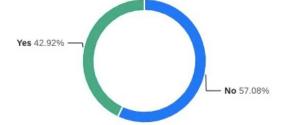

Risks of a Staggered Implementation In the words of our staff...

"When making a big change I think it is best to "rip the band aid off" and get it done. Here are some potential risks I see: 1. Prolonged community division. Once we restructure and parents see that there kids are doing fine and are happy we can truly come together as a community. 2. Working through challenges will be different at every level. A staggered restructure will not help us learn a great deal as we face change in different educational settings. 3. I would think implementing all changes at once will help us figure out bus challenges faster. 4. If we are doing this to address staff shortages, declining enrollment, and inequities for our students, why wait an extra year for some kids to benefit?"

"I do not understand how you can stagger the planned changes. A possible risk is that is could bring division within the district as some schools/teams would be making big changes while others would stay status quo. I think it is really important to build UNITY in our school district. For this plan to be successful, we should ALL change together to build a better district. We can celebrate our changes together."

"With the staggered approach there is time to make changes and modifications. Staff and community can slowly get adjusted and transition to the change. Might be more cost effective."

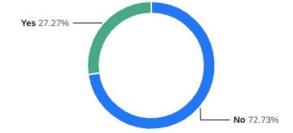
"Gives the community time to adjust."

Why do we want a child care partnership?

- ★ It benefits our employees
- About 2,000 high-quality child care slots are needed in Marathon County
- High-quality early learning leads to more children being "school ready"

Greater success in school and after school!

We can be part of the solution that benefits children, families, and the entire Wausau community!



Proposed Child Care Business Framework

- We'd provide a space in a school building to create a Birth to 5 Year
 Old Early Learning Center
- Wausau School District employees would have access to a guaranteed number of slots
- * Employees would pay all or some of the child care costs
- → Other businesses could also purchase a number of slots
- The child care partner (Woodson YMCA) would hire & manage child care employees



CONTINUED... Proposed Child Care Business Framework

- ★ If this is agreeable, Wausau School District & the Woodson YMCA would develop a business plan
- This agreement would require approval by both the Wausau School Board and the YMCA Board of Directors
