must be received to verify why your child was not in school. This note may either be submitted to your child's teacher in writing or it may be emailed to Mrs. Trostel directly at d.trostel@upperadams.org. The call-in policy does not **take the place of a note.** You may write a note or use our District's blank absence excuse form which can be found using this link https://www.upperadams.org/Page/1996

If your student needs to leave school early for an appointment, please send in a note with
your student stating the time of departure and the reason for the departure. Please keep in
mind the District policy regarding excused early dismissals which are listed in the Student
& Parent Handbook.

NURSE NEWS

VERY IMPORTANT: Please note due to COVID-19 the nurses will NOT have clothes, shoes, or coats to give out if your child would spill something and need a change of clothes. <u>Please pack them a change of clothing</u> and when it gets colder please send them in appropriate outerwear.

From time to time it may be necessary to send medication to school to be taken during the school day. All medications must be given to our school nurse upon arrival in the building. All prescription medications should be clearly labeled in the original bottle dispensed by the pharmacy. An Administration of Medication Forms must be completed by a doctor before medication may be given. This is for both prescription and non-prescription medication.

Procedure Should Your Child Get Sick in School - In a school setting where people are in close contact and often share supplies, illness can spread. A child who is sick will not be able to perform well in school and is also likely to spread illness to other people. Therefore, please keep your child home when they have any of the following symptoms:

- Fever (temperature of 100 F degrees or higher). If your child has a fever the evening or night before a school day, they should remain home from school. Students must be fever-free for 24 hours WITHOUT the use of any fever reducing medications (Tylenol, Ibuprofen) before returning to school.
- · **Vomiting** If your child has been vomiting the evening or night before a school day, they should stay home from school. A child should go without vomiting for 24 hours and have held down 2 full meals before returning to school.
- · Diarrhea (more than three liquid stools) in the past 24 hours.
- · Persistent Harsh Cough, especially if it has kept the child up through the night.
- **Infections** (such as strep throat, pink eye, impetigo, scabies). A student must be on appropriate prescription medication for 24 hours before returning to school.
- **Head Lice** must be treated, and the school nurse has cleared them to return. Also keep in mind:
 - COVID-19 we follow current CDC guidelines. If your child is diagnosed with covid they
 should quarantine for 5 days (day zero is the day symptoms started or if they did not have
 symptoms the day they tested). They may return to school on day 6 as long as they have
 been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications and their
 symptoms are improving. They must wear a mask for the next 5 days.
 - If your child was exposed to covid they may come to school if they are symptom free, but they must wear a mask for 10 days. If they develop any symptoms (especially sore throat or runny nose) keep them home and have them tested.
 - Please be sure the school has working phone numbers, and you have a plan in place for childcare in case you are unable to come for your child. If you have changes to your

RACE FOR EDUCATION






