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LEA Plan for Use Of Funds

1. The extent to which and how the funds will be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies that are to the greatest extent practicable consistent with the most recent CDC guidance on reopening schools in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning; (412 of 2000 maximum characters used)

The district will be purchasing all the necessary cleaning materials recommending by the CDC and the NJDOH. We will be purchasing electrostatic sprayers, wipes, masks, and other cleaning materials. Classrooms will be cleaned and disinfected daily utilizing electrostatic sprayers. Classrooms will be supplied with disinfecting wipes (EPA approved) for intermittent cleaning by staff of commonly touched areas.

2. How the LEA will use the funds it reserves under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time through the implementation of evidence-based interventions such as summer learning or summer enrichment extended day comprehensive afterschool programs or extended school year; (421 of 2000 maximum characters used)

The district will be utilizing the tutoring services, Sylvan, as part as our comprehensive learning program. Beginning in September, the district will be incorporating an RtI intervention period in our daily schedule for all students. This will assist in building students skills on an individual basis. Also, teachers will be provided professional development on Tier 1 and 2 strategies to enhance student understanding.

3. How the LEA will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with section 2001(e)(2) of the ARP Act; and (203 of 2000 maximum characters used)

The district will continue to update it technology. Our goal is to become a 1:1 school. We will update our servers to further enhance our technology. We will continue to provide professional development.

4. How the LEA will ensure that the interventions it implements, including but not limited to the interventions implemented under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time, will respond to the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students, and particularly those students disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, including students from low-income families, students of color, English learners, children with disabilities, students experiencing homelessness, children in foster care, and migratory students. The district will be utilizing data from our linkit! benchmarks in both math and ILA. Also, we will be using date from our Fountas and Pinnell reading assessments to drive instruction. RtI will be enhanced with three RtI teachers to provide further assistance with learning loss.
